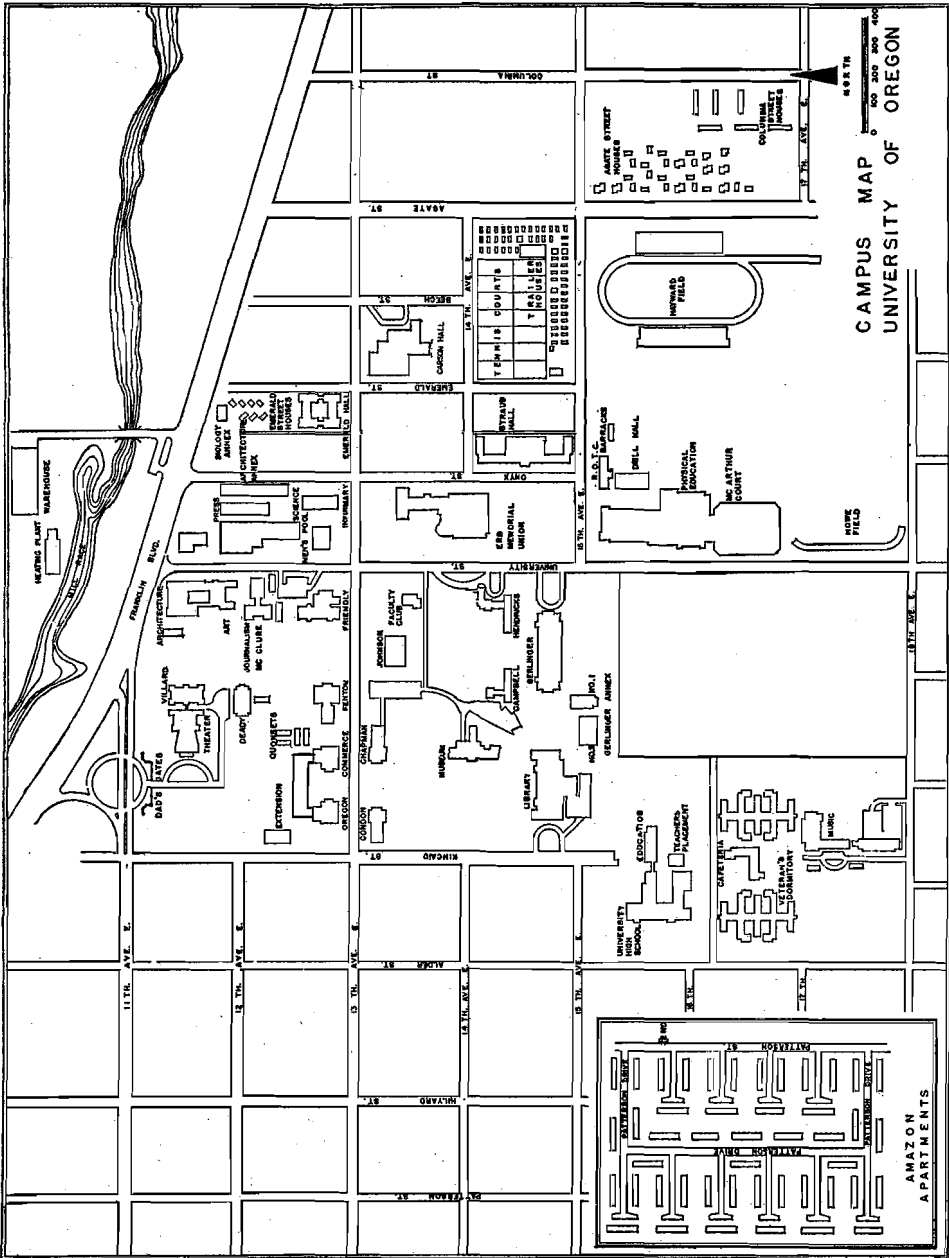

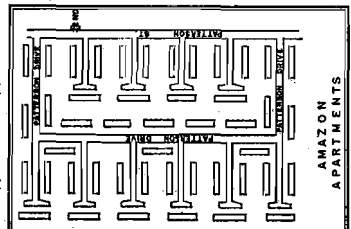

# Registration Instructions

## FALL TERM 1952

1. **Obtain your registration material**, which has been prepared for those expected. New students can get material at the Student Union beginning on Sunday, September 14 between 4:00 and 6:00 p.m. Old students can get material at the Student Union starting on Wednesday, September 17 at 8:00 a.m. All remaining material will be removed to the Registrar's Office in Emerald Hall after the days of regular registration.

- (a) Registration Card and other IBM cards. *All IBM cards must be kept smooth and undamaged, for machine use.* Your **Registration Card** will be filled out after you and your adviser have decided on your study program; after the necessary endorsements it is filed as the official record of your registration. Other cards are to be filled out and turned in as explained below.
- (b) Multiple Directory Cards. This carbon set has been provided to save you time and work. Please fill out carefully, so that the carbon copies will be satisfactory to the offices which must depend upon them.
- (c) Photocopy of your official record sheet. Leave this with your adviser for departmental files.
- (d) Time Schedule of Classes. Use in registration and keep for reference through the year.

**1a. NEW UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS: complete examination appointments.** You should have your report of examination results, and the confirming stamps on the back of your Registration Card, before you confer with your adviser.

2. **Build your study program with your adviser's approval.** Advisers are assigned to freshmen and sophomores by the Chairman of Lower Division Advisers, and all new or old lower-division students must obtain a card from him. Deans and department heads arrange the assignment of advisers for other students. (See index and directory on front cover of this Time Schedule; Liberal Arts majors who have or are close to upper-division standing go directly to departments.) Advisers may be found in their offices during the registration period; note any posted office hours or schedules for appointments. Before you meet with your adviser, study your registration material (supplemented by the Catalog if needed) and try to work out a tentative Student's Year Program (see center pages of this book) which you can suggest for his expert criticism and revision. Then make out the Adviser's Copy of your final program, and leave it as well as your Photocopy with him. Be sure your adviser signs or stamps your Registration Card, certifying his approval of your final program. (Advisers may not be available on Saturday, September 20.)

*Copy exactly from the Time Schedule to your Registration Card* for each course the Dept. abbreviation, Course Number (for fall term), Sections code. This official Registration Card is the source for IBM cards and lists which will produce your permanent official record.

3. **Enroll in courses with departments.** Fill out an Instructor's Card for each course on your approved program, and deliver it to the appropriate department office (see index and directory on front cover of this Time Schedule). As evidence that your Instructor's Card has been accepted for your tentative enrollment, the department must stamp your Registration Card opposite the proper course. (If your approved program should have to be changed before your registration is completed, return to your adviser and the proper department for clear approval of the change on your Registration Card; a department stamp can be cancelled by a second stamp, in the Credits column of your Registration Card).

**3a. VETERANS ON AID: check at Veterans' Desk in Registrar's Office.** Those on P.L. 16 or 346 must clear here between steps 3 and 5, in order to charge any educational costs against the V.A. All others complete their registration the same as non-veterans, and clear here later.

4. **Check with Student Affairs.** Fill out your Student Affairs Card, News Bureau Card, and the multiple set of cards, and deliver them to Student Affairs clerks in the Student Union (or later at the Student Affairs Office in Emerald Hall); these clerks also will check your Grade Report Mailing Card. If you will drive an automobile while in the University, be sure you know the license number in order to register the car here with the ASUO Traffic Court (all cars driven by students while at the University must be registered here and must display the official sticker on the windshield). New students will fill out a Student Affairs personnel folder and will have an identification photograph taken at this time. Get the proper stamp on the back of your Registration Card.

5. **Obtain fee assessment from Registrar.** When your Registration Card has all the indicated endorsements so far (signatures and stamps), submit your Registration, Statistics, Grade Report Mailing, and Fee Cards to Registrar's fee clerks for checking and fee assessment.

**6. Pay fee to Cashier in Emerald Hall.** File your Fee, Registration and Deposit Refund Mailing Cards at the Cashier's window, with the exact amount of money required. (The Cashier's business hours are 8-12 and 1-3 every day except Saturday, when they are 8-12 only.) If your money should be delayed, do not stop registering—consult the Cashier about a loan, otherwise you may be held for a late fee or even be denied completion of your registration. *Partial clearance of the steps of registration does not entitle you to any privileges.*

### CHANGES IN REGISTRATION

Any adding, dropping, changing of course or section, after your Registration Card is filed, must be made official with a Course-Change Card. After this is signed by your adviser, secure the endorsement of each department concerned; leave the appropriate Instructor's Card or Drop Card with the department. Changes of program should be effected by Monday of the third week of the term; penalties and petitions for exception are involved after that time. **No change is effected until the date you file the completed Course-Change Card in the Registrar's Office.**

## NOTES ON COURSE LISTS

Courses are listed in the same order as in the Catalog, which should be consulted for additional information. Any course in the current Catalog (whether or not listed in this Time Schedule) may be offered in case of sufficient demand, and any course may be withdrawn in case there is not sufficient demand. Course titles have been systematically abbreviated to the length which can be recorded on students' permanent record sheets.

Prerequisites for enrolling in courses are stated in footnotes, with these standard exceptions:

*gG*, graduate credit for certain 400 courses;

*i*, instructor's consent;

*N*, no-grade course;

*s*, sequence requiring that course be taken from the beginning.

Class meetings normally begin on the hour and continue for fifty minutes. The symbol \*\* means "to be arranged" by the instructor. If a course includes a quiz or a laboratory section in addition to a classroom section, students must arrange with the department for that assignment also, but it is not needed on the Registration Card.

# ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

(Paraphrased from official sources; see the Catalog for further details.)

## AUTHORITY AND RESPONSIBILITY

**STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY.** Each student is held responsible for knowing and obeying the published rules and regulations of the University. If the University is obliged to make any changes, they will be considered to be effective from the date of their publication. A student is required to be a good citizen of the campus at all times.

**ADMINISTRATION.** The maintenance of students' academic records, together with admission and registration and grades and other related procedures, is the responsibility of the Registrar's Office; petitions for special action are filed in this office and referred to the Academic Requirements or the Scholarship Committee. The administration of students' non-academic interests and the correlation of these with academic situations, and the preparation of petitions to the Scholarship Committee, are responsibilities of the Office of Student Affairs. Academic deans and schools are responsible for advising, instructing, and grading students' academic work. These and other University officials are responsible to the President, who derives his authority from the Board of Higher Education and ultimately from the people of the State of Oregon.

## ADMISSION

**CREDENTIALS AND PROCEDURE.** A student is admitted to the University after he has filed the proper documents to establish his satisfactory academic standing; consideration is given also to health and moral character. The required documents include an official Application for Admission and (for undergraduates) complete records of all school work beyond the eighth grade; they should be filed at least two weeks in advance of the anticipated registration date, and when filed become the permanent property of the University. When these have been examined and found satisfactory, a Notice of Admission and further instructions are sent to the applicant. Entrance is not fully cleared until all required information has been filed and all required entrance examinations and procedures completed; any student's registration may be cancelled if these requirements are not promptly and adequately cleared.

**FRESHMAN STANDING.** Graduation from a standard high school is required for admission as a freshman. If a nonresident of Oregon, the student must have ranked in the upper half of his high-school graduating class, or must be rated equally high by the University on the basis of either his grades or his score on a specified test of college ability.

**ADVANCED UNDERGRADUATE STANDING.** A student who has registered in any college or university or for any work of comparable level must have earned at least a "C" average on all such grades, for admission to the University. If advanced standing amounts to less than 12 hours, the above requirements for freshman standing must be met also. In general, credit may be granted on transfer for all courses taken in accredited higher institutions, evaluated under the academic regulations of the University. Work done in unaccredited institutions can not be approved for undergraduate transfer credit until the student has satisfactorily completed three full terms (about 45 term hours with at least a "C" average) in the University; then he may petition for credit in those University courses which parallel his unaccredited work.

**SPECIAL STUDENT STANDING.** A student who lacks the documents but who can demonstrate by examination the quality indicated above may apply for admission as a special or unclassified student. After the completion of three full terms in the University, a special student who has a satisfactory cumulative record may petition for waiver of entrance deficiencies and for change to regular status, while a special student who has not established a satisfactory record is subject to dismissal from the University.

**GRADUATE STANDING.** Graduation from an accredited college or university is required for admission to regular graduate standing; provisional graduate standing may be allowed temporarily, if evidence of the degree is satisfactory but records are not yet complete. Work represented by unaccredited degrees can not be approved for credit, nor regular graduate standing granted on petition, until the student has completed at least one full term (about 15 term hours) in the University with a good (about a "B" average) record.

**ATTENDANCE WITHOUT ADMISSION.** Formal admission is not at present required for attendance in summer sessions of the University. (Credit may not be earned in regular sessions except after completion of the appropriate admission procedures as described above.)

## REGISTRATION AND CLASSIFICATION

**PROCEDURE.** To register for University work in any term, a student obtains certain prepared documents from the Registrar (having given adequate advance notice of intent to register), then consults a faculty member (appointed by his major dean or other authority) who serves as academic adviser and approves his study program; he is accepted by the respective department concerned for enrollment in each of his chosen courses, is checked by Student Affairs and Registrar's clerks for various purposes, and pays registration fees to the Cashier. Registration is regularly scheduled for New-Student Week preceding the fall term, and (for new students) for the first day of the winter and the spring terms; students currently in school should register in advance for the winter and spring terms. Late registration is not permitted after Monday of the third week of a term, and carries a penalty fee. Detailed dates and instructions are published before each registration period. Each student must register in person, not by proxy or by mail.

**STUDY LOAD.** The normal study load averages 15 or 16 hours per term; the minimum "full load" is considered to be 12 hours. Exceptional loads may be carried with the adviser's consent.

**CHANGE OF STUDY PROGRAM.** Any change from the original term study program filed at registration must be endorsed by the adviser and the instructors concerned, and the proper documents filed with the Registrar, before it becomes effective and a matter of record. *No student may receive credit for any course in which he is not officially registered, nor escape a record for every course in which he is officially registered, as of Monday of the third week of a term.* No course may be added later, unless approved by the instructor and by the department head or dean of the instructional department or school. No course may be cancelled from the record later; if a student is

allowed to terminate his active registration, a withdrawal will be recorded if he is doing passing work, or a failure will be recorded if he is not doing passing work. No change card will be accepted after final examinations have started. Complete withdrawal from the University is recorded, under the same rules, as the concurrent withdrawal from the several courses on the study program; it must be signed by the Director of Student Affairs instead of the adviser.

**CHANGE OF MAJOR.** A student is classified by the Registrar in the major indicated by the student. (Change of adviser is controlled by the major dean.)

**CLASS STANDING.** A regular lower-division student is classified as a freshman until he has earned 36 term hours, then as a sophomore until he has earned 93 term hours. A regular upper-division student is classified as a junior until he has earned 138 term hours, then as a senior until he has completed all requirements for the bachelor's degree. A special student is one temporarily unclassified (see Admission). A graduate student is one who has earned an acceptable bachelor's degree (see Admission).

## GRADES AND HONORS

**GRADING SYSTEM.** The quality of a student's achievement in courses is recorded by A, B, C, or D for passing work, or F for failing work. A mark of W is recorded for clear withdrawal after Monday of the third week of a term (no permanent record is made if withdrawal occurs earlier in the term). A temporary mark of I may be recorded if his work was incomplete in some minor yet essential detail was of passing quality, and the instructor wishes to allow him more time for completion; this additional time may not extend beyond the third subsequent term in which the student registers. In certain "no-grade" courses only marks of P and N are recorded, for passing and not-passing work respectively. Grade points are computed on the basis of 4 points for each hour of A, 3 for each hour of B, 2 for each hour of C, 1 for each hour of D, and 0 for each hour of F grade; marks of W, I, P and N are omitted from grade point computations. The grade point average (GPA) is the quotient of total grade points divided by total graded hours; the cumulative grade point average includes all grades earned.

**SCHOLARSHIP REGULATIONS.** In general, a grade point average below 2.00 is considered unsatisfactory. The Scholarship Committee reviews unsatisfactory records and studies available evidence for the probability of improved scholarship, and then decides in each case whether the student may be allowed to continue subject only to the general requirements of 2.00 GPA, or whether he may continue on a special and higher requirement, or whether he must be disqualified for any subsequent registration in the University. (These minimum scholarship regulations normally do not affect any student who is making satisfactory progress toward meeting graduation requirements.)

**HONOR ROLL.** An undergraduate who earns a term grade point average of at least 3.50, based on not less than 12 graded hours, is placed on the University honor roll for that term.

**SOPHOMORE HONORS.** A freshman who ranks in the upper 20 percent of his entering class (and others by special permission) may elect a program leading toward Sophomore Honors. Through designated or regular courses, or by independent study, he then prepares for four comprehensive examinations in basic liberal-arts fields. These examinations are to be taken before the end of his sophomore year and, if passed with distinction, constitute the earning of Sophomore Honors.

**DEGREES WITH HONORS.** A superior (2.75 GPA) upper-division student may enroll in the special program of independent work leading to the Bachelor of Arts or the Bachelor of Science with Honors. His chosen field may embrace one or more departments, as is suitable to his subject. His studies culminate in a thesis and in an examination on the thesis. If successful, his baccalaureate diploma is designated "with Honors." Honors for graduate degrees are determined by the final examining committee in each case, and these appear on graduate diplomas.

**RECOGNITION FOR SCHOLARSHIP.** The Commencement Program lists with "Recognition for Highest Scholarship" those baccalaureate degree candidates who have a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher, and with "Recognition for High Scholarship" those with a cumulative GPA of 3.50-3.74.

## CERTIFICATES AND DEGREES

**BACHELOR'S DEGREE REQUIREMENTS.** During his lower-division years a student should have completed two types of required courses:

Specific courses (unless excused):

English: 9 term hours in English Composition (Wr 111, 112, 113);  
Health Education; normally 1 term for men (HE 150), 3 terms for women (HE 114, 115, 116);  
Physical Education: 5 terms in activity courses (normally PE 190 for men, PE 180 for women);  
Military Science: 6 terms for men (Mil 111, 112, 113 or Mil 114, 115, 116; and Mil 211, 212, 213, or Mil 214, 215, 216, or Mil 221, 222, 223).

(Veterans will be exempted from the last three requirements above and may be allowed academic credit in these fields, on filing with the Registrar's Office official documentary evidence of their military rank and service. Six term hours is allowed "in health and physical education." The credit "for military service" is related to rank and to an assumed parallel with Military Department courses, possible credit ranging from 6 term hours for basic to 24 hour term hours for a commission; therefore the possibility of duplication must be considered in each case.)

Also a student must satisfy the following minimum general requirements for the usual four-year bachelor's degree (a five year degree requires five years; see Catalog):

Credits: 186 term hours total, including:

- 62 hours in upper-division courses;
- 36 hours, 24 of them upper-division, in his major (many schools and departments require more);
- 150 hours in graded (not in "no-grade") courses;
- not more than 48 hours in a strictly professional field (such as Dentistry, Law, or Medicine);
- not more than 12 or 24 hours (respectively for non-music majors, and for music majors earning the B.A. or B.S. degree) in applied music courses;
- not more than 60 hours earned in correspondence study;
- 36 hours in language and literature courses for the B.A. degree including competence in a foreign language equivalent to 2 years of college work in the language, this demonstrated by passing the second-year or higher course or by examination if acceptable to the language department.
- 36 hours in social science or 36 hours in science courses for the B.S. degree.

GPA: 2.00.

Residence: 45 of the last 60 hours in residence with the University (at present 33 hours from General Extension Division classes may be counted toward this requirement).

Dean's recommendation; certification that the student has satisfied all special requirements in his major. Each student is responsible to his major dean or department head for all major requirements.

**ADVANCED DEGREE REQUIREMENTS.** In general (see Catalog for detailed differences) a master's degree requires 45 hours of graduate credit (not more than 15 hours of which may be transferred from other schools), and the academic doctor's degree requires two additional years of study. A student's entire graduate program should be completed within a span of seven years, and his graduate record must average at least "B" grade in quality. A graduate student is not advanced to candidacy for an advanced degree until he has successfully taken a qualifying examination, usually within the first term or before he has earned 15 hours as a graduate student. His concluding requirement is the passing of the final examination, usually based on his thesis.

**APPLICATION FOR DEGREE.** A student intending to complete requirements for any degree should file an Application for a Degree with the Registrar several months in advance of the expected commencement date. No student may be granted a degree unless all academic and financial requirements have been satisfied. Degrees are awarded only in June, but a student who has completed all requirements for a degree may be given a certification of that fact at any time to temporarily substitute for the diploma.

**TRANSCRIPTS.** An official photocopy of a student's academic record earned or credited in the University will be issued on payment of the transcript fee. Photocopies of other documents filed with the Registrar can be furnished also, on payment of a nominal charge for the service.
