A notice of intent to appeal must be served upon the local government and others who received written notice of the final decision from the local government. The notice of intent to appeal must be served and filed in the form and manner prescribed by LUBA, (OAR chapter 661, division 10).

# STAFF REPORT

Applicant: Klamath County (via Planning Dept.)

Application: Consideration of adoption of the Klamath Falls Urban Trail Master Plan as

an addendum to the Urban Area Transportation Plan.

# **BACKGROUND**

The Klamath Falls Urban Trails Master Plan was funded by a Transportation and Growth Management (TGM) Grant through the City of Klamath Falls to plan for improvements to the existing trails system throughout the Klamath Falls Urban Growth Boundary. The consultant on the project is Kittleson and Associates, Inc. with offices in Bend.

# **PROCESS**

This code amendment is a legislative action since it does not involve specific properties.

#### APPLICABLE CRITERIA

The applicable criteria is contained in Article 49 – Legislative Amendment to the Klamath County Comprehensive Plan, Land Development Code or Zoning Map.

# FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The applicable criteria are listed below with findings addressing each.

# Land Development Code Article 49.030 Review Criteria

- A. An amendment to the Comprehensive Plan or Land Development Code may only be approved if it meets all applicable review criteria.
- B. An amendment to the Comprehensive Plan or Land Development Code shall be reviewed against the following criteria:
  - 1. The proposed amendment is supported by specific studies or other factual information, which documents the public need for the change;

#### Finding

The proposed amendment is a specific planning document which indicates a public need, and where, to make improvements to the existing trails system within the Klamath Falls Urban Growth Boundary.

An important aspect of preparing the plan is to facilitate additional grants to make the necessary improvements. Grant proposals frequently ask if the proposed improvements are contained in a planning document.

The proposed amendment is found to meet this criterion.

2. The proposed amendment complies with policies of the Comprehensive Plan and policies and standards of the Urban Area Transportation System Plan;

The proposed revisions are consistent with the following Goals and Policies of the Klamath County Comprehensive Plan:

#### Goal 1: Citizen Involvement

The general public was invited to participate in this process through advertisements in the newspaper of record and specific outreach to local community groups. A public website (www.klamathfallstrailplan.com) was published and made available throughout the duration of the project. The website included general information about the project, all project documents (draft and final), upcoming meeting and hearing information, meeting notes, and other relevant information about the project. Two online "virtual" open houses and one in-person open house were held throughout the development of the project. Citizens were able to learn more about the project and provide specific feedback on areas to be addressed by the plan and on the draft plan at these open houses. A citizen advisory committee that included private citizens of the City of Klamath Falls met regularly throughout the course of the project and provided feedback and guidance. All standard requirements for public for the legislative action have been followed.

#### Goal 2: Land Use Planning

This goal requires that a land-use planning process and policy framework be established as a basis for all divisions and actions related to use of land. All local governments and state agencies involved in the land-use action must coordinate with each other. Cities, counties, state and federal agencies and special districts plans and actions related to land use must be consistent with the comprehensive plans of cities and counties in regional plans adopted under Oregon Revised Statutes Chapter 268.

# <u>Finding</u>

The Oregon Department of Transportation and Department of Land Conservation and Development were members of the project advisory committee and were sent notices of the proposed amendment.

# Goal 8: Recreation Needs

POLICY 5: The County shall encourage the development of bike paths.

POLICY 6: The County shall encourage the protection of recreation trails.

#### Finding

Adoption of the Urban Trail Master Plan will implement these two policies.

# GOAL 12: Transportation

Goal 12 requires cities, counties, Metropolitan planning organizations, and Oregon Department of Transportation to provide and encourage a "safe convenient and economic transportation system." This is accomplished through the transportation system plans based on inventories of local, regional and state transportation needs.

POLICY 7: The County shall encourage local governments to improve convenience and safety of pedestrian and bicycle transportation.

## Finding:

The proposed amendment to the Urban Area Transportation System Plan is intended to facilitate the development of an interconnected active transportation system. When built out, this will improve the convenience and comfort of walking and bicycling in the urban area, providing economical transportation options to, and better connecting, residents and visitors to the City.

The proposed amendment is found to meet the applicable goals and policies of the Comprehensive Plan listed above as well as being consistent with the Urban Area Transportation System Plan.

# All Other Goals and Policies of the Klamath County Comprehensive Plan

# Finding

It has been determined that Goals 3-7, 9-11 and 13-14 are not applicable to the proposed amendment.

3. The proposed amendment complies with the Oregon Statewide Planning Goals, state statutes and administrative rules, including compliance with the TPR (OAR 660-012-0060). To document compliance with the TPR the applicant shall submit a Traffic Impact Study pursuant to Section 71.200.

# Statewide Planning Goals

#### Finding

The application is found to be consistent with Goals 1, 2, 8 and 12 of the Statewide Planning Goals for the same reasons stated above in review of the Comprehensive Plan Goals and Policies. Goals 3-7, 9-11 and 13-14 have been determined to be inapplicable.

# State Statutes

#### Finding

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) does not contain any language which prohibits the County from adopting an Urban Trail Master Plan. The proposed amendment language is consistent with the current requirements of ORS.

# Oregon Administrative Rules

#### Transportation Planning Rule (OAR 660-012)

Transportation Planning Rule (OAR 660-012) encourages all modes of travel including bicycling and pedestrian facilities.

# Finding

The proposed Urban Trail Master Plan is found to be consistent with the Transportation Planning Rule.

# CONCLUSION

Adoption of the Klamath Falls Urban Trail Master Plan has been found to be consistent with the review criteria for a legislative amendment to the Urban Area Transportation System Plan. The application can, therefore, be approved.

# RECOMMENDED ACTION

Staff recommends that the Planning Commission adopt the proposed Findings contained in the Staff Report that demonstrate compliance with Klamath County requirements and the State of Oregon, and forward a <u>recommendation of approval</u> to the Klamath County Board of Commissioners.
