University Convocation is a formal welcome to the university for new students and faculty. It's the culminating event of the Week of Welcome, setting the tone for the new academic year, and highlighting the appeal of intellectual activity. Collins will deliver the address at 3:30 p.m. Sept. 24 at McArthur Court, 1611 University St., Eugene.

Doors open at 3 p.m. Seating is free and open to the public, on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Now the poet laureate of New York, Collins has published eight collections of poetry. His book "Sailing Alone Around the Room" is recommended summer reading for incoming first-year students. It's available in the University Bookstore, 895 E. 13<sup>th</sup> Ave. and online.

"He's really someone who can introduce students to the delight of the life of the mind," said Karen Sprague, vice provost of undergraduate studies.

Collins encourages readers to immerse themselves in literature. In his poem "Introduction to Literature," Collins asks readers to "drop a mouse into a poem and watch him probe his way out,/ or walk inside the poem's room/ and feel the walls for a light switch./ I want them to waterski/ across the surface of a poem/ waving at the author's name on the shore."

Music will be an important part of the event. As a prelude, the <u>School of Music</u> will present "The Overture: Keep Live Music in Your Life" on the lawn of Collier House from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m. The Green and Yellow Garter Bands will perform outside before and after the ceremonies. Inside McArthur Court, music will be provided by the Oregon Brass Quintet.

This is the first year that the university will recognize a high school teacher as part of convocation activities. Incoming students were invited to nominate teachers who inspired them through the study of writing or literature. The winning teacher will be invited to Eugene for the event. Both teacher and nominating student will join the luncheon group with Billy Collins.

Convocation traditions go back several centuries and vary from university to university. In the 16<sup>th</sup> century, Oxford University used the term to describe an assembly of master's graduates, welcoming them to the order of scholars. At the University of Oregon, the event marks the start of the academic year and welcomes

students to the scholarly world of the university. Past University Convocation speakers include journalist Daniel Schorr, former Oregon Gov. John Kitzhaber, author James McBride, and physicist Jim Gates.

A picnic after the event is open to the university community. The University Bookstore will host a book signing with Billy Collins at the picnic.

The ranking is the result of a campus-wide effort to create an atmosphere of acceptance, said Chicora Martin, director of the university's LGBT education and support services program.

"Our campus leaders have worked tirelessly to create a positive environment for all of our students," Martin said. "This distinction emphasizes the importance of providing necessary support to meet all students' needs, including LGBT students."

The guide is published by Alyson Books in partnership with The Advocate magazine. Windmeyer, along with a collection of experts, conducted more than 5,500 online interviews. From their data, 100 campuses were selected for profiles based on policies, institutional commitment and support, academic life, housing, student life, counseling and health efforts, campus safety, and recruitment and retention efforts.



<u>University of Oregon ranked</u> <u>among nation's best for LGBT</u> students

Paul Slovic, a University of Oregon psychology professor, recently earned top honors for a paper examining why people don't do more to prevent mass murder and genocide.

Slovic's paper, "If I look at the mass I will never act: Psychic numbing and genocide," garnered the Otto Klineberg Intercultural and International Relations Award for 2006 from The Society for the Psychological Study of Social Issues. The award is given annually to the top paper or article dealing with intercultural or international relations.

"Why, over the past century, have good people repeatedly ignored mass murder and genocide?" Slovic asks in his paper.

"The repetitiveness of such atrocities, ignored by powerful people and nations, and the general public, calls for explanations that may reflect some fundamental deficiency in our humanity – a deficiency that, once identified, might possibly be overcome," he asserts.

Slovic has been at the university since 1986. He also is founder and president of Decision Research, a nonprofit organization which strives to help individuals and those in business, government, and society understand and successfully deal with the complex and sometimes risky decisions of every day life. Slovic has worked with colleagues around the world in the development of methods to describe risk perceptions and measure their impacts on individuals, industry, and society.

Program has awarded an unrestricted gift in the amount of \$78,000 to Reza Rejaie, a professor in the University of Oregon's department of computer and information science.

This gift will support Rejaie's research on "Characterizing and Modeling the Dynamics of Peer-to-Peer Networks", as part of his ION P2P project.

In recent years, the pervasive deployment of peer-to-peer (P2P) applications (such as Gnutella and BitTorrent) has had a profound effect on the Internet that is even more tangible than the impact of the Web. The goal of Rejaie's work is the development of measurement techniques for collecting unbiased samples from popular P2P applications, to provide a better understanding of their behavior and impact. Once the sampling techniques have been developed and verified, the next phase of the project is to carefully study peer behavior and to develop models of how users arrive and depart. These models are essential for properly understanding and simulating P2P systems to improve their performance.

Part of the Cisco grant will be used to support senior Daniel Stutzbach, a doctoral student in the department of computer and information science.
