Reach Out and Interview Someone

The UO Libraries iss proud to announce that its Media Services unit is now equipped with audio ISDN capabilities. An ISDN (Integrated Services Digital Network) allows users to conduct interviews at a distance by transmitting full studio -quality audio data over copper telephone wires. The ISDN capabilities are available in two locations in the Knight Library: Studio A and the Television Production Studio.

With the new ISDN equipment interviews and programs are not only easier to produce, they can also be shared with distant broadcast outlets. The interview process is more convenient for interviewees as well, since they no longer need to travel to a studio for audio recording. Although the interview is conducted over the telephone, it will sound as though it were conducted in a studio.

UO Law School Professor Garrett Epps will be one of the first to try this new interview technology, in an interview this Tuesday, May 22nd, by WBUR in Boston for the nationally distributed program "Hear and Now." "We'll be using our new ISDN codec, which will make it sound just like Epps is in the studio in Boston," says Michael Madjic, associate professor and producer-director of Media Services.

Beginning at 7:30 a.m. on Tuesday, June 5, and running until 7 p.m. on Friday, June 15, Knight Library will be open continuously. All branch libraries will maintain their usual academic term hours throughout Dead Week and Finals Week.

IMPORTANT: Knight Library will be open only to current UO students, faculty, and staff during extended hours. All users will be required to show a current university ID to remain in or enter the building. Extended hours during Dead

Week and Finals Week for spring 2007 are midnight to 7:30 a.m. Monday through Friday, 7 p.m. Friday to 11 a.m. Saturday, and 7 p.m. Saturday to 11 a.m. Sunday.

During these extended hours, access to photocopy machines and Information Technology Center (ITC) computers and printers will be available. However, other services, such as checkout of library materials, reserves and video checkout, or reference desk assistance, will not be available.
