



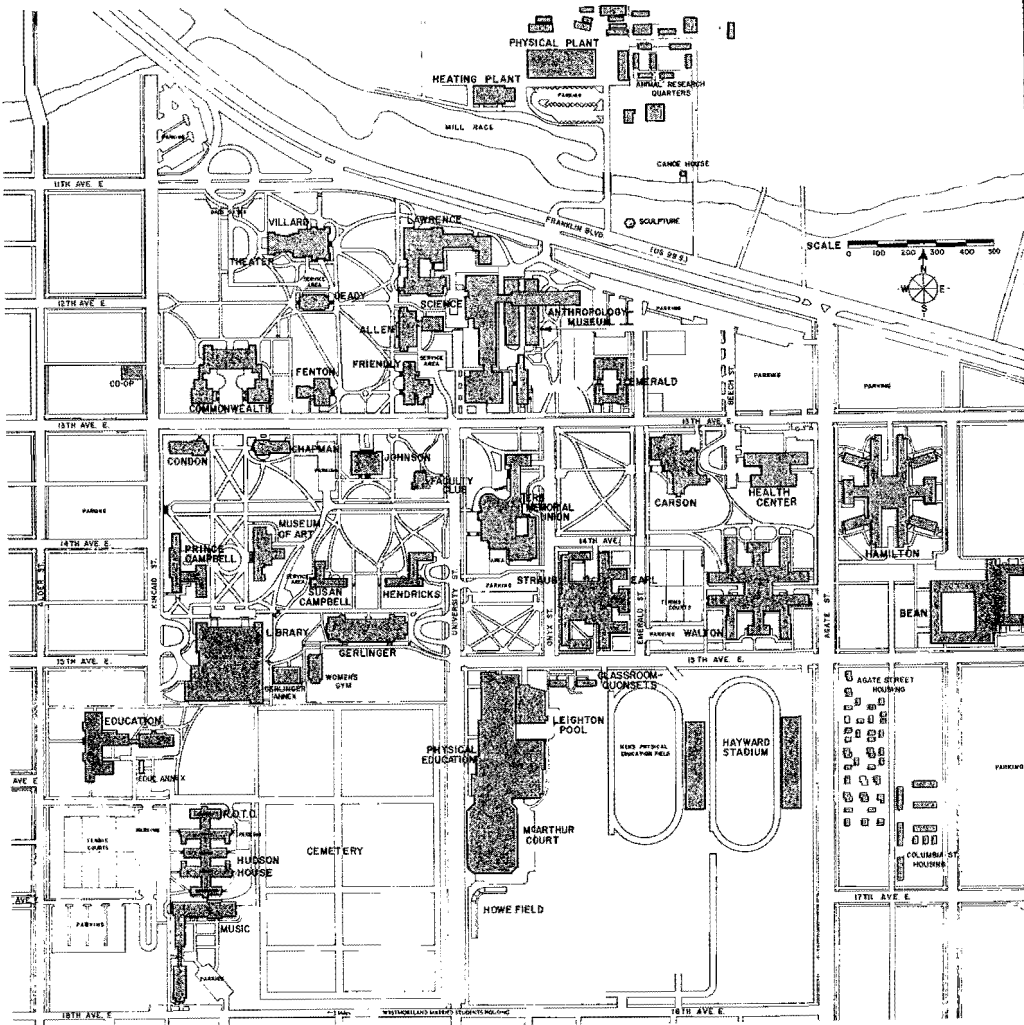

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE, FALL TERM 1967

1. *Obtain your registration materials*: new students beginning at 09 a.m. Monday, old students scheduled one day later, in Student Union basement (this shifts to Emerald Hall after Friday of Registration Week). Do not write on the official forms before you have made your decisions. Keep all forms until they are required from you during succeeding steps.

Old students will notice several changes toward simplification:

- (a) some special-purpose cards have been eliminated;
- (b) to provide equivalent personnel data through machine processing, optical-scanner sheets are included for printout, correction and completion, and checking (additional sheets if needed can be secured in the basement);
- (c) blank Instructors Cards have been replaced by Class & Grade Cards, already interpreted with your name and data, which you check and file with the Registrar's clerks as the basis for official class rosters direct to departments (save extras for any later addition of courses this term);
- (d) photocopies of record sheets are provided only for those with college work;
- (e) coding information is explained completely, in the *Time Schedule*;
- (f) new choices are introduced to you with experimental courses, and the expanded no-grade or pass/not-pass option.

2. *Obtain your Check List form signed by your adviser*. If you had early advising in spring or summer, this should be with your registration materials and you are not required to see your adviser at this time. If you need to see an adviser now, refer to the list and instructions in the *Time Schedule*. (The required Check List proves you have been advised, but does not bind you to follow the advice received.)

3. *Enroll in courses with departments*: at the locations shown in the Directory, beginning Thursday morning. To reduce congestion, for certain courses you may enroll by "priority hours" related to your name. Obtain a department stamp for each course and section listed (including +DIS and +LAB), on your Registration Card. *Do not leave* any of your cards with departments; you may be asked to sign temporary course lists.

(a) The Term Line No. (TLN) is the determining index to your enrollment and must be correct. It must be consistent on your Class & Grade Cards and your Registration Card, and with the *Time Schedule*.

(b) You are enrolling for credit unless you write "Aud" (for audit) beside the credits on your Registration Card.

(c) You are enrolling to be graded (except for totally no-grade courses) unless you check the "No-grade" option on the Class & Grade Card; you must be sure this is acceptable to the department.

(d) You are enrolled in every course with a department stamp in the last column of your Registration Card, when you file that card. To cancel an enrollment before filing this card, obtain a cancelling department stamp across the "Credits" column—you cannot cancel by simply crossing out.

(e) You will be listed on the initial official rosters only if you pay your fees before classes begin.

4. *Check with Student Affairs*: in the Student Union from 10 a.m. Thursday to Saturday noon of Registration Week, and from Monday through Friday of the first week of classes (then shifts to Emerald Hall). Within the Union, the required completion of new students' pictures and personnel folders is in room 101, the required checking of completed optical-scanner sheets and other documents is on the second floor.

5. *Check with and obtain fee assessment from Registrar*: following the preceding step, same times and places. The checker will read aloud the TLN and mark each of your Class & Grade Cards for machine processing, while you double-check on your Registration Card; you will expedite this by arranging your Class & Grade Cards in the same order as the courses are listed on your Registration Card.

6. *Pay fees to Cashier*: following the preceding step, same times (except to 4 p.m. only) and places.

You are responsible for completing all TLN-identified courses in which you have enrolled. Changes after registration can be made only through the Registrar's Office, and if you conform to the announced deadlines and procedures.

No student who has failed to pay fees when due is entitled to attend classes.

CODES

Across the top of your Registration Card, groups of digits are "interpreted" to depict various coded facts about you and your UO record. You will need to refer to the class and major codes during registration, and you may be interested in deciphering the other items shown. In most cases these number groups and their significance (starting from the left) are as follows:

8 digits—UO Student No.: the first four digits are an "alphanumeric" equivalent to locating your name alphabetically in a number series from 1000 to 9999; the next two digits shows the calendar year (last two digits of the year) of your first UO registration, the seventh digit the term of that first registration (1=winter, 2=spring, 3=summer, 5 or 6=fall); the last digit is just a serial number to distinguish you from every other person with the same preceding seven digits.

1 digit—Sex (1=man, 2=woman).

2 digits—Year of Birth (the last two digits of the year in which you were born).

4 digits—Last School Attended: code to identify the school or type and location of the high school (first digit 1-4=Oregon, 5=other state, 6=other country), or college (first digit 7=Oregon, 8=other state, 9=other country), or non-school source (0) from which you entered UO.

1 digit—Prep Stanine: relative standing based on high-school grades (1=lowest ninth, 5=average, 9=top ninth).

1 digit—Test Stanine: relative standing based on entrance college-ability test (1=lowest ninth, 5=average, 9=top ninth).

2 digits—Previous Attendance; Residence Classification: the first digit shows your attendance at UO (0=none, 1=old returning, 8=old continuing within same academic year); the second digit shows your technical classification as a resident of Oregon (0), nonresident liable for the appropriate nonresident fee (9), or nonresident exempted from the nonresident fee (5).

1 digit, letter, or character—Class This Term: your academic classification (which may lag one term in updating, winter and spring terms) as special (+ or &), freshman (1), sophomore (2), junior (3), senior (4), graduate as doubly defined below:

- graduate student with a bachelor's degree but not now seeking a graduate degree (5),
- graduate student with a master's degree but not now seeking a graduate degree (6),
- graduate student with a doctor's degree but not now seeking a graduate degree (7);
- Graduate School student with a bachelor's degree and accepted by a major department (V),
- Graduate School student with a master's degree and accepted by a major department (W),
- Graduate School student with a doctor's degree and accepted by a major department (X);
- Graduate School student with a bachelor's degree and cleared as a master's candidate (N),
- Graduate School student with a master's degree and cleared as a master's candidate (O),
- Graduate School student with a doctor's degree and cleared as a master's candidate (P);
- Graduate School student with a bachelor's degree and cleared as a doctor's candidate (E),
- Graduate School student with a master's degree and cleared as a doctor's candidate (F),
- Graduate School student with a doctor's degree and cleared as a doctor's candidate (G).

3 digits—Class Last Term; Major Last Term: the first digit shows your class the preceding term (if at UO), in the code above; the last two digits show your major the preceding term (if at UO). Each listed major is appropriate and acceptable for defined class levels only, as follows (LD=lower division, class + or & or 1 or 2; UD=upper division, class 3 or 4; G=graduate, class 5 or 6 or 7 or letter listed above indicating Graduate School).

NOTES ON COURSE LISTS

Priority Hours for course enrollment show the earliest time when each department will accept certain enrollments from students with surnames in specified segments of the alphabet. Under this scheme about ten percent of total spaces in affected courses are reserved for each of the nine alphabetic segments.

Term Line No. (TLN) is the code number for each course and section listed for this term. As the basic designation for machine processing, it must be copied correctly from the term's *Time Schedule*.

Subsequent terms course listings are probable but not firm, subject to change in the *Time Schedule* printed for that term.

Hour of class meetings normally indicates the beginning time. Morning hours are listed as 08 and 09, evening hours as 8 and 9. Fractional hours are indicated by /. Thus, listing and meeting times are related as follows:

- listing 08, meeting 08:00-8:50 a.m.;
- listing 11-1, meeting 11:00-12:50 noon;
- listing 8/10, meeting 8:00-9:30 p.m. or 8:30-9:50 p.m.

EXPERIMENTAL COURSE LISTING

Last year, the ASUO established an agency with the seemingly clever acronymic name "SEARCH." But, the emergence of the name was less a conscious contrivance than a fortuitous coincidence. The acronym, in fact, described vividly what it stood for: Students' Exploratory Actions Regarding Curricular Heterodoxy. Recent events on this campus and other campuses around the country featured students undertaking projects directed specifically at bringing about some form of change, or at least raising some questions, concerning the existing formal curriculum system. Underlying these student undertakings were some common themes: they were *student* movements; they were unquestionably *exploratory actions*; and they were done in a spirit of *heterodoxy*, that is, a questioning attitude of an existing institution. Finally, the students who were involved were, indeed, in *search* of something. What this "something" is, somehow eludes a precise definition; although "relevance" and "involvement" appear to be the more widely used terms.

Here in the University, the students who provided the impetus for the establishment of SEARCH at the very beginning committed themselves to the principle that all their efforts should be done within the framework of the University and with the full cooperation and assistance of the faculty. They knew of the experiences at other institutions where similar movements were pursued in a vacuum created by the students themselves and which bore uneven and uncertain results. Thus—the almost inordinate insistence of the students here to utilize existing course numbers (the 405 and 407), credit and grading procedures, and the all-important faculty and departmental sanction. The resulting situation—that of coupling student fervor with the inherent stability of the deeply-rooted established system—inevitably generated much difficulty and frustration. Only two student-initiated courses were actually offered during the winter term out of a long list of proposed courses. The spring term saw only one. Perhaps this insignificant development was brought about by the students themselves through their rash actions; on the other hand, perhaps it was because the faculty members approached were not prepared to move as fast as the students were moving. Undoubtedly, there were other considerations of far more fundamental nature that stymied SEARCH because they were overlooked.

However, the students in SEARCH persisted. They sought out faculty and staff members who sympathized with their cause. Meetings and consultations were held. Surveys were conducted. Again—these actions were *exploratory*; therefore, limited in scope, possibly, even selective. The results of the continued efforts then were similarly limited. A few more courses are now being offered.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES:

All students intending to register for any of the courses listed under the Experimental Section should secure a Preliminary Registration Form from the ASUO Department of Curriculum office at the Union Building. This form will then be taken by the student to the appropriate department for actual registration in the course selected. After the first scheduled meeting of the course and no later than the second scheduled meeting of the course, all registration for such courses should be completed and final. The regular University requirements should also be met for registering in classes. The courses will have a letter after them explaining their nature. The letters are: (A) Experimental in content and structure; (B) student initiated; and (C) inter-disciplinary. Any additional information can be obtained from the ASUO at extension 1836 or from the department which is offering the course.

Anthropology 405 To be arranged McFee

Seminar in Cross-cultural Value Systems (A, B)

A student initiated seminar to examine cross-cultural values and their pertinence to value conflicts in modern society.

Speech 407 3 hours Robinson

The Underground Motion Picture (A) 10 UH—105 Condon

A study of the social and artistic properties of the underground film. The class will be conducted as a lecture, discussion group related to a series of film showings. Registration will be limited to those who have a demonstrated interest in this form. Limitation to 50 students.

F. B. E. 407 3 hours Lindholm

Value Added Taxation first meeting: 12 M—261 Comm.

Description and analysis of the Value Added Taxation which is becoming the major tax of the Common Market countries. How this affects the United States and particularly its balance of payments will be considered.

Ac 221 (H) 3 hours Thomas

Fundamentals of Financial Accounting 9 MWF—336 Comm.

The underlying concepts and logic structure of financial accounting. Preparation and analysis of the major accounting reports to investors. Text written by Thomas will have a new approach to text method of learning. Open to honors students. Open to other students by consent of the instructor.

Not only are there a few more student-initiated courses; there are some courses that are *faculty*-initiated and included in the listing of SEARCH courses. This development is most encouraging to the students since it means that their efforts can not be in vain. They are fully aware that there are faculty members who have been engaged in curricular experimentation for some time now—that “experimental courses” are not really new. However, what may be new is the direct involvement of students in the process and, as the case is here in the University, the joining of efforts among students, faculty and administration in common pursuit of mutual goals.

Those who have started SEARCH are firmly convinced of the potential contribution it can bring about for the University. It is hoped that more adherents will be found among the members of the University community to help its further development.

This summer the ASUO has been working with students, professors, and administrators on the concept of establishing a Center for Experimental Education. A separate center was suggested because it seems that it would ease the burden of offering these classes within the departments, as well as serving as an organizational structure for systematic attempts at experimental courses by students and professors.

A center would perform the indispensable requirement of keeping records of the courses and maintaining an evaluation procedure. It would provide greater opportunities for multi-disciplinary approaches to courses of study at the under-graduate level. It would provide faculty members greater flexibility in designing and offering new courses which may at present prove to be impractical under existing departmental procedures. The center would provide a means for individuals outside the University community to come in and either teach or attend the courses.

The eventual fulfillment and development of such a center can only happen if students, faculty, and administration members will give it support—either through participation in the few courses now being offered or actually helping in the establishment of more courses. Academic Regulations

GENERAL PROCEDURES

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY. Each student is considered responsible for knowing and following the published rules and regulations of the University. If the University is obliged to make any changes, they will be considered effective from the date of publication.

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES. Students are formally admitted to the University through the Office of Admissions. The maintenance of students' academic records is the responsibility of the Registrar's Office; petitions for special action are filed in this office and referred to the Academic Requirements or the Scholastic Deficiency Committee. The administration of students' non-academic interests and the correlation of these with academic situations, and assistance in preparing petitions to the Scholastic Deficiency Committee, are responsibilities of the Office of Student Affairs. The Office of Academic Advising and the academic deans and department heads are involved in advising, instructing, and grading students' academic work.

REGISTRATION AND CHANGES

PROCEDURE. To register for University work for credit, a student obtains certain prepared documents from the Registrar (having filed adequate advance notice of intent to register, required for regular but not for summer sessions). He then consults a faculty member who serves as academic adviser for planning his study program. He is accepted by the respective departments concerned, for enrollment in his chosen courses. He is checked by Student Affairs and Registrar's clerks for various purposes, and pays registration fees to the Cashier. Registration regularly is scheduled for days shortly before classes begin each term. *Late registration carries a penalty fee, and is cut off by the published deadline.*

MATERIALS. Among each student's registration materials are the Time Schedule of Classes and the photocopy of his record (once each year) which are primarily for his information and use; then the latter should be filed with his adviser. The University's official record of registration includes the Registration Card filed in the Registrar's Office and the Fee Card filed in the Business Office. Other cards are included for University offices and for related services. The student's record of registration includes his fee receipt and his validated Student Body Card; he should also keep a copy of his study program.

STUDY LOAD. The normal undergraduate study load averages 15 or 16 credit hours per term. The "full-time" load is academically defined as a minimum of 12 term hours for undergraduates, and 9 for graduates (less for graduate assistants) (this differs from the definition used in the fee schedule).

CHANGE OF PROGRAM. Any change from the original term study program filed at registration *must be properly completed and filed with the Registrar, before it becomes effective and part of the official records.* On payment of the change fee and approval of the instructional department or school, courses may be added or dropped by any student through Friday of the third week of any term; first-term new students may drop courses through the fifth week. No change for a summer-session short course may be made after the course has ended. Complete withdrawal from the University may be allowed through the Dean of Men or Dean of Women, after the deadline, for good cause.

CHANGE OF MAJOR. A student (except in the Graduate School) may change his major by filing evidence of the new major with the Registrar. A Graduate School student should obtain the approval of his new major department and of the Graduate School in advance. (Change of adviser, if it does not involve change of major, is controlled by the major dean or other appointing authority.)

GRADES AND CREDITS

GRADING SYSTEM. The quality of a student's achievement in courses is graded with A, B, C, or D for passing and the earning of credit, or F for failing work. In designated "no-grade" courses only marks of P and N are recorded, for "passing" (and credit) and "not-passing" work respectively. Students may enroll in other courses on the "no-grade" basis if this is acceptable to the department and instructor concerned. A mark of W is recorded for any course withdrawal which may be permitted after the deadline (no permanent record is made if a withdrawal is filed before the deadline). A temporary mark of I may be recorded if course work is satisfactory but incomplete in some minor but essential detail, and the instructor wishes to allow the student more time for completion; this additional time may not extend beyond the third subsequent term in which the student registers. Grade points are computed on the basis of 4 points for each hour of A, 3 for each hour of B, 2 for each hour of C, 1 for each hour of D, and 0 for each hour of F grade; marks of P, N, W, and I are omitted from grade point computations. The grade point average (GPA) is the quotient of total grade points divided by total graded hours; the total cumulative GPA includes all grades earned in college-level work, the UO GPA includes only grades earned in the University.

SCHOLARSHIP REGULATIONS. In general, any grade point average below 2.00 is defined as unsatisfactory. The Scholastic Deficiency Committee reviews unsatisfactory records and studies all available evidence for the probability of improved scholarship, and then decides in each case whether a deficient student may be allowed to continue (on probation) or whether he should be disqualified from subsequent registration in the University. Academic probation normally will be imposed for a term GPA of 1.00-1.99, or a cumulative GPA below 2.00 but above the disqualification scale which is related to class level. Disqualification normally will be imposed on a student who is on academic probation if he earns another GPA below 2.00, or on any student with a term GPA below 1.00 or a cumulative GPA below the disqualification scale. Reinstatement may be allowed by the Committee when specific convincing evidence (subsequent study or other achievement, time for maturing, or other facts) can be presented to indicate satisfactory scholastic prognosis.

CREDIT BY EXAMINATION. A student may petition to earn credit by taking an examination in a University of Oregon undergraduate course. Laboratory, practice and individualized courses are excluded, as well as any course which the student has failed or which would repeat or be more elementary than courses he has taken; also excluded are lower-division courses in his native language if that is other than English. Departmental and Academic Requirements Committee approval must be obtained, and the established fee paid, before the examination is taken. Credits earned by examination do not carry grades or count as work in residence.

CLASS STANDING. A regular lower-division student is classified as a freshman until he has earned 36 term hours, then as a sophomore until he has earned 93 term hours. A regular upper-division student is classified as a junior until he has earned 138 term hours, then as a senior until he has completed all requirements for a degree. A graduate student is any one who has earned an accredited degree, while a Graduate School student is one seeking a graduate degree who has been accepted toward that objective by a major school or department. A special student is one temporarily without regular classification, usually not qualified to be a regular student; he is limited to the earning of 45 term hours as a special student.

CERTIFICATES AND DEGREES

BACHELOR'S DEGREE REQUIREMENTS. During his lower-division years a student should complete two types of required courses, respectively for specified skills and for general education in "groups" of knowledge.

- Professional credits, not over 48 term hours (for B.A. or B.S.) in a professional field such as Dentistry, Law, or Medicine;
- Applied music, not over 12 or 24 term hours (depending on major and degree; see Catalog) in applied music courses;
- Correspondence credits, not over 60 term hours in correspondence-study courses.
- Specified for the B.A. degree, 36 term hours in language and literature courses and proficiency in one foreign language equivalent to two years of college work in it.
- Specified for the B.S. degree, 36 term hours in social science courses, or 36 term hours in science courses.

Grade point average: 2.00 cumulative total; also 2.00 on University of Oregon work.

Residence: 45 of the last 60 term hours in residence (in U.O., Eugene and/or Portland).

Dean's recommendation, certifying completion of all special requirements in the major.

SECOND BACHELOR'S DEGREE. For a bachelor's degree following any other degree, a student must earn at least 36 term hours beyond the first degree (45 if it was not a U.O. degree) and fulfill all the usual requirements for the new degree including groups, residence, quality and relevance of work, and specific degree requirements.

ADVANCED DEGREE REQUIREMENTS. For a master's degree at least 45 term hours of graduate credit (not more than 15 of which may be transferred from other schools) are required, with a minimum 3.00 GPA; the entire program for a master's degree must be completed within a span of seven years. The academic doctor's degree requires three years of full-time academic work beyond the bachelor's degree (See Catalog and consult Graduate School for details.)

APPLICATION FOR DEGREE. A student intending to complete requirements for any degree must file an Application for Degree with the Registrar at least one month in advance of the expected commencement or graduation. No student may be granted a degree unless all academic and financial requirements have been satisfied prior to the date of the degree. A student who has completed all requirements for a degree may be given an official certification of that fact to temporarily substitute for the diploma.

ADVISING

Advisers will be selected for new students in the field of their primary academic interest. Those who have not yet decided what this field is to be should refer to the group designated "General Liberal Arts" in the list below. Those who have made this decision, even tentatively, should refer to the proper heading in the list. Special directions are that Elementary Education students go to Education but Secondary Education students go to their intended academic department, and that all Honors College students go to the Honors College instead of to their academic department. Old students should go directly to their old adviser (unless adequately advised last spring). Any student wishing to change advisers or with other questions about advising should check with a chief adviser listed below or with the Office of Academic Advising, 140 Hendricks, extension 2261.

Group Advising Meetings (at 7 p.m., Monday, September 18, in the rooms listed below) will include an academic orientation discussion and the assignment of advisers. Every new student, freshman or transfer, should attend one of these meetings unless he was advised during the summer.
