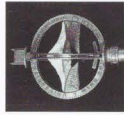




2006 UNIVERSITY OF OREGON
COMMENCEMENT

AUGUST 19, 2006



Congratulations to you and your family and friends on the eve of your graduation. Summer Commencement is August 19, 2006, in the UO Memorial Quadrangle. It is open to the public, and everyone is welcome. Tickets are not needed. The information here will help you and your guests prepare for commencement. Please share this with them.

COMMENCEMENT DAY

Summer Commencement is 10:00 a.m., Saturday, August 19, on the Memorial Quad. The ceremony will end at approximately 11:30 a.m. You may attend and participate in the ceremony whether or not you are graduating this term. If you have not filed for a degree, your name will not appear in the program but will be called.

ASSEMBLY

Candidates should assemble at the north end of the Memorial Quad (see map) no later than 9:30 a.m. Signs will direct you to the correct area.

Cards with your name and your adviser's name (if a doctoral candidate) are handed out in the assembly area. Make certain that you have one before the procession begins.

RAIN PLAN

In the event of rain, the ceremony will move to McArthur Court and degree candidates will assemble on the covered tennis courts.

PROCESSION

Faculty marshals assemble and lead each group of candidates to their appropriate seating. Please remain standing until asked to be seated.

CONFERRAL OF DEGREES

During the ceremony, each group of candidates—doctoral, master's, and bachelor's—stands when identified and receives the conferral statement as a group. When directed, walk to the platform in single file, present your name card to the reader, shake hands with President Frohnmayer, receive your diploma cover from Provost Brady, and return to your seat.

RECESSION

The platform party exits first, followed by the graduates. Your guests can meet you outside the seating area.

RECEPTION

Immediately following the ceremony, an informal reception will be held for new graduates and their families and friends at the north end of the seating area.

PHOTOGRAPHS

Professional photographers will be taking pictures of each graduate during the ceremony. Proofs will be mailed to the graduates and may be viewed online at www.gradphoto.com. The website password will be handed out during commencement.

GENERAL INFORMATION

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Degree candidates are encouraged to wear regalia: gown, cap, tassel, and hood for doctoral and master's degree candidates; gown, cap, and tassel for bachelor's degree candidates. Announcements and regalia, including honor cords for students graduating with honors, are available at the Information Center on the main floor of the UO Bookstore, (541) 346-4331. For your convenience, the bookstore will be open Saturday, August 19, from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. The following prices include payment for a diploma cover, which is presented at the ceremony; please place your orders promptly:

Doctoral candidates: \$85

gown rental fee; purchase hood, cap, tassel; commencement fee

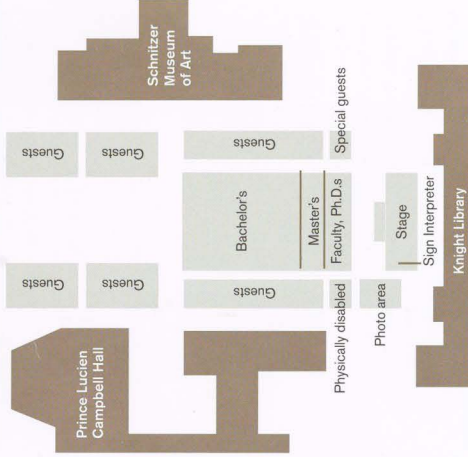
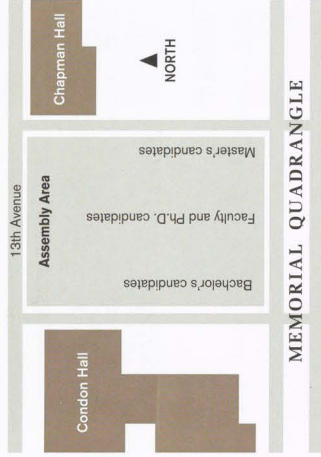
Master's candidates: \$75

gown rental fee; purchase hood, cap, tassel; commencement fee

Bachelor's candidates: \$55

purchase price; commencement fee

DIPLOMAS

Although degrees are conferred at commencement, diplomas are not handed out during the ceremony. Diplomas are mailed ten to twelve weeks after graduation to successful degree recipients at the address listed on the Application for Degree form.

All work necessary for the degree must be on file in the Office of the Registrar on or before September 15, 2006.

REFILING FOR DEGREE

Unsuccessful degree candidates must file another Application for Degree for a later commencement.

LODGING

Information about lodging is available from the Convention and Visitors Association of Lane County, PO Box 10286, Eugene OR 97440; telephone (541) 484-5307 or (800) 547-5445.

DISABILITY SERVICES

Seating is available for guests with special mobility needs. There is a drop-off area for guests with disabilities near the entrance to Knight Library. Designated parking is available at hooded meters on Kincaid Street between East 13th and East 15th avenues. A sign-language interpreter will be available at the ceremony. We recommend that guests with impaired hearing sit in the first few rows of seating in the west section.

PARKING

Parking is available on nearby streets and in UO parking lots. The closest university parking lot is on Kincaid Street between East 13th and East 14th avenues. (Also see Disability Services.)

SPECIAL NOTES

Please remember that alcoholic beverages detract from the dignity of the ceremony and are not allowed on the Memorial Quad.

An area will be set aside at the ceremony for family photographers. We ask that your family use that area at the appropriate time for photography so that everyone may see and enjoy the ceremony.
