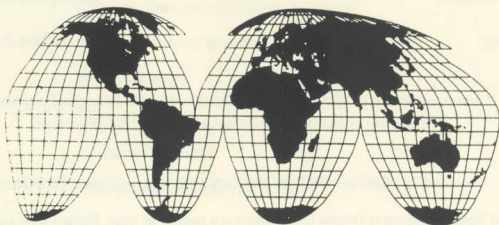

The International Studies Program at Oregon is distinctive in a number of ways. Perhaps most significant is that students are able to individualize their courses of study. This enables and empowers students to develop an academic program which meets their own unique professional and life goals. Major themes and emphases of the Program are:

- *Collaborative learning and research
- *Integration of theory and practice
- *Concern for gender, ethnic, and environmental implications of international policies and practices
 - *Cultural approach to international studies
 - *Concern for the links between environmental and cultural preservation
 - *Awareness of the importance of ethical issues in the international arena
- *Focus on understanding the needs and protecting the rights of indigenous people around the globe
 - *Respect for local, indigenous knowledge
 - *Appreciation of global interconnectedness
- *Understanding of the growing importance of both subnational and transnational actors and related region-states
- *Understanding the root causes of conflicts and the realities of basic global problems such as environmental degradation, injustice, ethnic strife, hunger, disease, and denial of human rights
 - *Emphasis on participatory development and learning
 - *Encouraging the development of sustainable, just, and convivial communities
- *Recognition of the growing importance of NGOs and PVOs in the field of international affairs and their importance in providing interface among local communities, governments, and transnational actors
