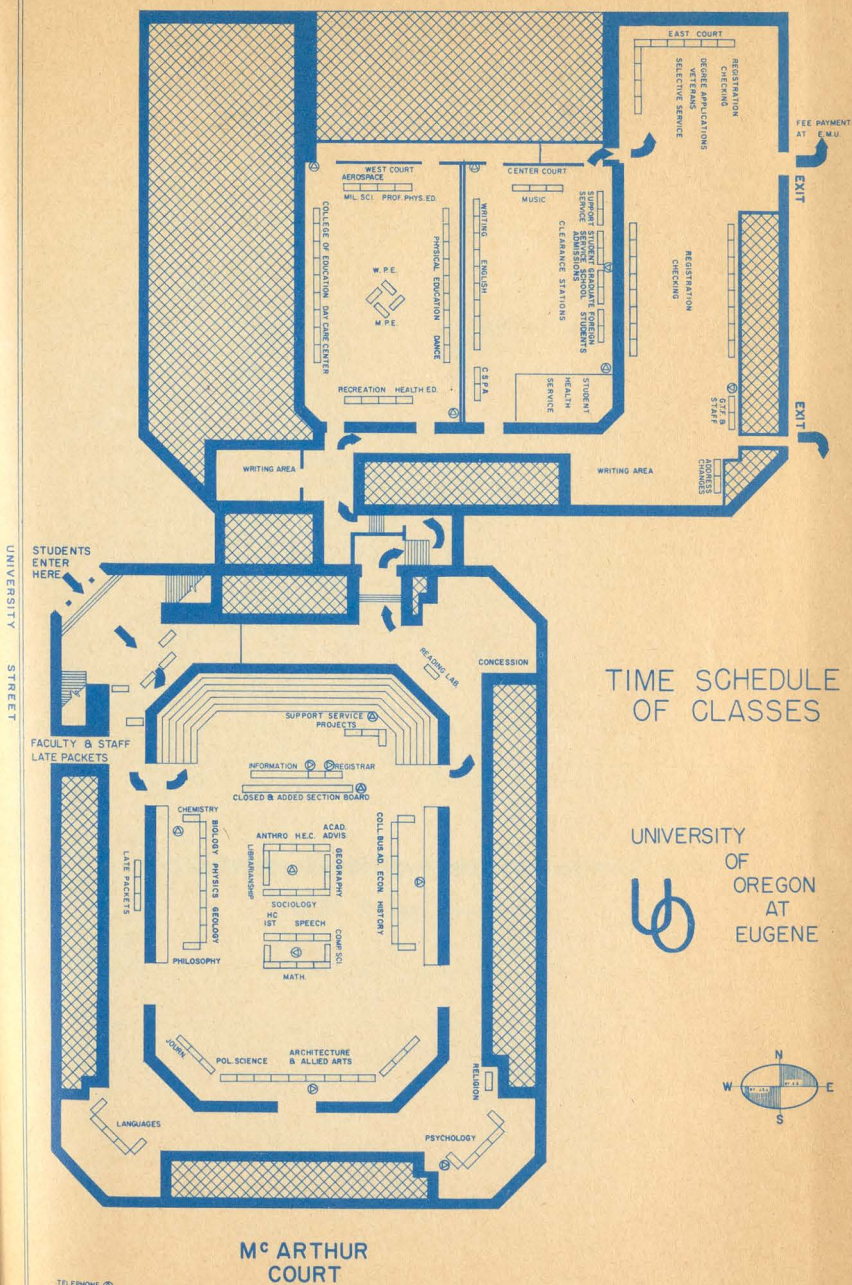

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE (McArthur Court)

PRIOR TO REGISTRATION

- File a Registration Request Card with the Registrar's Office.
- All students intending to enroll for credit must file a Registration card with the Registrar's Office. **This must be done before you can officially register in your courses.** To avoid delay in obtaining your registration packet, the notice should be filed with the Registrar at least three weeks in advance of the opening of classes.
- Secure advance **approval for courses** where applicable, i.e., "instructor's consent" or "variable-credits" (see course listings pages 23 to 44).
- Complete planned course schedule on page 45. **Retain after registration to use as a record of your study program for your class attendance.**
- Students newly admitted to the University of Oregon beginning Summer Session will be able to get their Student Identification Cards (I.D.) in the Photo Service at the Library. Students enrolling for Summer Session only will not be issued Student Identification cards.

REGISTRATION:

- 1. Report on date and at time specified above for issuance of your registration packet. Your registration packet will contain
 - a. Registration Form—Parts A and B
 - b. Registration Certificate
 - c. Fee Card
- Purchase of Student Health Insurance and/or Automobile Parking Permit may be transacted at Stations in the Erb Memorial Union.
- 2. Go to North Bleachers, McArthur Court as illustrated on diagram (Cover Page), and secure a lap board (#2 pencils must be used to properly mark your Registration Form).
 - a. Complete **Part A** of the Registration Form.
 - 1. Only the following items on Part A are required: Name, Social Security Number, Home Address, Local Phone Number, and Home Town. If any of these items are missing or incorrect, please supply the missing information.
 - Please list your local address and phone number on your Fee Card.**
 - b. Check "Closed and Added Section Board" adjacent to North Bleachers, then fill in course selections on Part B of your Registration Form.
 - 1. It is recommended that, where multi-section courses are to be selected, that you record all data pertaining to the course on Part B of your Registration Form with the exception of the TLN entry. Gain departmental approval for single-section courses first and multi-sectioned courses last.
 - 2. If the section you select has a single plus (+) printed after the days listed for the course, please enroll in one of the Lab or Discussion sections which follow the lecture.
- Proceed to departmental tables as shown on diagram and obtain department stamp for each course you wish to enroll in.
- If you discover a conflict in your schedule, and it is necessary to adjust the course selections on your Form, return to department table and request "voiding" of your course enrollment by (a) acquiring "Department Stamp" imprint in **TLN column** of course to be dropped, (b) erasing gridding and then gridding 9999.
- Return to North Bleachers and complete **Part B**, Registration Form.
 - a. **Please note:** It is important that Part B be completed accurately. You will note, the TLN (Term Line Number) is the official control on this document. This section (Part B) represents your OFFICIAL registration for classes. **Double check** your TLN gridding to insure your registration in each course.
 - NOTE: The first horizontal line in the grid area is "0."
 - b. Grading option will be assumed to be "graded" if not marked.
- Report to the checking stations in East Court for final processing of your registration.
 - a. Your Registration Forms and Address Update Sheets will be checked with you.
 - 1. Undergraduate credit hour limitation: Students will be limited to 21 term hours of credit for the entire summer session. Students who exceed the 21 term hours will have excess hours cancelled from their study load.
 - 2. Tuition and fees will be assessed in accordance with your indicated course load.
 - 1. At the time of fee assessment your Registration Form will be collected, but **you will not be considered registered until your fees are paid.** Your fee card and Registration certificate will be returned to you.

FEE PAYMENT:

- a. Report to Cashier's Stations, in the Ballroom, Erb Memorial Union, for payment of fees.
 - 1. Fees are to be paid at the Cashier's Station, EMU, Monday, Tuesday, June 19 and 20, (8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.). Beginning Wednesday, June 21, fees may be paid at the University Business Office (8:00 a.m. to 12 noon and 1:00 to 4:00 p.m.). Beginning Monday, June 26, fees may be paid 10:00-12:00 noon and 1:00 to 5:00 p.m.
 - 2. Late fee for courses 8 and 11 weeks duration starts Thursday, June 22.

3. If your fees for regular session courses (1-8 and 1-11 week courses) are not paid in full by Friday June 30, your registration is subject to cancellation. For cancellation dates for short courses see the "Important Dates" page 5.

SPECIAL NOTES:

1. Name/Address Changes:

If pre-printed personal information (i.e., name, address, etc.) Part A, Registration is incorrect or missing, you may obtain "Change Forms" at the Information Table near the North Bleachers, McArthur Court.

(See Page 9 for information on Address Requirements and instructions for completing Address Update Forms.)

2. Supplemental Registration Forms:

If you have more than ten Term Line Numbers to mark on your Registration Form, obtain a "Supplemental Registration Form" at the Registrar's Table.

3. Departmental Course Enrollment:

Students are encouraged to select and register for second choice sections when first choice sections are posted and closed and to complete their total registration including processing in the East Court and fee payment in the Ballroom, EMU.

4. Drop/Add:

Drop/Add/Change forms will be issued at the Registrar's Office beginning Tuesday, June 20. Students may initiate "Drop/Add" and process such changes through the Registrar's Office at no charge on Tuesday, June 20, and Wednesday, June 21. Charges for drop/add will begin Thursday, June 22.

5. Veterans Benefits and Selective Service:

A "Veterans Benefits and Selective Service" station will be located in the East Court (see diagram). **To receive benefits for Summer Session all veterans must report to the Veterans table.**

- Veterans Benefits: If you are eligible for educational benefits, you may pick up Application Form 1990. New students must turn in their Veterans Administration Certificates of Eligibility and sign up for benefits. Returning students must also sign up here.
- All Veterans must notify the Veterans Clerk, 161 Emerald Hall, whenever a change of hours will affect the rate of their educational allowance.
- Selective Service: If you wish the Registrar's Office to notify your draft board of your enrollment status, you may request that a Selective Service Form 109 or 103 be submitted. Notification will not be sent to your draft board without your specific request.

PROCEDURES FOR LATE REGISTRATION/WORKSHOP REGISTRATION

Those who do not complete registration on Monday, June 19 in McArthur Court are requested to report to the Office of the Registrar, Emerald Hall, to pick up late registration packets beginning Tuesday, June 20.

- Complete Part A of Registration Form.
- Report to departmental offices for approval of courses selected. (See course listings, pages 23 to 44 for location of departments.)
- Complete Part B, Registration Form.
- Report to Registrar's Office, Emerald Hall, for checking and fee assessment.
- Report to Cashiers to pay fees. Tuesday, June 20, in Ballroom, EMU, (8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m.) Starting Wednesday, June 21, in Emerald Hall, (8:00 a.m.-12 noon and 1:00 p.m.-4:00 p.m.).

Refund Schedule subject to change.

Students *completely withdrawing* from school will be given refunds in accordance with the above schedule. All refunds are calculated from the date the student is officially withdrawn, not from the date of last class attendance.

Students *reducing their schedule* will not be eligible for refunds unless their course load is reduced for reasons beyond their control.

For example: 1. A course is cancelled by the University.

2. The prerequisite or time of a course is incorrectly stated in the Time Schedule thereby causing a conflict with other elements of the student's schedule.

Reduction of course load because of work load or other personal reasons will not qualify as a suitable condition for refund.

Any claim for refund resulting from a reduction of course load must be filed on a "Petition for Refund" available from the Office of the Registrar at the time of the change.

Approximately six weeks should be allowed for processing tuition refunds.

LOANS AND FINANCIAL AID

Short Term Loans for purposes of Tuition and Fees Only:

Students who experience difficulty in meeting payment of tuition and fees at the time of registration may apply for a short term loan at the Financial Aid Office, 274 Emerald Hall, if they meet the criteria listed below:

1. Enrolled at University of Oregon a previous term
2. Must be in good standing (not on probation)
3. Must not have a presently outstanding short term loan.

Maximum Amount of Loan: Undergraduate Resident Tuition and Fees
 Graduate Tuition and Fees

Students may submit applications for tuition-only loans beginning Monday, June 12, 1972. During registration applications for loans to pay tuition and fees (*does not cover General Deposit*) must be made **no later than 4:00 pm on Tuesday, June 20**. If the application is made after June 20, the individual will be subject to the applicable late fee.

Students receiving tuition loans must have their fees assessed before they pick up their loan at the Short Term Loan Table in the Ballroom, EMU, on Monday and Tuesday, June 19 and 20, or beginning Wednesday, June 21, at the Cashier's Office in Emerald Hall. This loan must be used to pay fees.

Short Term Loans for purposes other than Tuition and Fees:

For other personal and educational needs students may, if they meet the criteria listed above and are officially enrolled, apply at the Financial Aid Office, 274 Emerald Hall, for a short term loan not in excess of \$100.00, **provided no tuition-only loan has been received.**

The approved loan, subject to the student paying his fees and meeting eligibility requirements, will be available within a 24-hour period, or at 2:00 the following day at the Short Term Loan Table in the Ballroom, EMU, June 19 and 20. After Tuesday, June 20, the loan can be picked up at the Cashier's Office, Emerald Hall.

National Defense Loans

Students receiving NDS loans must have their fees assessed and sign for their loan at the National Defense Loan table in the Ballroom, EMU, on Monday and Tuesday, June 19 and 20. Starting Wednesday, June 21, NDS loans must be in the Accounting Department, Emerald Hall. **The NDS credit card is to be used to pay student's fee.**

Guaranteed Student Loans

Students receiving G.S.L. checks must have their fees assessed and sign for their loan at the Financial Aid table in the Ballroom, EMU, on Monday and Tuesday, June 19 and 20. Starting Wednesday, June 21, G.S.L. checks will be at the Financial Aid Office, 274 Emerald Hall. **These checks can be used for fee payment.**

Credit Cards—Scholarships and Grants

These awards will either be in the registration packet or at the Scholarship Table in the Dad's Lounge, EMU, on Monday and Tuesday, June 19 and 20. Starting Wednesday, June 21, all credit cards except E.O.G. and W.I.N. will be at the Cashier's Office in Emerald Hall, E.O.G. and W.I.N. will be in the Financial Aid Office, 274 Emerald Hall.

ADDRESS REQUIREMENTS

Each student registering at the University is required to file a home address and a "campus address," if different, for use by University Offices. In an effort to reduce the number of times that an address card must be prepared, students are requested to furnish address information that can be stored in a central address file and distributed by computer printouts to offices requiring them.

1. If your campus or home address are currently included in the central file they will appear on the preprinted registration forms. If correct, no further filing of addresses is required.

2. If one or both of the required addresses are missing or incorrect proceed as follows:

A. Campus Address: If you are living on campus in a University dormitory, private dormitory, Cooperative, Fraternity, or Sorority, find your living unit in the listing on Part A of the registration form. Mark its code and your room number (if any) in the appropriate sections.

If you are living off-campus file an "Off-Campus Address Sheet" as described in the next paragraph.

B. Off Campus Address:

1. Obtain a blue "Off Campus Address Update Sheet" for each separate address you must file.

2. In the upper left corner are a group of boxes describing the type of addresses included on the sheet. If the address being reported is your home address only, mark the home address box. If it is also your U or O address, mark this box also. The boxes marked should fully describe the address coded on this single sheet.

3. Each sheet must also have your student body number (Social Security Number) printed and gridded in the "Student Number" block in the lower right corner of the sheet.

4. Each block used must be complete, e.g., when entering your street address in the middle block make certain that the complete street address is gridded.

5. Any data block on the form which is not relevant to the address being submitted may be omitted, e.g., if there is no telephone at this address, the "Telephone No." block can be ignored.

6. Unless you are supplying a name **other than your own**, e.g., father, do not use the name data block at the top of the page.

7. Each grid area consists of one to three columns alternately shaded and clear, and represents a coding area for one number or letter. There should be one mark only in a single grid area. Each grid area contains all or part of the following:

To complete the gridding, print the letter or number above the grid area and then mark the corresponding character from one of the three vertical areas immediately below.

8. If your Registration Form Part A shows an incorrect address, you may correct it by filing a new Address Up-date Sheet which includes the address description, your student number (Social Security Number) and only those address data areas which must be modified.

9. When completing the mailing instructions on Part A of registration form for grades and fee deposit refunds, make certain that you have on file, or are filing, addresses matching the ones you have designated.

COURSE NUMBERS

The alphabetic abbreviation preceding the course number designates the department. The number following the department abbreviation designates the course level. Both should be used in designating a course. Course numbers suggest the level of students for which they are intended as follows:

50-299—Lower Division (freshmen and sophomores)

300-499—Upper Division (juniors and seniors)

500-599—Graduates. Graduates may also take 400-499 courses for graduate credit if the courses are designated with a "G" or "M" (see below).

Course numbers identified by:

"G"—graduate credit

"M"—graduate credit for minors, non-majors

"P"—graduate credit in professional field

"R"—may be repeated for credit

COMPLETE WITHDRAWAL

A student may withdraw completely from the University for good cause upon receiving permission from the Office of Student Services. Tuition refunds will be made in accordance with the Refund Schedule (page 8).

Obtain withdrawal forms from a staff member of the Office of Student Services, Room 207, Emerald Hall.

Obtain a departmental clearance stamp for each class in which you are enrolled.

If you have been awarded any form of financial aid (including Guaranteed Bank Loans), contact the Office of Financial Aid, Room 274, Emerald Hall.

If you are enrolled in an Educational Opportunity Program, contact the director of that program.

Return all withdrawal forms, and your Certificate of Registration to the Office of Student Services, Room 207, Emerald Hall.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS COMMITTEE

This Committee is composed of 6 faculty members and 1 ex officio member (non-voting), appointed by the President upon recommendation of the Committee on Committees. One student member is appointed by the President upon recommendation of ASUO.

The Committee has the responsibility for the administration and interpretation of academic requirements for baccalaureate degrees, and for action on student petitions for exceptions to these requirements and other academic regulations. (It does not have jurisdiction over regulations governing graduate degrees.)

This Committee reviews petitions by students for adding and/or dropping courses after the last day to change courses. Petitions may be obtained from the Registrar's Office where complete instructions for procedure are given with each petition.

Study Load. The maximum summer study load for an undergraduate student is 21 term hours for the entire summer session. *Students who exceed the 21 term hour limit will have excess hours cancelled from their study load.*

Change of Program. A Drop/Add/Change Form, processed according to the instructions thereon, must be filed with the Registrar's Office to effect any post-registration change in the Registration Card. See "Reminder: Important Dates" on page 5 of this Time Schedule of Classes for deadlines for filing changes from original registration. Complete withdrawal from all courses may be allowed, for good cause, by the Office of Student Services.

Major. It is not necessary that a student declare an official major during the summer session. A freshman planning to continue at the University can spend at least one year fulfilling lower-division group requirements while investigating possible major fields.

Class Standing. The minimum credits for various undergraduate classifications are: 45 hours for sophomore, 90 hours for junior, 135 hours for senior. Any person with an accredited degree will be assigned graduate standing, but additional screening is required for entrance into the Graduate School.

Credits. Credits at U.O. are defined as "hours," term hours or quarter hours, one hour equals two-thirds of one semester hour. The usual process for earning credits is through term registration as a resident student. Credits may be transferred from other accredited institutions (credit from two-year schools is limited to that earned within the first 108 which apply toward a degree) and from the Division of Continuing Education. Under "concurrent registration" students may register without extra fees at more than one division of the State System of Higher Education; rules and forms are available at the Registrar's Office. The combination of credits may not exceed 21. Credit in undergraduate courses may be earned by examination; instructions are stated on the Academic Requirements Committee petitioning form, available at the Registrar's Office.

Course Numbers. Courses are numbered to suggest the level of students for whom they are intended; freshmen take 100s, graduate students 500s. All may be applied on bachelor's degrees, but only "graduate credit" courses (500s and specified 400s) on advanced degrees.

Grading System. Student work is graded as follows: A, excellent; B, Good; C, Satisfactory; P, Satisfactory Pending; N, Unsatisfactory; I, Incomplete; W, Withdrawn; X, No grade reported by instructor; Y, No basis for grade. When the quality of work is satisfactory, but some minor yet essential requirement of the course have not yet been completed, for reasons acceptable to the instructor, a report of "I" may be made and additional time granted for completion of the work. "W" indicates official withdrawal from a course by filing the proper forms in the Registrar's Office.

ACADEMIC PROBATION/DISQUALIFICATION POLICIES

The Scholastic Deficiency Committee is composed of 7 faculty members and 4 ex officio members appointed by the President upon recommendation of the Committee on Committees. Two student members are appointed by the President upon recommendation of the ASUO.

The Committee administers, within the framework of faculty legislation, the undergraduate academic standards of the University as they pertain to the level of academic performance and progress toward a degree. When there is evidence of lack of satisfactory progress, the Committee may place a student on academic probation or disqualify him from further attendance at the University. The Committee will exercise this function over the Summer School performance of regularly admitted students as well as performance during the regular academic year.

Academic Warning

Academic warning is given as a courtesy action to advise a student of potential difficulty. Subsequent action is not dependent on receiving a warning notice, nor will a warning become part of the permanent record.

Academic Probation

A student will be placed on Academic Probation whenever any of the following conditions exist:

- 1) An accumulated total of University of Oregon hours of non-passing grades earned since Fall Term 1969 reaches the level specified below:

- 2) If in each of two consecutive terms either of the following conditions exists:
 - a) six or more hours of N are received,
 - b) less than 65% of the course work *attempted* has been completed with credit. (Grades and marks of A, B, C, D, P, F, N, I, and Y are counted as work attempted.)
- 3) Based on the University of Oregon cumulative credit hours earned since Fall Term 1969 for students in Junior classification or above, less than 80% of the course work *completed* has been passed satisfactorily. (Grades of A, B, C, D, P, F, and N are counted as work completed.) This rule will not apply until a student has accumulated 25 or more credits at the University of Oregon.
- 4) A record at the time of initial admission or re-enrollment which would have caused a student to be placed on warning or probation under current University of Oregon regulations. Notification of such action will be given to the student at the time the action is taken.

A student will be removed from Academic Probation if, during two consecutive terms in residence, he has accumulated at least 24 hours of credit without being disqualified (see rules listed under "Academic Disqualification"). Part-time students (enrolled for less than 12 hours per term) will be removed from academic probation if they have completed 3 consecutive terms in residence with a minimum of 3 credit hours per term.

Academic Disqualification

A student on Academic Probation will be subject to Academic Disqualification whenever any of the following conditions exist:

- 1) An accumulated total of University of Oregon hours of non-passing grades earned since Fall Term 1969 reaches the level specified below:

- 2) In the current term, six or more hours of N are received . . . or less than 75% of the course work *ATTEMPTED* has been completed with credit,
- 3) Based on the University of Oregon cumulative credit hours earned since Fall Term 1969 for students in Junior classification or above, less than 80% of the course work *completed* has been passed satisfactorily.
- 4) Whenever the academic record is such as to provide persuasive evidence that the University requirements for an undergraduate degree cannot be met within a reasonable period of time.

Reinstatement

Consideration of reinstatement to the University will be acted on by the Committee only after receipt of a formal petition from the student. Each request will be evaluated on individual merit of the case and on supportive evidence provided by the student. All students reinstated will be placed on probation.

The petition for reinstatement will be considered by the Committee contingent upon receipt of grade or mark check transcripts, petitions and all supporting documents on file in the Office of the Registrar no later than one month prior to the opening of classes; later receipt of documents will be considered for the subsequent term.

Evaluation Criteria

In determining the number of non passing hours to be counted toward probation/disqualification action, all University of Oregon work completed by students Fall Term 1969 and thereafter will be included.

In all instances, the grades reported to the Registrar within the designated grade reporting period will determine the action of the Committee. The receipt of subsequent changes in grades or marks, or of late grades or marks will be reviewed by the Committee when considering actions for the next term.

DEGREE APPLICATION

Formal Application for Degree must be filed with the Registrar, at least one month before an anticipated graduation. All academic records are clear by the date of the degree, it can be informally confirmed immediately while the diploma will be mailed later.

(Only U/O work completed in residence through registration at the University or at the Medical School or Dental School, Portland, may be counted toward satisfaction of this requirement. Course work in Division of Continuing Education may not be counted as residence credit). (For students officially enrolled in the School of Nursing, residence with respect to a degree in nursing may include any work taken in any branch of the State System of Higher Education (including the Division of Continuing Education), provided that (a) the course work is required in the degree program in the School of Nursing and (b) the course work is not concurrently offered by the School of Nursing).

5. Graded Hours (A, B, C, D) :

Ninety of which a minimum of **45 credit hours must be earned at the University of Oregon.** (As defined A-4)

6. U/O (Satisfactory Work):

Eighty-five per cent of all work completed at the U/O must be passed satisfactorily (i.e., with a grade of A, B, C, or P)—all degrees. The U of O does not compute grade point averages (G.P.A.).

C. Specific Requirements

1. B.A. Only—Language and Literature 36 credit hours:
including attainment of proficiency in a foreign language equivalent to that attained at the end of two years of college study of the language.

The language requirement for the B.A. degree may be met in any one of the following ways:

- (a) two years (normally 24 term hours) of college work in a foreign language;
- (b) one year of college work at the second-year or higher level, or the final term of any second year course, or any term of a third year or above course; or
- (c) examination, administered by the appropriate department, showing language competence equivalent to that attained at the end of two years of college study. The requirement may not be met by examination after the completion of a student's junior year.

Scores on the Foreign Language exam taken by all incoming freshmen indicate what level the student might begin on, not where he must begin.

I. THE CODE OF STUDENT CONDUCT

Every institution must have a system for maintaining order and for preserving its function. The system used by the University of Oregon is largely student-organized and student-run. The faculty and administrators rely strongly on the students to discipline themselves, individually and as a body. As a student, you are responsible for being familiar with the rules and regulations that govern your actions on the University campus. The rules you need to know are listed here.

A complete copy of the Code may be obtained in Room 62, Omega-Straub.

A. General Policies

1. The University is dedicated not only to learning and the advancement of knowledge but also to the development of ethically sensitive and responsible persons. It seeks to achieve these goals through a sound educational program and policies governing student conduct that encourage independence and maturity.

2. The University distinguishes its responsibility for student conduct from the control functions of the wider community. When a student has been apprehended for the violation of a law of the community, the state, or the nation, the University will not request or agree to special consideration for the student because of his status as a student. The University will cooperate fully, however, with law enforcement agencies, and with other agencies in any program for the rehabilitation of the student.

3. The University may apply sanctions or take other appropriate action only when student conduct directly and significantly interferes with the University's (a) primary educational responsibility of ensuring the opportunity of all members of the University community to attain their educational objectives, or (b) subsidiary responsibilities of protecting the health and safety of persons in the University community, maintaining and protecting property, keeping records, providing living accommodations and other services, and sponsoring non-classroom activities such as lectures, concerts, athletic events, and social functions.

4. Procedural fairness is basic to the proper enforcement of all University rules. In particular, no disciplinary sanction as serious as expulsion, suspension, disciplinary probation, or entry of an adverse notation on any permanent record available to persons outside the University shall be imposed unless the student has been notified in writing of the charges against him and has had an opportunity (a) to appear alone or with any other persons to advise and assist him before an appropriate committee, court, or official, (b) to know the nature and source of the evidence against him and to present evidence in his own behalf, and (c) to have his case reviewed by the University Appeals Board (March 4, 1970)

5. Students shall have an opportunity to participate fully in the formulation of all policies and rules pertaining to student conduct and in the enforcement of all such rules.

6. Rules and sanctions affecting the conduct of men and women shall be based on general principles of equal treatment, including like penalties for like violations.

B. Violations

1. No sanction or other disciplinary action shall be imposed on a student by or in the name of the University except in accordance with this Code.

2. Expulsion or suspension from the University or any lesser sanction may result from the commission of any of the following offenses:

- a. Academic cheating or plagiarism
- b. Furnishing false information to the University with intent to deceive
- c. Forgery, alteration, or misuse of University documents, records, or identification cards
- d. Physical abuse of another person in the University community
- e. Malicious destruction, damage, or misuse of University property, including library materials, or of private property on the campus
- f. Theft or conversion of another's property occurring under the conditions of paragraph A-3. (June 6, 1968)
- g. Vandalism or kidnapping committed on other campuses
- h. Participation in hazing
- i. Lewd or indecent conduct occurring under the conditions of paragraph A-3
- j. Conduct which intentionally obstructs or disrupts the University functions stated in paragraph A-3 of the Code of Student Conduct
- k. Two or more (or the repetition of) offenses listed in paragraph 3 below.

3. Disciplinary probation or any lesser sanction may result from the commission of any of the following offenses:

- a. Possession, consumption, or furnishing of alcoholic beverages on University owned or controlled property (except in living quarters of married students), in University related housing for single students, or at University sponsored or supervised functions
- b. Disorderly conduct, including disorderly conduct resulting from drunkenness, occurring under the conditions of paragraph A-3 (June 12, 1964)
- c. Failure to disperse, to leave a University building, room or other premise, or to cease the use of loudspeakers, amplifiers, or other forms of noise after being given notice to do so by a person properly designated and identified as having authority from the president of the University to give such notice.
- d. Raiding of University related living units
- e. Violation of closing hour restrictions
- f. Violation of visiting hour rules
- g. Violation of any University rules approved by the Student Conduct Committee for the infraction of which sanctions may be imposed under this Code.

4. All rules approved by the Student Conduct Committee pursuant to paragraph 3 (g) shall be in writing and shall be published, distributed, or posted in such a manner as to furnish adequate notice of their contents to students affected by such rules. The University's failure to comply with this requirement shall be a complete defense to any charge of violation of a rule of which the student has no actual knowledge.

C. Sanctions

1. Sanctions which may be imposed for the commission of University offenses shall include the following:
 - a. Expulsion from the University
 - b. Suspension from the University for a definite or indefinite period of time
 - c. Disciplinary probation with or without loss of designated privileges for a definite period of time. The violation of the terms of disciplinary probation or the infraction of any University rule during the period of disciplinary probation may be grounds for suspension or expulsion from the University. The parents of any student under 21 years of age who is placed on disciplinary probation, suspended, or expelled shall be so notified.
 - d. Loss of privileges:
 1. Restriction to campus living quarters
 2. Denial of use of an automobile for a designated time
 3. Removal from dormitory or other University housing
 4. Loss of such other privileges as may be consistent with the offense committed and the rehabilitation of the student
 - e. Admonition and warning
 - f. Such other sanctions as may be approved by the Student Conduct Committee.
2. The sanctions of expulsion or suspension shall not be imposed except upon proper determination by the Student Court or the University Appeals Board. (March 4, 1970)
3. The General Policies, Violations, and Sanctions shall be printed and made readily available to all students. The campus newspaper shall be requested by the Student Conduct Committee to publish the same at the beginning of each school year.

III. RULES AND REGULATIONS

Pursuant to Section I.B.3.g., I.B.4., I.E.1. and I.E.4. of the Student Conduct Code . . . (January 15, 1969) the following rules and regulations are adopted by the Student Conduct Committee as rules for the violation of which sanctions may be imposed. (The sections in this part were consolidated by the Student Conduct Committee as a Part II on April 29, 1964.)

A. Social Activity Eligibility

(April 20, 1965)

1. Any student who has been expelled or suspended from the University as a result of disciplinary action shall be denied the privileges of the institution and of the organizations in any way connected with it during the period of suspension or suspension. Such students shall not be permitted to participate in any University recognized function, invited or allowed to reside in any fraternity, sorority, co-operative or dormitory.
2. Any individual who is invited or allowed to reside in any fraternity, sorority, or co-operative and who is otherwise subject as an individual to the University of Oregon Code of Student Conduct, may subject such fraternities, sorority, or co-operative to sanctions for Group Offenses set forth in I.D. of this Code, by conduct that would constitute a violation of this Code if such individual were a student subject to the jurisdiction of this Code.

B. Compliance With Request to Cease Violation

Failure to comply with a request to discontinue conduct which constitutes a violation under this Code shall be considered to be an aggravation of that offense. (March 2, 1970)

C. Compliance With Sanction

A student duly sanctioned under this Code shall comply with all provisions of such sanctions. (November 20, 1969)

D. Discrimination by Living Organizations

1. Living organizations shall not discriminate in pledgship or membership choice on the basis of race, color, or religion.
2. When a hearing is held on an alleged violation of this rule, the existence of any of the following conditions shall be sufficient evidence of guilt unless there is clear and convincing evidence to the contrary:
 - a. An alumnus or national officer of the organization has the power to veto the pledgship or membership bid.
 - b. A letter of recommendation from an alumnus is required for pledgship or membership.
 - c. A system of voting on pledgship or membership exists such that one or a small minority of members can veto pledgship or membership bid.
 - d. The organization consistently refuses to admit members of minority groups to pledgship or membership in the organization. (April 17, 1968)

E. EMU Checks

All students, within 10 days of official notification, shall reimburse the Erb Memorial Union and pay a service charge for a check returned by a bank for Non-Sufficient Funds. (July 18, 1968)

F. Contempt

1. Contempt of Adjudicative Proceedings. When any person, in the presence of any tribunal created under this Code, and while sitting as an adjudicative body, exhibits conduct tending to impair or to interrupt the due course of a trial or other adjudicative proceedings, such person may be held in contempt and sanctioned therefor. (October 1969)

2. Sanction Imposed. . . . Any sanction which may be imposed for the violation of a rule promulgated pursuant to I.B.3.g. may be imposed for the commission of a contempt.

3. Adjudication of Contempt and Imposition of sanction. The adjudication of contempt shall be made by the then presiding officer, alone and summarily. Thereupon the proceedings shall be recessed and the entire tribunal shall decide whether the presiding officer's adjudication shall be upheld and, if so, what sanction shall be imposed. Such decision shall be made as in any other case. Upon the adjudication and sanction, if any, the presiding officer shall certify to the Coordinator of Student Conduct the facts constituting the contempt and the sanction imposed therefor. Persons so adjudicated in contempt shall have the same right to appeal as are afforded in any other case adjudicated in that tribunal. (May 27, 1969)

G. Appearance as Witness

Any person subject to this code who fails to comply with Section II.A.6.a. above by failing to appear as instructed, without an excuse acceptable to the court, may be charged accordingly and sanctioned in Student Court pursuant to I.B.3.g.

For Campus Parking Regulations contact Campus Security Office.

New students who have chosen a major should report on Monday June 19 to the appropriate departmental main office for assignment to an adviser (offices are listed in the time schedule at the beginning of each department's course offerings). Those who have not yet chosen a major should report to a "Pre-Liberal Arts: Undecided" adviser in the Office of Academic Advising (140 Hendricks Hall).

Students in Elementary Education should go to the School of Education, but Secondary Education students are advised in their intended academic department. Pre-Medicine, Pre-Dental, and Pre-Nursing students should report to 140 Hendricks Hall.

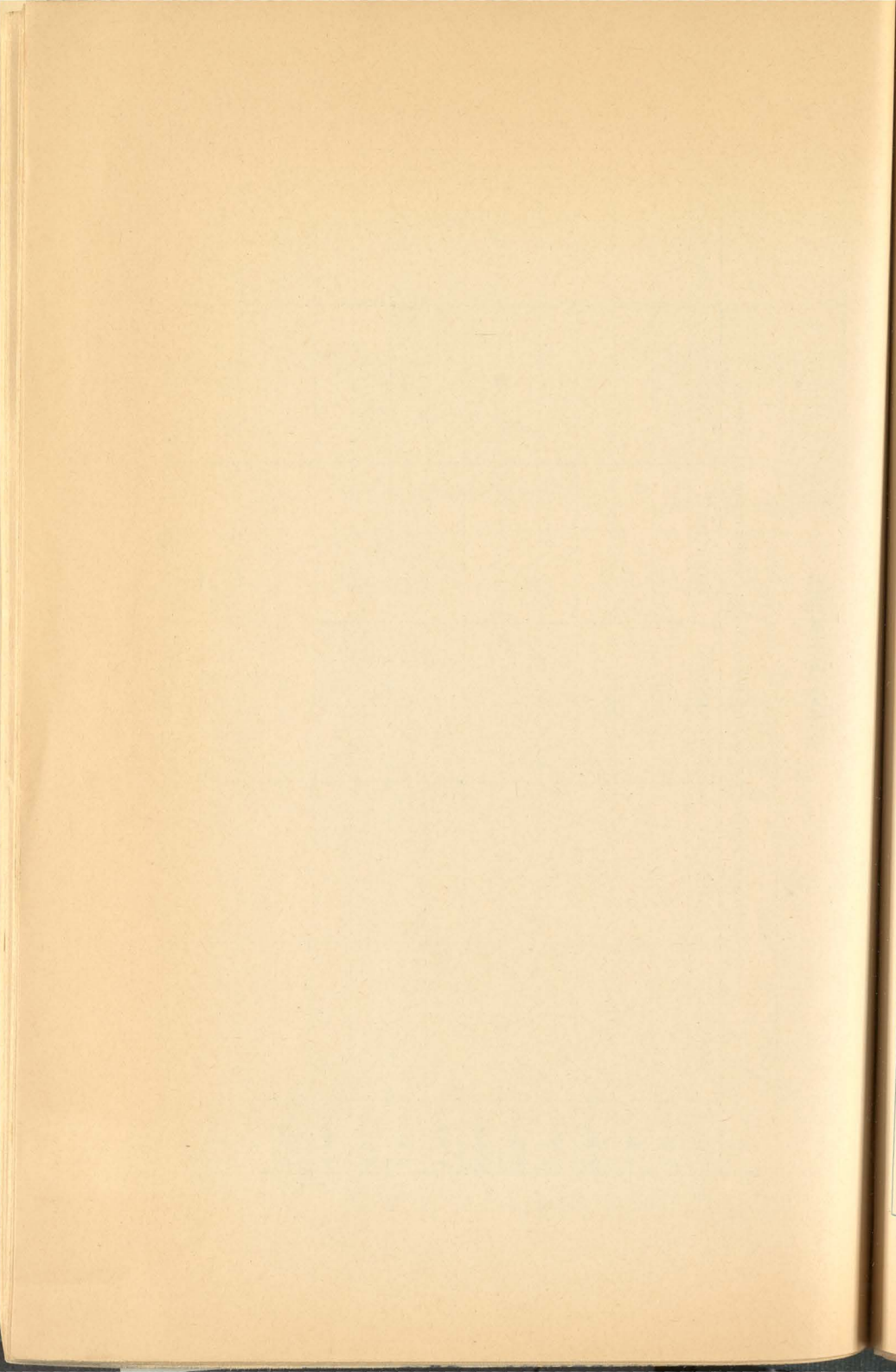

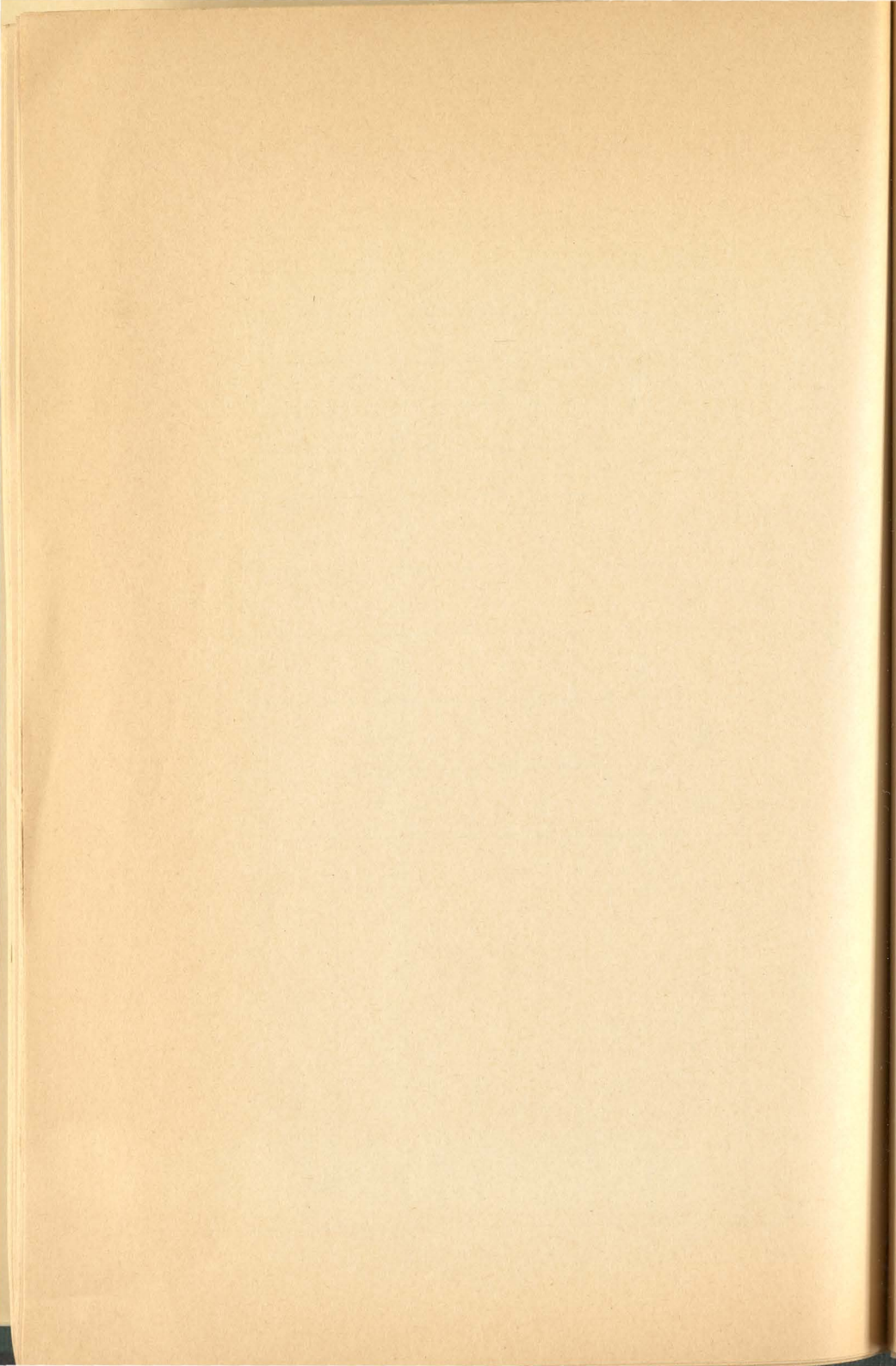

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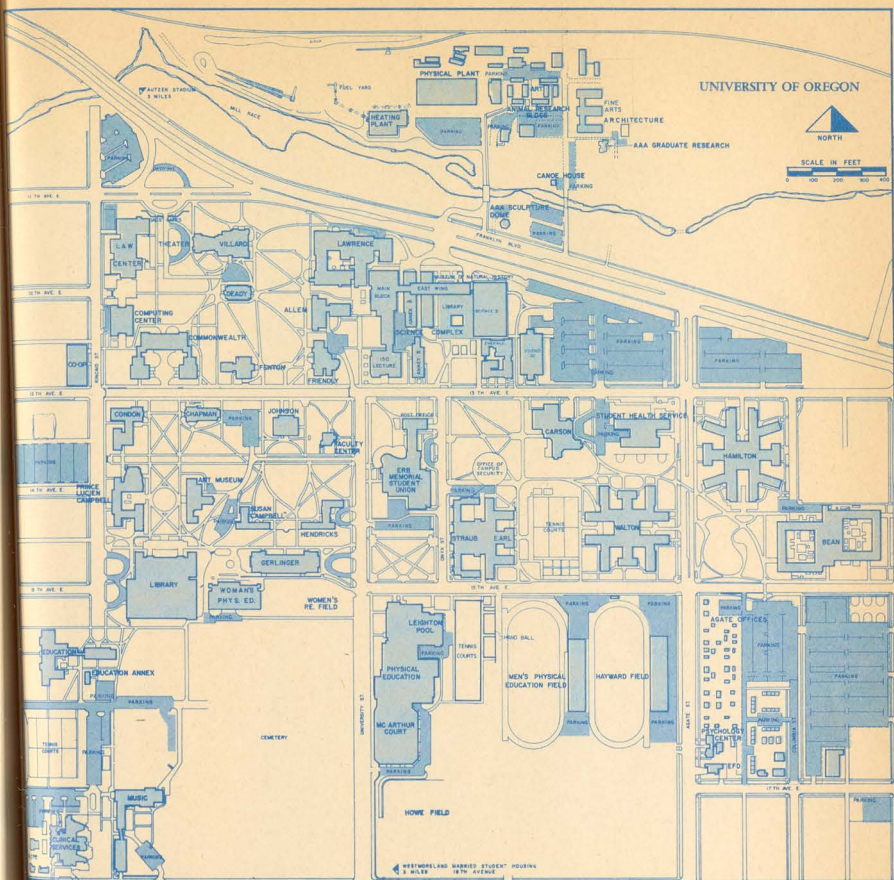
