Registration Instructions, Fall Term 1959

Step 1. Obtain your registration material. It has been prepared in advance for all new students admitted and for all students expected to return from previous terms.

When: New students within the hours of 2:30-5 on Sunday (Sept. 20), or 8-12 and 1-5 on Monday and the following days (on Saturday (8-12 only). Old students 8-12 and 1-5 beginning on Wednesday (Sept. 23).

Where: In Union basement until Saturday (Sept. 26), thereafter at Registrar's Office in Emerald Hall.

What: The following forms are used in registration, for the purposes described (listed in approximately the order you will be concerned with them). Do not destroy any identified form.

- (a) **Time Schedule of Classes.** You should find in this book the answers to most registration problems—check the index and read carefully. Use center pages to work out your study program before you write it on the cards. Please copy course title, credits, department and course number and section code exactly as they are listed in this book.
- (b) **Photocopy of your official permanent record sheet.** On most undergraduates' record sheets the standing on group requirements is shown in the lower right corner. In the "group requirements check" course numbers are indicated by columns and the groups by lines, and in each block is shown the number of terms of credit earned toward that particular requirement (Adv means advanced or transferred credit, Opt means option or second sequence, and departments are indicated sometimes). Above the block is shown the total number of group courses needed for the major indicated there. Accumulated credits (and hours and points in parentheses) and GPA are shown following the last work taken, and deficiencies on other requirements to the left of these. After using this for reference in the registration conference with your adviser, leave it with him for departmental files.
- (c) **Registration Card.** This IBM card serves as the official record of your registration. Add your schedule of courses and other items; secure the endorsements indicated on front and back of the card.
- (d) **Instructor's Card.** This goes directly from the department clerk to each of your instructors as evidence of your (probable) enrollment with him; he can use it for his class records.
- (e) **Student Grade Card.** After you fill out one of these for each of your courses, it is completed in the IBM office. At the end of the term it is sent to the instructor for turning in his grades; then through IBM machines it produces your term grade report, the entries on your official permanent record, and other reports.
- (f) **Automobile Data Card.** This card informs the Physical Plant department as to whether you will not be driving any motor vehicle while on the campus, or may drive but will not use the campus parking lots (registration sticker, no fee), or will drive and will use the parking lots (parking permit, \$5 for the school year). Details on privileges, procedures and penalties are issued separately. Driving without a registration sticker or parking permit will result in a \$10 fine, and fines of \$2-\$10 will follow certain driving and parking offenses on the campus.
- (g) **Student Optional Insurance Card.** On this card you indicate whether you wish to purchase the optional sickness and accident insurance which supplements Health Service privileges.
- (h) **Student Affairs Card.** This card provides a reference file throughout the term, in the Student Affairs Office. Also it shows the current facts on married status and housing.
- (i) **Placement and Graduation Card.** This card strengthens the Placement Service contact with employers in finding positions for graduates, enables the Alumni Office to improve its records, and provides another check on degree candidates for the Registrar's Office.
- (j) **Multiple Directory Cards.** For your convenience we have printed these on "NCR" paper so that with only one careful firm writing you will make copies for the Student Directory, the Dads and Mothers organizations, and the campus religious agencies.
- (k) **News Bureau Card.** This card provides a reference file for preparing news releases.
- (l) **Graduate School Office Card.** This card, filed by graduate students only, provides a reference file for the Graduate Dean.
- (m) **Statistics Card.** On this IBM card we get your current study load, major school or department, and home town. Please check whether your name is shown correctly.
- (n) **Grade Report Mailing Card.** This card insures that your term grade report will be addressed correctly; used in a window envelope it saves a typing job.
- (o) **Fee Card.** This becomes the official ledger card for your registration fees, in the Cashier's Office.
- (p) **Deposit Refund Mailing Card.** This card insures that any refund from your breakage deposit will be addressed correctly.

Please be careful not to fold or damage IBM cards. Also legibility is important.

NEW STUDENTS: Report for your required entrance examinations as scheduled on the back of your Registration Card; later pick up your Placement Test Results Card. Obtain the name of your faculty adviser on Monday or Tuesday (see Step 2). On Tuesday evening meet with your adviser in a group session; make an appointment with him for your individual conference as you continue into the later steps of registration procedure.

Step 2. Build your study program with your adviser. Assignment or confirmation of faculty advisers for all freshmen and sophomores is by card obtained from the Chairman of Lower Division Advisers; during registration week this is done in the Union, later in room 103 Johnson. Assignment for upper division and graduate students is made by the major dean or department head, at his office. Work out a tentative schedule beforehand on the center pages of this book, then come to agreement with your adviser before filling out your cards and securing his signature on your Registration Card. If he wants it, fill out and leave with him the Adviser's Copy from the center of this book (as well as the photocopy of your record).

When: All day on Wednesday (Sept. 23), Thursday, and Friday (adviser may not be available on Saturday morning) of registration week; during posted office hours after classes begin.

Where: Usually in his regular office (refer to the partial list in this book; note the special rooms for Tuesday evening's conferences).

Step 3. Enroll in courses with departments. Fill out an Instructor's Card for each course on your Registration Card, and present it to the appropriate department in exchange for a "receipt" endorsement on your Registration Card. (In case of change before you have paid your fees, the department can cancel this receipt only by adding a second identical endorsement in the "credits" column of your Registration Card.)

When: As soon as possible after step 2.

Where: Department and school offices (see directory on front cover of this book).

VETERANS ON EDUCATIONAL AID: Check at Veterans' Desk in Registrar's Office. Since the V.A. has inflexible rules for certifying your registration, be sure you follow the proper procedure for your particular aid situation at this time.

Step 4. Check through Student Affairs. First in this step is the required filing of your Automobile Data Card, the registering of your car and the optional purchasing of a University-parking-lot permit. Next is the required filing of your Student Optional Insurance Card, and your opportunity to purchase broad sickness and accident insurance. Then file with Student Affairs clerks the information folder (new students) or information sheet (old students), and your Student Affairs Card, Placement and Graduation Card, Directory Cards, and News Bureau Card. Secure the Student Affairs stamp on the back of your Registration Card.

When: As soon as possible after step 3.

Where: The Union ballroom until Saturday of registration week, later at Student Affairs Office in Emerald Hall (except Physical Plant Office for Automobile Data Card).

ALASKA AND HAWAII STUDENTS ASKING WAIVER OF NON-RESIDENT FEE: Secure the necessary form from Student Affairs clerks, fill it out, then file at the next step.

Step 5. Obtain fee assessment from Registrar. Present your remaining cards to Registrar's clerks for checking. They will retain your Student Grade Card and Grade Report Mailing Card (and Graduate School Office Card, if you have one) and will mark your Statistics Card for IBM operations. Your fees will be assessed and Fee Card stamped.

When: As soon as possible after step 4.

Where: The Union ballroom until Saturday, later at Registrar's Office in Emerald Hall.

Step 6. Pay fees to Cashier. Present your remaining cards at the Cashier's fee-payment windows. Retain the receipt and the student-body card you receive, to qualify for later privileges.

When: As soon as possible after step 5; late fees start with the beginning of classes. The Cashier's window hours are 8-12 and 1-4 (on Saturday 8-12 only).

Where: Business Office in Emerald Hall.

Do not delay fee payment; you are not entitled to any student privileges until you have completed registration steps including fee payment. Note deadlines in Academic Calendar.

You are responsible for satisfactorily completing the study program for which you have officially registered. Any change must be authorized officially through the Registrar's Office.

Course Lists

Courses are listed in the same order as in the Catalog, which should be consulted for additional information. Any course in the current Catalog (whether or not listed in this Time Schedule) may be offered in case of sufficient demand, and any course may be withdrawn in case there is not sufficient demand. Course titles have been systematically abbreviated to the length which can be recorded on students' permanent record sheets.

Prerequisites for enrolling in courses are stated in footnotes, with these standard exceptions:

- gG*, graduate credit for certain 400 courses;
- h*, honors privileges;
- i*, instructor's consent;
- N*, no-grade course;
- R*, same number may be repeated without duplication;
- s*, sequence requiring that course be taken from the beginning.

Class meetings normally begin on the hour and continue for fifty minutes. The symbol ** means "to be arranged" by the instructor. If a course includes a quiz or a laboratory section in addition to a classroom section, students must arrange with the department for that assignment also, but it is not needed on the Registration Card.

Academic Regulations

AUTHORITY AND RESPONSIBILITY

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY. Each student is held responsible for knowing and obeying the published rules and regulations of the University. If the University is obliged to make any changes, they will be considered to be effective from the date of their publication. A student is required to be a good citizen of the campus at all times.

ADMINISTRATION. The maintenance of students' academic records is the responsibility of the Registrar's Office; petitions for special action are filed in this office and referred to the Academic Requirements or the Scholastic Deficiency Committee. The administration of students' non-academic interests and the correlation of these with academic situations, and the preparation of petitions to the Scholastic Deficiency Committee, are responsibilities of the Office of Student Affairs. Academic deans and schools are responsible for advising, instructing, and grading students' academic work. These and other University officials are responsible to the President, who derives his authority from the Board of Higher Education and ultimately from the people of the State of Oregon.

ADMISSION

CREDENTIALS AND PROCEDURE. A student is admitted to the University after he has filed the proper documents to establish his satisfactory academic standing; consideration is given also to health and moral character. The required documents include an official Application for Admission and (for undergraduates) complete records of all school work beyond the eighth grade; they should be filed several weeks in advance of the anticipated registration date, and when filed become the permanent property of the University. When these and other credentials such as entrance examination results (see Catalog) have been examined and found satisfactory, a Notice of Admission and further instructions are sent to the applicant. *Entrance is not fully cleared until all required information has been filed and all required examinations and procedures completed; any student's registration may be cancelled if these requirements are not promptly and adequately cleared.*

FRESHMAN STANDING. Graduation from a standard or accredited high school is required for admission as a freshman. An Oregon resident must have a "C"-average high-school record or equivalent. A nonresident must rank in the upper half of his class on the basis of grades or college aptitude (the SAT examination is required).

ADVANCED UNDERGRADUATE STANDING. A student who has registered in any college or university or for any work of comparable level must have earned at least a "C" average on all such grades, for admission to regular standing in the University. If advanced standing amounts to less than 12 term hours, the requirements for freshman standing must be met also. In general, credit may be granted on transfer for all courses taken in accredited higher institutions, evaluated under the academic regulations of the University. Work done in unaccredited institutions can not be approved for undergraduate transfer credit until the student has satisfactorily completed three full terms (about 45 term hours with at least a "C" average) in the University; then he may petition for credit in those University courses which are equivalent to his unaccredited work. Work done in high school under the Advanced Placement Program of the College Entrance Examination Board may be credited immediately.

SPECIAL STUDENT STANDING. A student who lacks the credentials but who can demonstrate by examination the quality indicated above may apply for admission as a special or unclassified student. After the completion of three full terms in the University, a special student who has a satisfactory cumulative record may petition for waiver of entrance deficiencies and for change to regular status; a special student who has not established a satisfactory total record within that time is subject to dismissal from the University.

GRADUATE STANDING. Graduation from an accredited college or university is acceptable for admission to regular graduate standing; provisional graduate standing may be allowed temporarily, if evidence of the degree is satisfactory but records are not yet complete. Graduate standing may be granted to graduates of unaccredited colleges, on petition after the student has completed at least one full term (about 15 term hours) in the University with a good (at least a "B" average) record. Admission to the Graduate School is based on advancement to degree candidacy or a stated high-quality record.

ATTENDANCE WITHOUT ADMISSION. Formal admission is not at present required for attendance in summer sessions of the University. (Credit may not be earned in regular sessions except after the completion of the appropriate admission procedures as described above. Attendance without credit may be permitted on payment of the auditor's fee.)

REGISTRATION AND CLASSIFICATION

PROCEDURE. To register for University work in any term, a student obtains certain prepared documents from the Registrar (having filed adequate advance notice of intent to register). He then consults a faculty member (appointed by his major dean or other authority) who serves as academic adviser and approves his study program. He is accepted by the respective department concerned for enrollment in each of his chosen courses. Finally he is checked by Student Affairs and Registrar's clerks for various purposes, and pays registration fees to the Cashier. Registration is regularly scheduled for New-Student Week preceding the fall term, and for the first day of the winter and spring terms. *Late registration carries a penalty fee, and may not be allowed after Monday of the third week of each term. Detailed dates and instructions are published before each registration period. Each student must register in person, not in proxy or by mail.*

STUDY LOAD. The normal undergraduate study load averages 15 or 16 hours per term. An average graduate study load is about 12 hours per term. Exceptional loads may be carried with the adviser's consent.

CHANGE OF STUDY PROGRAM. Any change from the original term study program filed at registration must be properly endorsed and filed with the Registrar, before it becomes effective and a matter of record. Changes are freely allowed until Monday of the third week of a term. Thereafter any added course registration must be approved by the instructor and by the department head or dean of the instructional department or school. No change card will be accepted after final examinations have started. *No withdrawal from a course is permitted within the last thirty days before term examinations.* Complete withdrawal from the University may be allowed by the Dean of Men or Dean of Women, for good cause.

CHANGE OF MAJOR. A student is classified by the Registrar in the major indicated by the student. (Change of adviser, not also involving change of major, is controlled by the major dean or other authority.)

CLASS STANDING. A regular lower-division student is classified as a freshman until he has earned 36 term hours, then as a sophomore until he has earned 93 term hours. A regular upper-division student is classified as a junior until he has earned 138 term hours, then as a senior until he has completed all requirements for the bachelor's degree. A special student is one temporarily unclassified (see Admission). A graduate student is one who has earned graduate standing (see Admission).

GRADES AND HONORS

GRADING SYSTEM. The quality of a student's achievement in courses is recorded by A, B, C or D for passing work, or F for failing work. A mark of W is recorded for a clear withdrawal permitted after Monday of the third week of a term (no permanent record is made if withdrawal occurs earlier in the term). A temporary mark of I may be recorded if the work was incomplete in some minor yet essential detail but was of passing quality, and the instructor wishes to allow the student more time for completion; this additional time may not extend beyond the third subsequent term in which the student registers. In certain "no-grade" courses only marks of P and N are recorded, for "passing" and "not-passing" work respectively. Grade points are computed on the basis of 4 points for each hour of A, 3 for each hour of B, 2 for each hour of C, 1 for each hour of D, and 0 for each hour of F grade; marks of W, I, P and N are omitted from grade point computations. The grade point average (GPA) is the quotient of total grade points divided by total graded hours; the cumulative grade point average includes all grades earned.

SCHOLARSHIP REGULATIONS. In general, a grade point average below 2.00 is considered unsatisfactory. The Scholastic Deficiency Committee reviews unsatisfactory records and studies all available evidence for the probability of improved scholarship, and then decides in each case whether the student may be allowed to continue or whether he must be disqualified from any subsequent registration in the University. Academic probation normally will be imposed for a cumulative GPA below 2.00 but within the range of tolerance, or a term GPA below 1.50 for a freshman or below 2.00 for any beyond freshman standing. Disqualification normally will be imposed on a student on academic probation if he earns a term GPA below 1.50 as a freshman or below 2.00 with sophomore or higher standing, or on any student whose cumulative record shows too great a deficiency.

HONOR ROLL. An undergraduate who earns a term grade point average of at least 3.50, based on not less than 12 graded hours, is placed on the University honor roll for that term.

SOPHOMORE HONORS. A freshman who ranks in the upper 20 per cent of his entering class (and others by special permission) may elect a program leading toward Sophomore Honors. Through designated or regular courses, or by independent study, he then prepares for four com-

prehensive examinations in basic liberal-arts fields. These examinations are to be taken before the end of the sophomore year and, if passed with distinction, constitute the earning of Sophomore Honors.

DEGREES WITH HONORS. A superior (2.75 GPA) upper-division student may enroll in the special program of independent work leading to the Bachelor of Arts, or the Bachelor of Science, with Honors. His chosen field may embrace one or more departments, as is suitable to his subject. His studies culminate in an examination and may include a thesis. If successful, his baccalaureate diploma is designated "with honors." Honors for graduate degrees are determined by the final examining committee in each case, and these appear on the graduate diplomas.

RECOGNITION FOR SCHOLARSHIP. The Commencement Program lists with "Recognition for Highest Scholarship" those baccalaureate degree candidates who have a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher, and with "Recognition for High Scholarship" those with a cumulative GPA of 3.50-3.74.

CERTIFICATES AND DEGREES

BACHELOR'S DEGREE REQUIREMENTS. During his lower-division years a student should have completed two types of required courses:

Specific Courses (unless excused):

English: 9 term hours in English Composition (Wr 111, 112, 113);

Health Education: 1 term (HE 150 or 250);

Physical Education: 5 terms in activity courses (normally PE 190 for men, PE 180 for women);

Military Science: 6 terms for men (Mil 111, 112, 113, or AS 111, 112, 113; and Mil 211, 212, 213, or AS 211, 212, 213).

(Veterans will be exempted from three terms of Physical Education and six terms of Military Science on filing with the Registrar's Office official documentary evidence of six months active military duty in the U. S. Armed Forces. Credit for military service is limited to work of an academic character completed while in the Armed Forces. Transfer students are exempted from three terms of Military Science if they enter with 36-89 term hours of credit, or exempt from six terms if they enter with 90 or more term hours. Membership in a National Guard or Reserve unit is not an acceptable substitute for the Military Science courses.)

- 36 hours in language and literature courses for the B.A. degree including competence in a foreign language equivalent to 2 years of college work in the language; this may be demonstrated by passing the second-year or higher course, or by examination.
- 36 hours in social science courses, or 36 hours in science courses, for the B.S. degree.

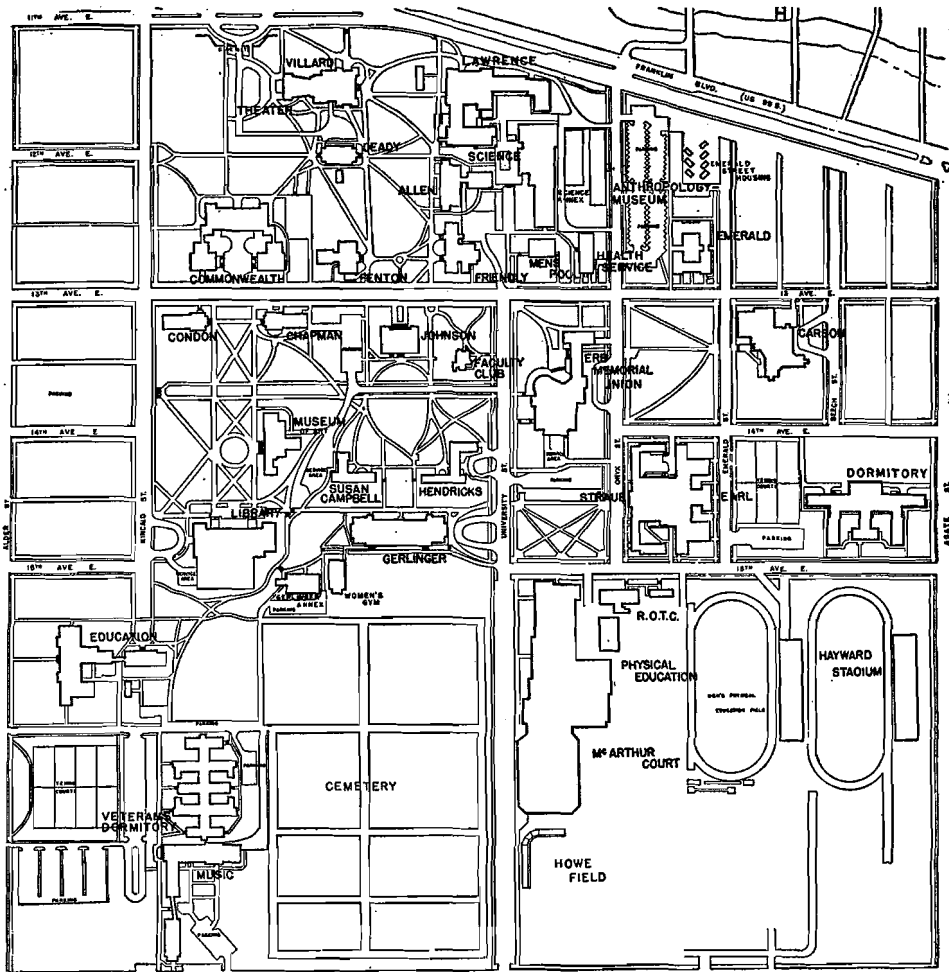
Residence: 45 of the last 60 hours in residence with the University (at present 33 hours from General Extension Division classes may be counted toward this requirement).

Dean's recommendation; certification that the student has satisfied all special requirements in his major. Each student is responsible to his major dean or department head for all major requirements.

ADVANCED DEGREE REQUIREMENTS. In general (see Catalog for detailed differences) a master's degree requires 45 hours of graduate credit (not more than 15 hours of which may be transferred from other schools), with a minimum 3.00 GPA. The academic doctor's degree requires two additional years of study. A student's entire graduate program should be completed within a span of seven years. A graduate student is "advanced to candidacy" for an advanced degree on passing a qualifying examination, usually within the first term or before he has earned 15 hours as a graduate student. His concluding requirement is the passing of the final examination, usually based on his thesis.

APPLICATION FOR DEGREE. A student intending to complete requirements for any degree should file an Application for Degree card with the Registrar several months in advance of the expected commencement date. No student may be granted a degree unless all academic and financial requirements have been satisfied. Degrees are awarded only in June, but a student who has completed all requirements for a degree may be given a certification of that fact at any time to temporarily substitute for the diploma.

TRANSCRIPTS. An official photocopy of a student's academic record earned or credited in the University will be issued on payment of the transcript fee. Photocopies of other documents filed with the Registrar can be furnished also, on payment of a nominal charge for the service.
