

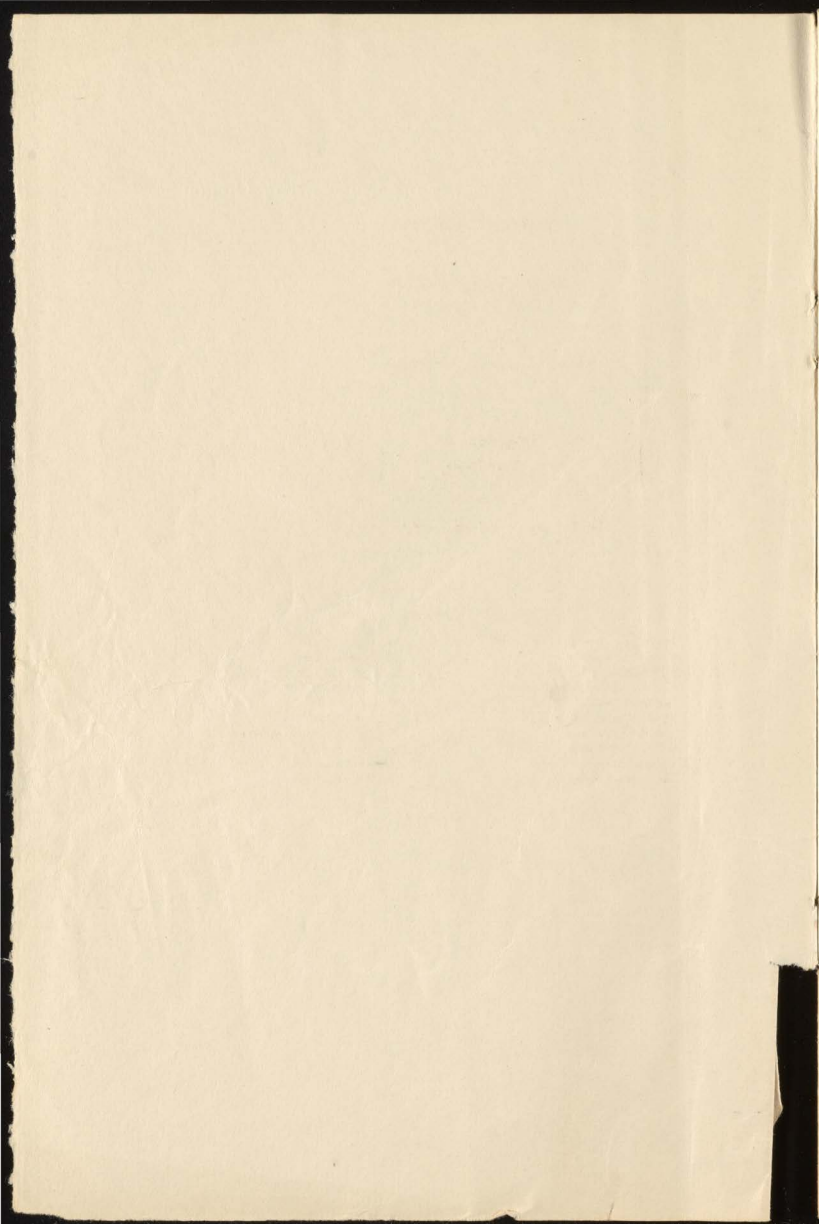

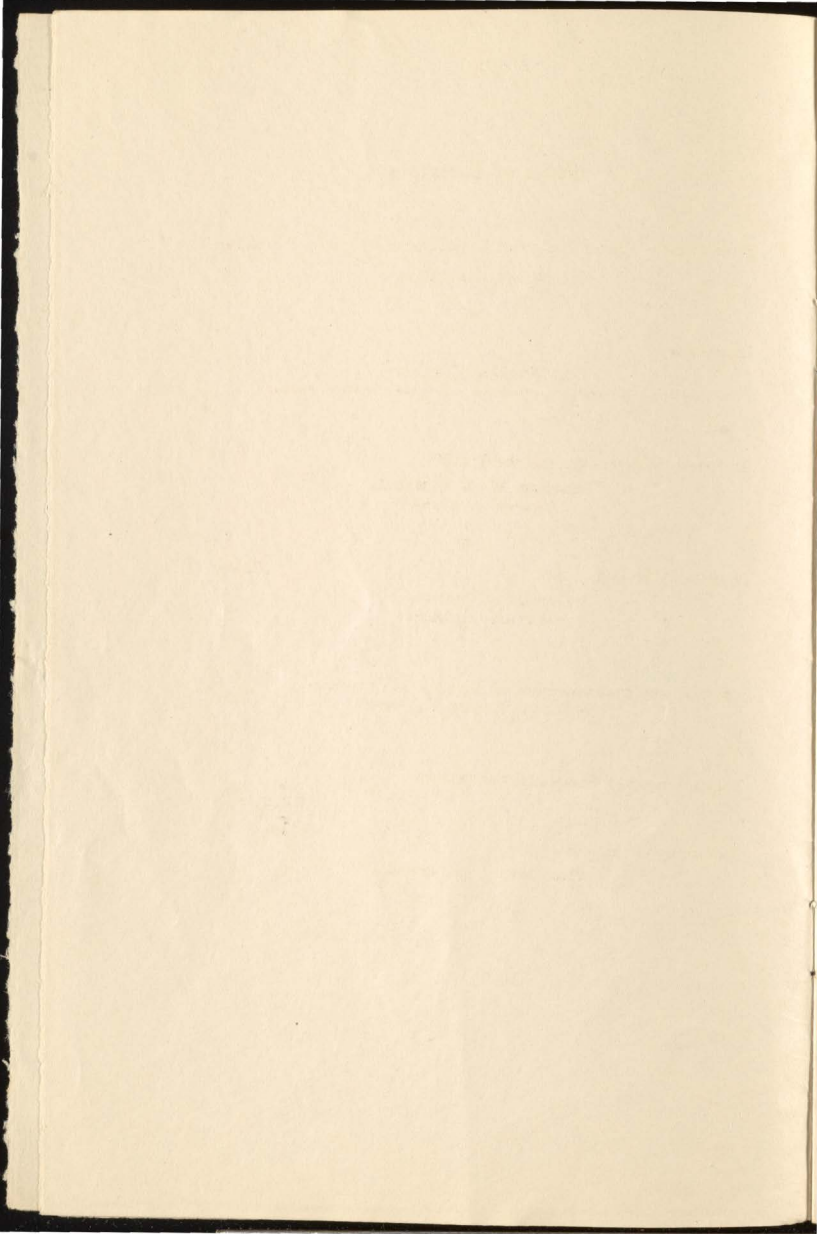

## *Gifts and Pledges Received by the University During the Year 1923-1924*

The President and Board of Regents of the University of Oregon wish publicly to acknowledge their grateful appreciation of the following gifts and pledges that have been received during the past year:

From the Alumni of the University in Portland, including certain bequests, the sum of \$201,765 toward their quota of \$301,600.

From the Alumni of the University in Eugene the sum of \$102,700 toward their quota of that amount.

From other Alumni of the University throughout the country subscriptions sufficient to bring the total of Alumni pledges and gifts to \$421,000.

Three units of the Alumni organization—Alabama, under the leadership of Mrs. Mary Chambers Brockelbank, of the Class of 1917, and Berkeley, California, under the leadership of Walter E. Church, of the Class of 1916, and Eugene, under the leadership of Judge Lawrence T. Harris, of the Class of 1893—have reached the quotas set for their respective districts.

From the students of the University subscriptions totaling \$219,000 for the construction of a Students' Union on the campus.

From the estate of Mr. F. S. Doernbecker \$200,000 for the construction of a children's hospital in Portland.

From the Faculty and general staff of the University subscriptions totaling \$64,297 for various purposes.

From the citizens of Eugene the sum of \$30,873 for providing funds to carry on a campaign for gifts.

From the estate of Mrs. Alice Wrisley \$10,000 for Guarantee Fund for Scholarship Loan Fund.

In the sums noted above are included gifts totaling \$30,000 that donors have requested be used for the erection of a permanent Museum of Fine Arts, together with a gift of \$10,000 from an anonymous donor for the construction of a pipe organ in the new Music Auditorium.

In addition to these immediate gifts and pledges, there have been bequests amounting to more than \$175,000.

Grateful acknowledgement should also be made of many and important gifts of rare volumes to the Library; of very valuable additions to the Murray Warner Memorial Collection by Mrs. Gertrude Bass Warner, including an Art Library of several hundred volumes; and of paintings and other art objects by a great number of donors, among which are a roll of ancient Japanese parchment and books concerning it, given by Mr. and Mrs. A. M. Clarke of Portland.
