300 to 399: upper division courses not acceptable for graduate credit.

400 to 499: upper division courses acceptable for graduate credit for unusual accomplishment.

500 to 599: courses at the graduate level.

REGISTRATION FEES

Payable at the time of registration (or by installments—see calendar for dates) each term.

Undergraduate Fee. Undergraduate students who are residents of Oregon pay a flat registration fee of \$26.50 each term, or \$79.50 a year. This fee includes the regular \$18.00 tuition fee, which entitles the student to register in any school or curriculum without additional charge and provides free use of all institutional facilities and equipment; the health service fee of \$3.50 a term, which provides medical consultation and advice from a competent medical staff; the building fee of \$5.00 a term, which finances certain building projects. (See "Special Fees" for exceptions.)

Graduate Fee. A graduate student is required to pay a registration fee of \$23.50 each term or \$70.50 a year. This entitles the student to enroll in any school or curriculum without additional charge; free use of all institutional facilities and equipment maintained for the benefit of students, and the privileges of the health service. There is no non-resident fee for graduate students. In order to register as a graduate student, a student must be admitted to the graduate division, or have received a bachelor's degree, or have completed all requirements for a bachelor's degree.

Graduate Assistants' and Fellows' Fee. Graduate assistants and fellows pay a registration fee of \$13.50 per term, which entitles the students to the same privileges as regular graduate students. To be eligible for this fee graduate students must devote at least nine hours per week to institutional service, be appointed with the approval of the Graduate School, and be enrolled for not more than ten term hours of academic work.

Part-Time Fee. Any Oregon student, either undergraduate or graduate, registering for six term hours or less may have an option of a reduced rate of \$3.00 per term hour. This fee is payable at the time of registration and extends the permission of class attendance and free use of library, but not any other institutional privileges. (See non-resident fees for part-time fees for out-of-state students.)

Auditor's Fee. An auditor is a person who has obtained permission to attend classes without receiving academic credit. The fee of \$1.00 per term hour entitles him to attend classes but not to enjoy any other institutional privileges.

DEPOSITS

Every student who enrolls for academic credit is required to make a deposit of \$5.00 payable once each year at the time of registration. This is required as protection against loss or damage of institutional property made available for the use of the student.

REFUNDS

For regulations in regard to refunds of student fees and deposit see page 63 of the University Catalogue.

SPECIAL FEES

Payable under the special conditions indicated:

Late Registration Fee \$1.00 to \$5.00
Students registering after the scheduled registration dates of any term pay a late registration fee of \$1.00 for the first day and \$1.00 for each additional day until a maximum charge of \$5.00 is reached. (See year calendar for dates.)

Late Payment Fee, per day \$.25
Students who fail to pay installments of their registration fees when due are charged an additional 25 cents for each day delinquent. If fees and penalties are not paid within one week after dates set for full or partial payments, the student's registration will be canceled.

Change of Program Fee \$1.00
If a student makes any change in his official program after such schedule has been duly approved and accepted by the registrar's office, this charge is made.

Reinstatement Fee \$2.00
If for any reason a student has his registration canceled during a term, but is later allowed to continue his work, the reinstatement fee is charged.

Gymnasium Suit Fee, per term \$2.00
Any student, either graduate or undergraduate, or any faculty member, who is issued a gymnasium suit is required to pay a fee of \$2.00 per term. This provides for a complete gymnasium outfit, except for shoes, and includes laundry service and repairs. (This fee does not apply to students who have paid the former four-year fee and who have not attended 12 terms and who have not received refunds.)

Special Examination Fee, each course \$2.00
If a student is granted the privilege of taking an examination for advanced credit or other special examination, this fee is charged.

Transcript Fee \$1.00
A fee of \$1.00 is charged for each transcript issued after the first, which is issued free of charge.

Graduation Fee \$6.50
A graduation fee of \$6.50 is paid for each degree taken.

Non-Resident Fee. All regular undergraduate students at the University who are not residents of Oregon pay a non-resident fee of \$50.00 a term or \$150.00 a year in addition to the fees paid by Oregon residents (see Regulations governing Non-Resident Tuition). Part-time non-resident students registering for six term hours of work or less pay in addition to the registration fee, a non-resident fee of \$3.12½ per term hour. The non-resident fee is payable on or before the date of the second installment of registration fees. (See calendar for dates.)

Special Course Fees. Additional fees are charged for instruction in applied music, payable not later than the last day for payments of the second installment of registration fees. After that date the regular late payment fee is charged.
