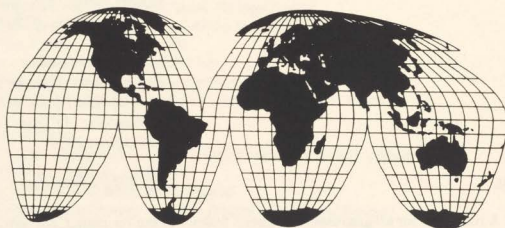

The International Studies Program (ISP) receives necessary additional support from two funds managed by the University of Oregon Foundation.

The *Clarence E. Thurber Fellowship in International Studies* honors the first director of the ISP. Dr. Thurber was a distinguished professor in political science and international studies. This endowment provides a small scholarship to a new graduate student in our program who would especially benefit from additional financial support. The fund is perpetual, and money earned in interest provides the scholarship.

The *International Studies General Fund* is for support of ISP activities and work that cannot be paid for using higher education funds allocated by the State of Oregon. Examples of this are support to graduate students participating in professional meetings; receptions for new undergraduate majors; a potluck for new and returning graduate students at the beginning of fall term; refreshments for meetings of our faculty advisory group, the University Committee on International Studies; and modest contributions to the cost of bringing special speakers to the University of Oregon who are relevant to the mission of the ISP.
