University Commencement Ceremony

The ceremony begins at 12:30 p.m. Saturday, June 14, in McArthur Court. It ends about 2:30 p.m.

In case of rain, all other ceremonies are held indoors (see table), and the switch to rain locations is announced on local radio and TV stations beginning at 6:00 a.m. on Saturday.

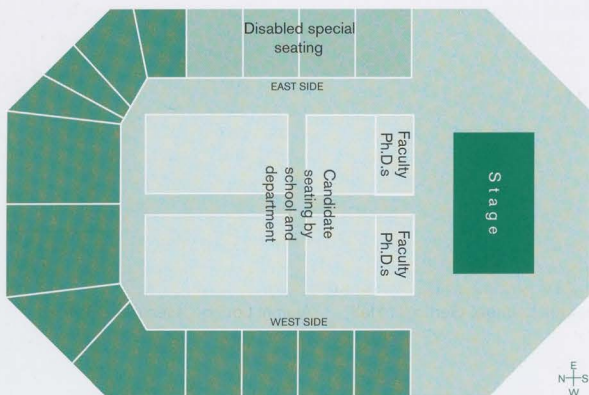
You may attend and participate in the university ceremony whether or not you are graduating. However, if you have not filed for a degree, your name will not appear in the program.

Assembly

Candidates should assemble at the south end of the covered tennis courts no later than noon. Graduates should assemble by college or school and, for the College of Arts and Sciences, by department.

Doctoral Candidates

A card with your name and your adviser's name will be handed out in the assembly area. Please make certain you have a card before the procession begins.

Procession

Faculty marshals and banner and sign carriers will assemble and lead each group of candidates to its appropriate section. Please remain standing until President Dave Frohnmayer asks you to be seated.

Conferral of Degrees

Doctoral Candidates

Please stand when requested by Dean Richard Linton, and remain standing during the conferral of degrees. When you are asked to, come forward to be formally hooded; then hand your name card to the reader. Cross the platform to receive greetings from President Frohnmayer and your diploma cover from Provost John Moseley. Return to your chair and be seated.

Master's Candidates

Please stand when requested by Dean Linton, and remain standing during the conferral of degrees. Following the conferral, you will be asked to sit. Individual recognition is given at the college, school, and department ceremonies.

Bachelor's Candidates

Please stand when requested by the dean of your school or college, and remain standing until all candidates have been called upon and the degrees conferred. Once your degree has been conferred, move your tassel from right to left. Individual recognition is given at the college, school, and department ceremonies.

Recession

The recession marks the conclusion of the university commencement ceremony. President Frohnmayer asks the graduates to recess to smaller ceremonies following the university ceremony. You will be dismissed row by row.

Congratulations to you and your family and friends on the eve of your graduation. We invite all of you to join us for Commencement—a day of celebration that binds our community together.

The university ceremony for all degree candidates is on Saturday, June 14, in McArthur Court. Colleges, schools, and some departments also host individual ceremonies to honor their graduates. Most of these ceremonies are on the same day as the university ceremony. See the table for specific dates, times, and locations.

The following information will help you and your guests prepare for Commencement. Please share it with them.

General Information

Disability Services

Seating is available for guests with special mobility needs.

At the university ceremony, wheelchair seating on the east side of McArthur Court is accessible from the entrances on University Street. A sign-language interpreter will be present. We recommend that guests with impaired hearing sit in the first few rows of the southwest stands closest to the platform.

Tickets

Tickets are not required for the university main ceremony. Those who arrive early have the best choice of seating. Doors to McArthur Court will open at 10:30 a.m.

Diplomas

Although degrees are conferred at Commencement, please remember that diplomas are not handed out at the time of the ceremony. They are mailed to the address given on the Application for Degree form ten to twelve weeks after graduation. All work necessary for the degree must be on file in the Office of the Registrar on or before June 27, 2003, to receive a spring degree.

Academic Regalia

Degree candidates are encouraged to wear regalia (gowns, caps, and tassels; as well as hoods for doctoral and master's degree candidates). Regalia, including honor cords for those graduating with honors, and announcements are available at the Information Center, main floor, UO Bookstore, (541) 346-4331. The deadline to place a rental order is Friday, May 16. Bachelor's degree candidates must purchase their regalia by May 16.

The following prices are for rental or purchase and include payment for a diploma cover:

- Doctoral candidates \$65 (rental)
- Master's candidates \$58 (rental)
- Bachelor's candidates \$40 (purchase)

For your convenience, the UO Bookstore will be open Saturday, June 14, from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and Sunday, June 15, from noon to 6:00 p.m.

On Commencement Day, information booths will be staffed at East 18th Avenue and University Street, East 15th Avenue and Agate Street, East 15th Avenue and University Street, and East 13th Avenue and Agate Street.

For your guests' convenience, tour maps of the UO campus will be available at the information desk on the first floor of Oregon Hall until 5:00 p.m. Friday, June 13. On Saturday, please ask for maps at the Erb Memorial Union scheduling and information desk, east concourse, or at one of the outdoor information booths.

Parking on campus during Commencement is limited. Please direct your guests to the lots closest to your individual ceremony. Parking meters at the edges of the campus will be covered with green or yellow bags that indicate free parking for the day.

Special Notes

Please remember that alcoholic beverages detract from the dignity of the ceremony. They are not allowed in McArthur Court or at any of the department, school, or college ceremonies.

Flowers will be available for purchase at several locations.
