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REGISTRATION PROCEDURE (EMU Ballroom)

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

1. Report to 150 Science on day of your appointment for registration.
2. You will be provided with a packet envelope which includes information about the University of Oregon and your registration material.
3. Registration envelope will include:
 - A. Registration Form—Parts A and B
 - B. Fee Card
 - C. Registration Certificate
 - D. Student Health Insurance Card
 - E. Off-Campus Address Form
4. After General meeting in 150 Science, go to the second floor of the Erb Memorial Union.
5. Individual Advising in Rooms 213, 214, 215, and 216 of the Erb Memorial Union. Plan your Fall Term program of study with your adviser and secure his signature. Complete your planned course schedule on page 31 and retain for your records.
6. Go to the stage at the south end of the ballroom for your identification photograph (I.D.).
7. Secure a lap board and a #2 pencil at the south entrance of the ballroom.
 - A. Study instructions Part A of the Registration Form and complete Part A only.
 - B. Check "Closed and Added Section Board," then fill in course selections at this time.
 1. It is recommended, where multi-section courses are to be selected, that you record all data pertaining to the course on the Registration Form with the exception of the Term Line Number (TLN) entry. Gain departmental approval for single section courses first and multi-section courses last.
 2. If the section you select has a single (+) printed after the days listed for the course, please enroll in one of the Lab or Discussion sections which follow the lecture.
 3. Proceed to departmental tables and obtain department stamp for each course you wish to enroll in.
8. Return to the writing area and complete Part B of the Registration Form, gridding all information requested.
 - A. **PLEASE NOTE:** It is important that Part B be completed in absolute accord (accurately) including credits and grade option. As you will note, the TLN (Term Line Number) is the official control on this document. This section (Part B) represents your official registration for classes.
 1. Double check your TLN gridding to insure your registration in each course.

NOTE: The first horizontal line in the grid area is "O."
 - B. Grading option will be assumed to be "graded" if it is not marked.
9. Report to the Health Service Station
10. Report to the checkers' stations for final processing of your registration.
 - A. Your Registration Forms will be checked with you.
 - B. Pre-assessed fees will be verified or adjusted as required.

FEE PAYMENT

- A. If you plan to pay fees today notify the checker, who will return your fee card and Certificate of Registration. Proceed to the Business Office in Emerald Hall for payment of fees. The cashier will collect both fees and the Certificate of Registration and issue a temporary receipt. The Certificate of Registration will be returned to you at the time you pick up your I.D. card in the Fall.
- B. If you plan to pay your fees at a later date (by September 5) the checker will collect all of your registration material. Your confirmed program of study will be mailed to you with a statement of fees due for payment on or before September 5, 1972.

To be sure that your courses are reserved for Fall Term, fees must be paid on or before September 5, 1972; unless you have received a notice of financial award.

SPECIAL NOTES:

1. Address:
 - a. If your parent's name and home address is listed incorrectly on Part A of the Registration Form, complete the off-campus form included in your registration envelope.
 - b. If you plan to live off-campus and you know your local address, complete the off-campus section box on Part A form and the off-campus update sheet. If you plan to live on campus, leave your campus address section blank. This section will be completed when you pick up your Certificate of Registration and Identification Card (ID) in the Fall in the lobby of the second floor of the Erb Memorial Union Thursday, September 21, Friday, September 22, and Monday, September 25.
2. Supplemental Registration Forms:

If you have more than ten Term Line Numbers to mark on your Registration Form, obtain a "Supplemental Registration Form" at the Registrar's Table.
3. Veterans Benefits and Selective Service:
 - a. A "Veterans Benefits and Selective Service" station is located in the Registrar's office, 161 Emerald Hall.
 - 1) Veterans Benefits: If you are eligible for educational benefits, you may pick up Application Form 1990. New students may turn in their Veterans Administration Certificate of Eligibility and sign up for the benefits. Returning students may also sign up here.

- 2) All Veterans should notify the Veterans Clerk, 161 Emerald Hall, whenever a change of hours will affect the rate of their educational allowance.
- 3) Selective Service: If you wish the Registrar's Office to notify your draft board of your enrollment status, you may request that a Selective Service Form 109 or 103 be submitted. Otherwise, notification will not be sent to your draft board without your specific request.

Students completely withdrawing from school will be given refunds in accordance with the above schedule. All refunds are calculated from the date the student is officially withdrawn, not from the date of last class attendance. Students reducing their schedule will not be eligible for refunds unless their course load is reduced for reasons beyond their control.

For example: 1. A course is cancelled by the University.

2. The prerequisite or time of a course are incorrectly stated in the Time Schedule thereby causing a conflict with other elements of the student's schedule.

Reduction of course load because of work load or other personal reasons will not qualify as a suitable condition for refund.

Any claim for refund resulting from a reduction of course load must be filed on a "Petition for Refund" available from the Office of the Registrar at the time of the change.

STUDY LOAD

Undergraduate: **Maximum of 21 hours.** Normal load is 15 to 16 hours per term.

FULL-TIME STUDENT STATUS

University officials are asked to determine and certify that you are a full-time student for a variety of purposes. Only U/O courses can be certified by the University.

Courses taken concurrently must be certified by the school concerned except Division of Continuing Education (DCE) courses which are certified by Portland State University. The following is provided as a guide in meeting specific definitions:

COURSE NUMBERS

The alphabetic abbreviation preceding the course number designates the department. The number following the department abbreviation designates the course level. Both should be used in designating a course. Course numbers suggest the level of students for which they are intended as follows:

50-299—Lower Division (freshmen and sophomores)

300-499—Upper Division (juniors and seniors)

500-599—Graduates. Graduates may also take 400-499 courses for graduate credit if the courses are designated with a "G" or "M" (see below).

Course numbers identified by:

"G"—graduate credit

"M"—graduate credit for minors, non-majors

"P"—graduate credit in professional field

"R"—may be repeated for credit

CLASS HOURS

Classes begin on the half hour and close twenty minutes after the hour, from 7:30 a.m. through the noon hour to 5:20 p.m.

Exception: Evening courses (See course listings)

COMPLETE WITHDRAWAL

A student may withdraw completely from the University for good cause upon receiving permission from the Office of Student Services. Tuition refunds will be made in accordance with the Refund Schedule (page 4).

Undergraduate Students

1. Obtain withdrawal forms from a staff member of the Office of Student Services, Room 207, Emerald Hall.
2. Obtain a departmental clearance stamp for each class in which you are enrolled.
3. If you have been awarded any form of financial aid (including Guaranteed Bank Loans), contact the Office of Financial Aid, Room 274, Emerald Hall.
4. If you are enrolled in an Educational Opportunity Program, contact the director of that program.
5. Return all withdrawal forms, and your Certificate of Registration to the Office of Student Services, Room 207, Emerald Hall.

STUDY LOAD

The maximum study load for an undergraduate student is 21 term hours.

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS PETITIONS

The Committee is composed of 6 faculty members and 1 ex officio member appointed by the President upon recommendation of the Committee on Committees. One student member is appointed by the President upon recommendation of ASUO.

The Committee has the responsibility for the administration and interpretation of academic requirements for baccalaureate degrees, and for action on student petitions for exceptions to these requirements and other academic regulations. (It does not have jurisdiction over regulations governing graduate degrees.)

This Committee reviews petitions by students for adding and/or dropping courses after the last day to change courses. Petitions may be obtained from the Office of the Registrar where complete instructions for procedure are given with each petition.

ACADEMIC PROBATION/DISQUALIFICATION POLICIES

The Scholastic Deficiency Committee is composed of 7 faculty members and 4 ex officio members appointed by the President upon recommendation of the Committee on Committees. Two student members are appointed by the President upon recommendation of the ASUO.

The Committee administers, within the framework of faculty legislation, the undergraduate academic standards of the University as they pertain to the level of academic performance and progress toward a degree. When there is evidence of lack of satisfactory progress, the Committee may place a student on academic probation or disqualify him from further attendance at the University. The Committee will exercise this function over the Summer School performance of regularly admitted students as well as performance during the regular academic year.

Academic Warning

Academic warning is given as a courtesy action to advise a student of potential difficulty. Subsequent action is not dependent on receiving a warning notice, nor will a warning become part of the permanent record.

Academic Probation

A student will be placed on Academic Probation whenever any of the following conditions exist:

- 1) An accumulated total of University of Oregon hours of non-passing grades earned since Fall Term 1969 reaches the level specified below:

- 2) If in each of two consecutive terms either of the following conditions exists:

a) six or more hours of N are received.

b) less than 65% of the course work attempted has been completed with credit. (Grades and marks of A, B, C, D, P, F, N, I, and Y are counted as work attempted.)

- 3) Based on the University of Oregon cumulative credit hours earned since Fall Term 1969 for students with Junior classification or above, less than 80% of the course work completed has been passed satisfactorily. (Grades of A, B, C, D, P, F, and N are counted as work completed.) This rule will not apply until a student has accumulated 25 or more credits at the University of Oregon.

- 4) A record at the time of initial admission or re-enrollment which would have caused a student to be placed on warning or probation under current University of Oregon regulations. Notification of such action will be given to the student at the time the action is taken.

A student will be removed from Academic Probation if, during two consecutive terms in residence, he has accumulated at least 24 hours of credit without being disqualified (see rules listed under "Academic Disqualification"). Part-time students (enrolled for less than 12 hours per term) will be removed from academic probation if they have completed 3 consecutive terms in residence with a minimum of 3 credit hours per term.

Academic Disqualification

A student on Academic Probation will be subject to Academic Disqualification whenever any of the following conditions exist:

- 1) An accumulated total of University of Oregon hours of non-passing grades earned since Fall Term 1969 reaches the level specified below:

- 2) In the current term, six or more hours of N are received . . . or less than 75% of the course work ATTEMPTED has been completed with credit,
- 3) Based on the University of Oregon cumulative credit hours earned since Fall Term 1969 for students with Junior classification or above, less than 80% of the course work **completed** has been passed satisfactorily,
- 4) Whenever the academic record is such as to provide persuasive evidence that the University requirements for an undergraduate degree cannot be met within a reasonable period of time.

Reinstatement

Consideration of reinstatement to the University will be acted on by the Committee only after receipt of a formal petition from the student. Each request will be evaluated on individual merit of the case and on supportive evidence provided by the student. All students reinstated will be placed on probation.

The petition for reinstatement will be considered by the Committee contingent upon receipt of grade or mark changes, transcripts, petitions and all supporting documents on file in the Office of the Registrar no later than one month prior to the opening of classes; later receipt of documents will be considered for the subsequent term.

Evaluation Criteria

In determining the number of non passing hours to be counted toward probation/disqualification action, all University of Oregon work completed by students Fall Term 1969 and thereafter will be included.

In all instances, the grades reported to the Registrar within the designated grade reporting period will determine the action of the Committee. The receipt of subsequent changes in grades or marks, or of late grades or marks will be reviewed by the Committee when considering actions for the next term.

4. Residence (U/O Work):

Forty-five of last 60 completed must be taken at U/O—all degrees. (Only U/O work completed in residence through registration at the University or at the Medical School or Dental School, Portland, may be counted toward satisfaction of this requirement. (Course work in Division of Continuing Education may not be counted as residence credit). (For students officially enrolled in the School of Nursing, residence with respect to a degree in nursing may include any work taken in any branch of the State System of Higher Education (including the Division of Continuing Education), provided that (a) the course work is required in the degree program in the School of Nursing and (b) the course work is not concurrently offered by the School of Nursing).

5. Graded Hours (A, B, C, D):

Ninety of which a minimum of 45 credit hours must be earned at the University of Oregon. (As defined A-4)

6. U/O (Satisfactory Work):

Eighty-five per cent of all work graded A, B, C, D, P, F, N (I, X, Y are marks and are not be counted as work completed) completed at the U/O must be passed satisfactorily—all degrees. The U of O does not compute G.P.A.

B. Basic Courses (All Degrees)

Five terms in activity courses (normally MPE 121-199, WPE 121-199, and CPE 121-199, taken before the end of the sophomore year) unless excused.

4. *Group Requirements

To promote breadth of liberal education, all students are required to take work in each of three groups—arts and letters, social sciences, and science—as listed below, in courses number 100-499, **exclusive** of courses numbered 199, 400-410, and Writing 120.

For:

Baccalaureate Degree in the College of Liberal Arts—6 courses of at least 3 hours each taken in each of the three groups—arts and letters, social science, and science—for a total of at least 54 hours.

Baccalaureate Degree in Professional College or School—12 courses of at least 3 hours each for a total of at least 36 hours in arts and letters, social science, and science. At least 3 courses shall be taken in each of the three groups.

C. Specific Requirements

1. B.A. Only—Language and Literature 36 credit hours: including attainment of proficiency in a foreign language equivalent to that attained at the end of two years of college study of the language.

The language requirement for the B.A. degree may be met in any one of the following ways:

- (a) two years (normally 24 term hours) of college work in a foreign language;
- (b) one year of college work at the second-year or higher level, or the final term of any second year course, or any term of a third year or above course; or
- (c) examination, administered by the appropriate department, showing language competence equivalent to that attained at the end of two years of college study. The requirement may not be met by examination after the completion of a student's junior year.

Scores on the Foreign Language exam taken by all incoming freshmen indicate what level the student *might* begin on, not where he *must* begin.

Language and Literature Fields: General Arts and Letters, Classics, and Chinese and Japanese, English, German and Russian, Romance Languages, Speech.

2. B.S. Only—Science 36 credit hours or Social Science 36 credit hours:

Social Science Fields: General Social Science, Anthropology, Economics, History, Home Economics, Philosophy, Political Science, all Geography and Psychology courses not listed under Science, Religious Studies, Sociology.

D. General Limitations

1. Correspondence study: maximum, 60 term hours.
2. Law, medicine, dentistry: maximum, 48 term hours in professional courses toward any degree other than a professional degree.
3. Performance (individual study) in music: maximum for all students except music majors, 12 term hours; maximum for music majors toward the B.A. degree, 24 term hours—of which not more than 12 hours may be taken in the student's freshman and sophomore years.

READING AND STUDY SKILLS

The Reading and Study Skills Center, operating in conjunction with the Counseling Center, provides non-credit classes for students who wish to improve their proficiency in reading, writing, or study skills.

Accelerated Reading introduces methods for improving reading rate, comprehension, and flexibility.

Mini-courses in study skills are short courses which focus on specific needs. Courses include Listening and Note-taking, Concentration, Examinations, Textbook Study, and Vocabulary.

Individualized Instruction provides programs tailored to meet personal needs particularly when the student cannot schedule into other classes. Programs include vocabulary, spelling, writing, textbook study, notetaking and examinations. For students taking standardized tests, we provide timed exercises and reading comprehension examples.

ADDRESS REQUIREMENTS

Each student registering at the University is required to file a home address and a "campus address," if different, for use by University Offices. In an effort to reduce the number of times that an address card must be prepared, students are requested to furnish address information that can be stored in a central address file and distributed by computer printouts to offices requiring them.

1. If your campus or home address are currently included in the central file they will appear on the preprinted registration forms. If correct, no further filing of addresses is required.

2. If one or both of the required addresses are missing or incorrect proceed as follows:

A. Campus Address: If you are living on campus in a University dormitory, private dormitory, Cooperative Fraternity, or Sorority, find your living unit in the listing on Part A of the registration form. Mark its code and your room number (if any) in the appropriate sections.

If you are living off-campus file an "Off-Campus Address Sheet" as described in the next paragraph.

B. Off Campus Address:

1. Obtain a blue "Off Campus Address Update Sheet" for each separate address you must file.

2. In the upper left corner are a group of boxes describing the type of addresses included on the sheet. If the address being reported is your home address only, mark the home address box. If it is also your U of O address, mark this box also. The boxes marked should fully describe the address coded on this single sheet.

3. Each sheet must also have your student body number (Social Security Number) printed and gridded in the "Student Number" block in the lower right corner of the sheet.

4. Each block used must be complete, e.g., when entering your street address in the middle block make certain that the complete street address is gridded.

5. Any data block on the form which is not relevant to the address being submitted may be omitted, e.g., if there is no telephone at this address, the "Telephone No." block can be ignored.

6. Unless you are supplying a name other than your own, e.g., father, do not use the name data block at the top of the page.

7. Each grid area consists of one to three columns alternately shaded and clear, and represents a coding area for one number or letter. There should be one mark only in a single grid area. Each grid area contains all of the part of the following:

To complete the gridding, print the letter or number above the grid area and then mark the corresponding character from one of the three vertical areas immediately below.

8. If your Registration Form Part A shows an incorrect address, you may correct it by filing a new Address Up-date Sheet which includes the address description, your student number (Social Security Number) and only those address data areas which must be modified.

9. When completing the mailing instructions on Part A of registration form for grades and fee deposit refunds, make certain that you have on file, or are filing, addresses matching the ones you have designated.

ADVISING

Every new student must consult with an academic adviser before registering for the first time at the University of Oregon. New students are required to present a program signed by their adviser when their registration materials are checked.

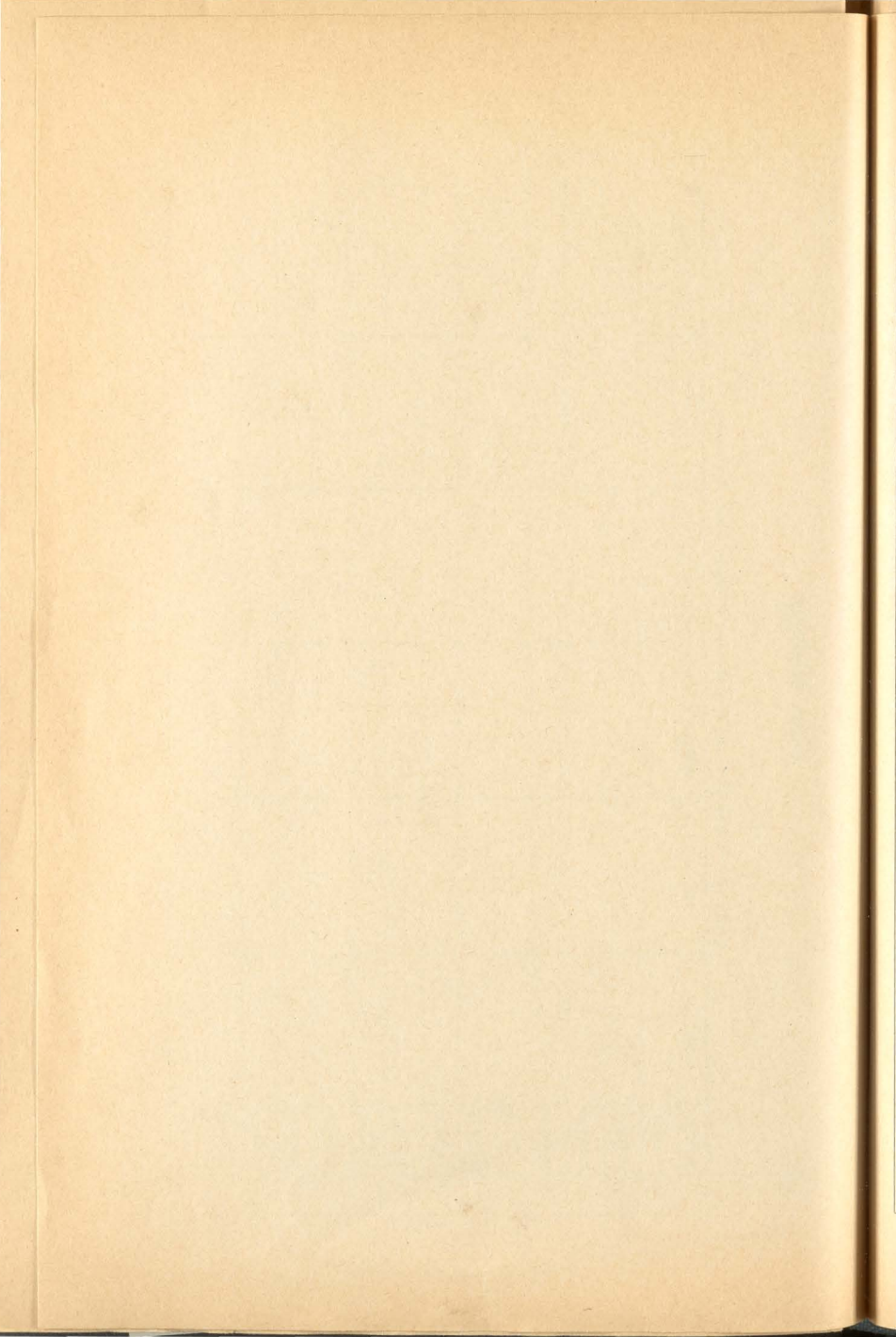

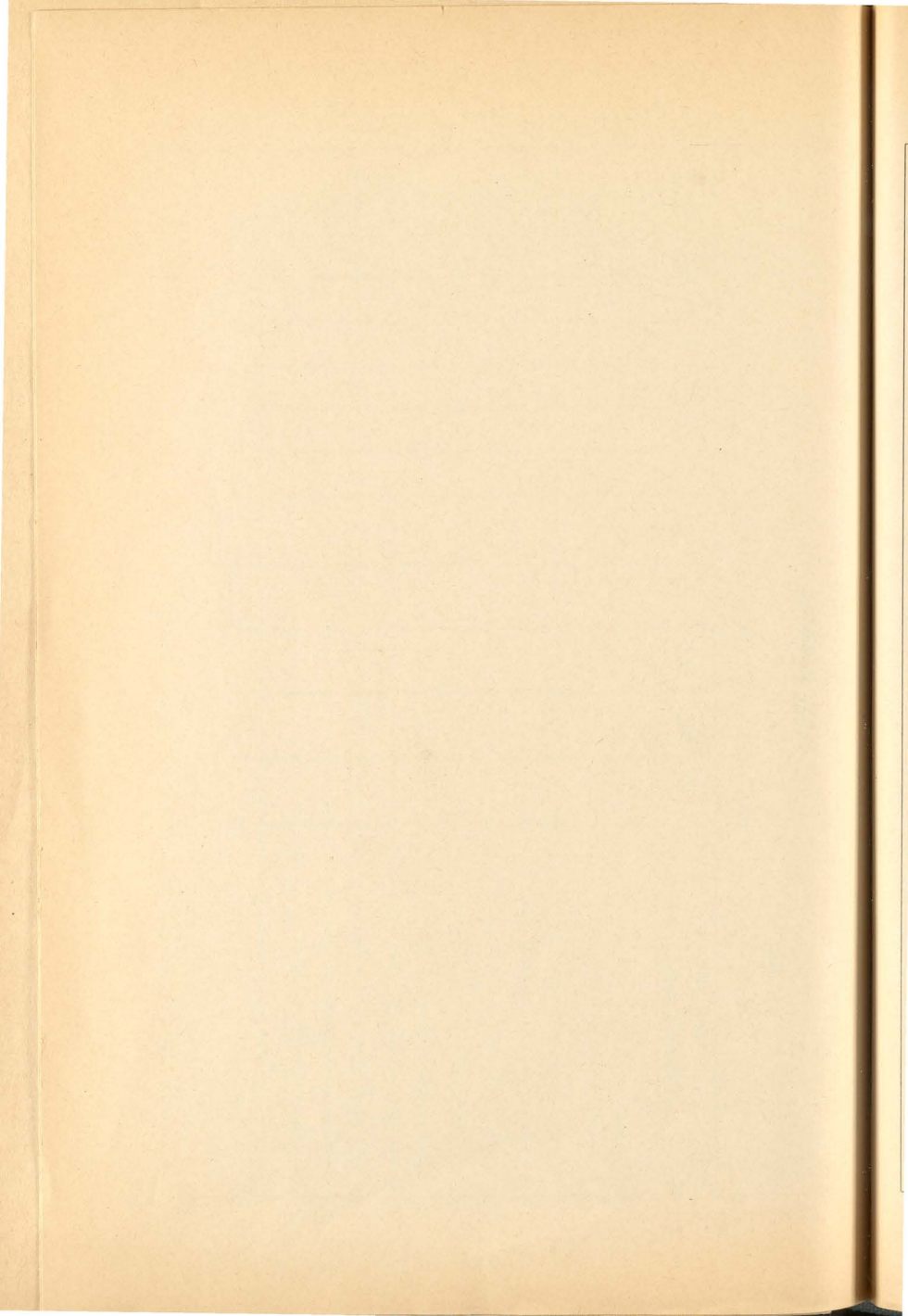

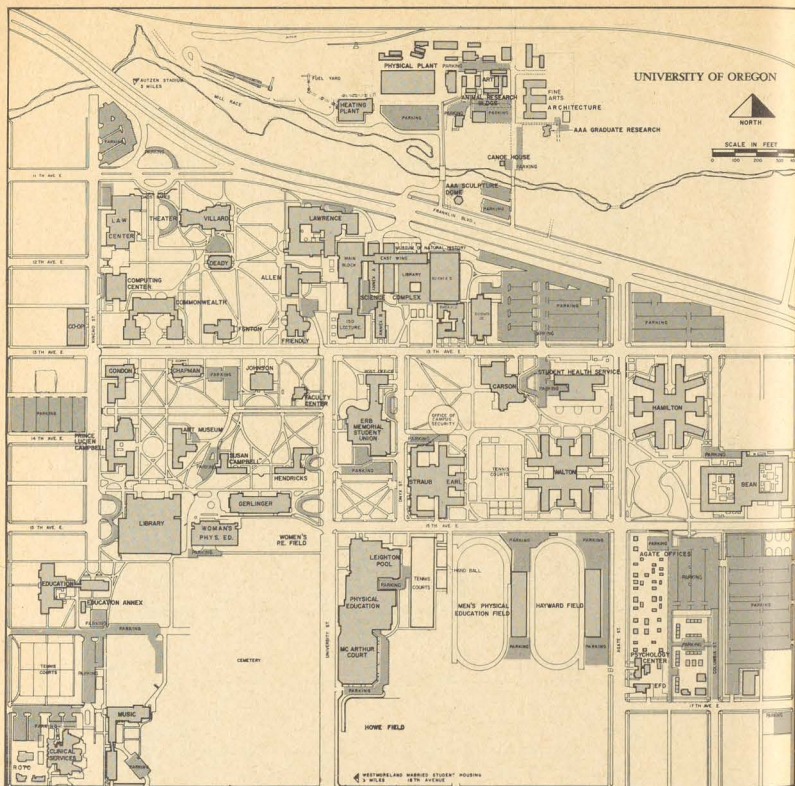
