FEES AND DEPOSITS

Registration fees are to be paid during registration each term. Course and major fees are to be paid during a ten-day period beginning about two weeks after registration each term. They are listed in the Year Schedule of Classes. Dates for paying various fees are shown in the calendar on page 2.

UNDERGRADUATE FEES

Registration fee	\$26.25 per term
This fee covers membership in the A. S. U. O., entitling the student to voting privileges, subscription to the Emerald, free admission to all games, concerts, and lectures under A. S. U. O. management in Eugene; the fee also covers use of the gymnasium, swimming pool, towels, etc., and medical consultation and treatment with the University Health Service (except for a small charge for medicines used).	
Gymnasium suit fee:	
Men	\$12.00
Women	\$10.00
This fee entitles the student to the use of a gymnasium suit during his four-year course, including laundry and repairs. It must be paid before registration can be completed.	
Military deposit	\$5.00 per year
This deposit is made by every student subject to military training, before equipment is issued. It is refunded at the end of the year, in case all equipment is returned in good condition.	
One-course student registration fee	\$10.00 per term
Auditor's fee	\$1.00 per term-hour
Non-resident fee	\$50.00 per term
Degree fee (for each degree)	\$10.00
This fee must be paid at least one month before graduation.	

GRADUATE FEES

Graduate registration fee	\$20.00 per term
Graduate students are exempt from the non-resident fee, but must pay major and course fees. This registration fee covers the A. S. U. O. card, entitling the student to a subscription to the Emerald, free admission to all games, concerts, and lectures under A. S. U. O. management in Eugene; the fee also covers use of the gymnasium, swimming pool, towels, etc., and medical consultation and treatment with the University Health Service (except for a small charge for medicines used).	
Graduate assistant's registration fee	\$11.00 per term
Graduate assistants are exempt from the non-resident fee, but must pay major and course fees. This registration fee covers use of the gymnasium, swimming pool, towels, etc., and medical consultation and treatment with the University Health Service (except for a small charge for medicines used). It does not include the A. S. U. O. card, with attendant privileges.	

PRIVILEGE FEES

Late registration fee	\$2.00 to \$5.00
A student who registers late is charged a late registration fee of \$2.00 for the first day and \$2.00 more for each additional day until a total of \$5.00 is reached. The dates for registration are shown in the calendar on page 2.	
Late payment fee	\$2.00 to \$3.25
A student who pays his course fees late is charged a late payment fee of \$2.00 for the first day and \$.25 more for each additional day up to one week; after that time the student is automatically suspended from the University, but may petition for reinstatement. The dates for payment of course fees are shown in the calendar on page 2.	
Change of course fee	\$1.00
This fee is charged for each petition for change of course, affecting the study program after it has been filed.	
Examination penalty fee	\$5.00
A student who fails to keep his appointment for the entrance Physical, Placement, or English examination is charged this fee for each such examination.	

YEAR SCHEDULE OF CLASSES, 1931-32

Freshman survey and sophomore option courses are listed by groups on the four following pages.

The departments and schools in alphabetical order follow the groups.

Stamp Courses (S.C.) are those requiring the stamp of department sectioning clerks in McArthur Court during registration.

Signifies "to be arranged."

Signifies "registration limited."

Classes begin promptly on the hour and are dismissed at ten minutes before the hour.

NUMBERING SYSTEM FOR COURSES:

1 to 99 are sub-survey or elementary language courses.

100 to 110 are freshman survey courses.

111 to 199 are freshman elective courses.

200 to 210 are sophomore option courses.

211 to 299 are sophomore elective courses.

300 to 399 are upper division courses.

400 to 499 are upper division courses in which graduate students may earn graduate credit by a sufficient amount of extra work.

500 to 599 are graduate courses only.

a,b,c course (e. g., 3a, 3b, 3c) indicates that the last term must be completed before credit is given. Thus credit will be given for one or two or three terms provided these include 3c; but credit will not be given for 3a or 3b alone or together, lacking 3c.

Hyphenated course (e. g., 101-102-103) indicates that it is desirable to take the three terms in succession since they are closely related parts of a year sequence. However, credit will be given for any term from the course.

Course bearing a number unattended by a letter or hyphen indicates a term course more or less a unit in itself, for which credit is given term by term.
