Oswald West, Ex-Governor of Oregon	10 classified scrapbooks on such subjects as direct legislation; road-building; I.W.W.; prison reform; and other important questions of progressive legislation; cartoons and clippings concerning Oregon politics; messages and speeches; letters, photographs and newspapers; original articles, in manuscript or printed; and various other items of historical interest.

The late Colonel Robert A. Miller This collection is partly comprised of the following in approximate numbers: Books, 435; historical and political pamphlets, 220; valuable sets of periodicals, 265 numbers; early Oregon newspapers, including the literary *Hesperian*, complete published in Portland 1883-4, 250; a collection of 1350 post cards chiefly of Pacific Coast interest, from 1900, illustrating such subjects as historic landmarks, mining and logging, boats, bridges, Indians, Alaska, the Philippines, etc.; diaries and memorandum books, 10; scrapbooks, 18; several maps.

The collection also contains important political letters, records of early grange organizations, of Chautauqua at Gladstone; of the organization of Native Sons and Daughters, of the Jackson Club, and Mazama Club; besides many articles and speeches on the Masonic Order in Oregon, Oregon artists and writers, and a number of pertinent personal interviews with early builders of the State, conducted by Colonel Miller over a long period of years.
