Bristow, and S. F. Chadwick.

These important letters, covering closely the period from 1850 to 1864, are chiefly political, but their implications and ramifications go far beyond the local scene into the national arena, especially in respect to the slavery question.

Oswald West, Ex-Governor of Oregon, Portland, Oregon:

The Bonneville Project: six scrapbooks from 1937-40, and 30 or more pamphlets.

Autographed book of poems by "Capt. Jack" (Crawford) with manuscript poem to Oswald West.

Lamerick, Mouth of the Rogue River, 1856; later letters asking the government for pay for service in the Indian wars; scrapbook of many old receipts, deeds, notes, and other items dated in the 1850's and 1860's; photographs and pictures.

Courtesy of Mr. and Mrs. Frank J. Burke, Marshfield, Oregon:

174 photographs dating from 1900-1920.
