The collection includes a wealth of material related to the development of transportation in the Northwest, including books, pamphlets, government documents, maps, scrapbooks of newspaper clippings, etc. The transportation collection provides the University with a rich fund of materials for historical and economic research. The gift also includes Mrs. Teal's large private library of books of travel, history, biography, and belles lettres. These books have been placed in the Browsing Room and general collections of the University Library.

From an anonymous donor, the C. L. Andrews collection of 1,000 photographs taken in Alaska by C. L. Andrews during his forty-year residence in the territory. The subjects include: Alaskan Indians, Eskimos, wild animals and birds, mountains, glaciers, mines, Russian relics and monuments, totem poles, Alaskan towns, etc. Mr. Andrews, who is the author of several books on Alaska and a recognized authority on Alaskan history, has provided full annotations for all photographs.

From Robert W. Sawyer, Bend, Oregon, several filing cases of papers and correspondence relating to the Oregon Highway Commission and the building of Oregon's highways.
