## Schedule and Registration Manual

Summer Quarter

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Art majors consult advisers in Room 102 Art Building.

All other students register in Friendly Hall for the Summer Quarter and First Session.

Students registering in the second session will secure registration material at the Summer Session Office (3 Oregon), and consult their advisers in their offices.

Registration hours: First Session, June 10: 8 to 12 and 1 to 4.  
Second Session, July 19: 9 to 12 and 1 to 3.

Classes may be cancelled in case of insufficient enrollment, or for other unavoidable cause.

### Important Instructions

**Revised Schedule.** This schedule supersedes the catalog of the Summer Quarter as far as hours, places and instructors of classes are concerned. In many departments there are no changes, while in other departments some changes have been necessary. Therefore, be sure to use this schedule in working out your program.

**Housing.** The same rules and regulations regarding housing prevail during the Summer Quarter as during the regular academic year. All undergraduate students must have the approval of the Housing Secretary before their cards will be accepted by the Registrar's Office. The Housing Secretary will have a desk in Friendly Hall on registration day, June 10. Thereafter she will be at her office in Gerlinger hall (Dean of Women's Office.)

**Check All Mathematics Courses.** All students registering for courses in Mathematics should have their cards checked by the adviser for that department.

**Credit for Summer Quarter Courses.** No credit will be given in courses running throughout the Summer Quarter unless the student remains in the class throughout the eleven weeks.

### How to Register

Any undergraduate qualified to carry work may enter the summer quarter or either session without submitting entrance credentials, but in order to become a candidate for a degree, all entrance requirements must be fulfilled.

If you are taking any courses which run throughout the Summer Quarter, you should register at the beginning of the first session for all the courses

you plan to take during the summer. If you are taking only courses which are completed in each session, then you should register for each session at the beginning of each session.

Step 1. Secure registration cards from the table in the lobby of Friendly Hall.

Step 2. Select as adviser from the list on page 3 the person who represents your major department or the department in which you expect to carry the most work. Fill out the registration cards and one class card for each course you are taking. On the registration cards be sure to check in the proper column to indicate whether the course is for the Quarter, the First Session, or the Second Session. Have your adviser sign the study program. (Graduate students must secure the instructors' signatures; undergraduate students simply write in the instructors' names.) Take all cards with you.

Step 3. Secure the other required signature on the Study Program: Undergraduates go to the Housing Secretary (Friendly Hall on registration day, Gerlinger Hall thereafter); graduates working for a degree at the University of Oregon go to window 15, second floor Johnson Hall; graduates not working for a degree go to window 16. Leave Graduate Office card.

Step 4. Take all cards to window 6 in the upper lobby of Johnson Hall. The checkers will retain the class cards.

Step 5. Take registration cards to the adjacent cashier's window (window 3 or 4 of Johnson Hall) and pay your fees. See last page of this leaflet for fee information.

(After registration day, Saturday, June 10, students who have not yet registered should call first at the office of the Director, 3 Oregon Building. Students registering in the second session will secure registration cards at the Summer Session Office, 3 Oregon Building, and then follow the same procedure as indicated above.)

### Gymnasium Fees

Gymnasium and Recreation fee.....	2.00
Entitles students to use of gymnasium, swimming pools, tennis courts, together with gymnasium and swimming suits, lockers, towels, and soap. Required of students enrolled in Physical Education courses using these facilities.	
Fee for occasional use of swimming pool (to be paid to attendant in charge).....	.25
