A lot of the classes I took I can't transfer to a university

Ah, I don't know, nothing maybe up grade some desks, too small

At times there were problems with the technologies- the two way active TV

Attitude of the office help and difficulty finding a counselor.

Driving an hour each way especially in the winter

Finals week

Having to drive an hour (laughter).

Having to go to school every day

Having to go to school I guess, I guess the time spent, there was no worst part about it

Having to leave

Hm, standing in Administrative line, registering and financial aid, it was quite a process.

I can't get my B.S.N. there

I don't like the layout of the campus, it's very inconvenient (p) there was never any parking availability, now there's more, the prices of the tickets for parking were outrageous, I didn't like the fact that the Juniper Hall residents could park wherever they wanted, but people that weren't residents could not park in their area without receiving a ticket, that's about it.

I kept getting sick and had to start over.

Inability to continue

It is not transferable

It took me well over 2 years to do it, because I'm a working individual too, so I had to juggle school and work, that was the worst part

It was only 2 years, a 2 year degree

It wasn't the best program in the world

It's only associate degree, I would want to have more training if I could

Just having to drive from Prineville

Maybe the fact that some of classes aren't transferable to a higher level degree

Needed improvement on? It seemed there were low numbers in my program.

No job placement

Not being able to get a four year degree at the time

Not enough choices for degrees

Not having more classes available when I needed to take them.

Oh gosh I can't think of anything that was the worst part, it was an excellent experience.

Originally it took me 8 years, originally it was the lack of a library facility but now that's been taken care of

Probably class scheduling .(P)...well poor availability of some classes and timing.

Probably just the going to school, the monotony of working at the same time.

Probably the art curriculum wasn't as nice as I would like to have seen it

Probably the campus itself, all the hills, I fell down

Probably the location in the winter time

That it took me four years.

That ones tough, the worst part, I have to say the size of the school, slow processing of financial aide

The advisors are only part time

The biggest deal in my job is patient satisfaction. my satisfaction with because ed center was not good because every time when in there to get anything it was a huge huge hassle. One lady in reception was very rude to me, very informative to me. every time I go in there it has not been good, their public relations needs improvement, it has to do with false information from a person who has control over your transcript.

The campus is very hard if your handicapped. Every term I had to make special arrangements and move the class around to accommodate me which made my uncomfortable

The fact that I had to go, I really don't have a worst part

The lack of availability of some classes, sometimes I wish we could have had them more frequently

The limited class selection

The scheduling of the classes

The seclusive-ness at the time of Bend

The stairs

The worst part is that I have a degree and I need my master's within 6 years or I lose my job but it isn't offered here There wasn't very many bad things about it. I had to get up early in the morning.

They are not as current on medical trends as they could be.

Too many classes required and my advisor took a long time to help

Um I think that there was a subjectivity of many instructors about the spirituality of education. I think that the basic premise was that there is no god so the spirituality was not up for discussion,

Um there wasn't any worst part, the only thing that was lacking in the program was counselors that are knowledgeable about what classes to take, when to take them to graduate in the two-year frame period.

Um, campus location

Um, figuring out financial aid.

Um, probably lack of a usefulness afterwards--just that the courses that I studied really are not applicable today.

Um, probably that some of the classes were just reserved for certain majors, I guess, it was hard to get into EMT classes because it was just designated for, you'd get taken off the list because, certain majors had priority

Um, probably the changes that occurred, major changes, in the time we were enrolled. There were a lot of faculty, old faculty retiring, and new faculty coming aboard and the changes that occurred.

Um, well, I was denied all financial aid, so that is what was hard for me. I had to work and go to school part time. it just made it tough

Um. Um. Maybe. Um It was not such a big variety of classes you could take.

Um.. the English, its hard. it took a long time.

Um...I grew up there so I guess the lack of experimentation (p) not going somewhere different, just staying where I'm at.

Um...I guess just the stress of working and going to school too. (P) that's all

Um...sometimes the classes were not schedule in the way that I could get out in 2 yrs. but that's fine. They did the best they could.

Um...well logistically speaking the lack of parking on campus.

Well I had to commute (p) it was about an hour drive.

Well I wasn't entirely happy with the program, I think it needs to be revamped and I think the head of the department needs to be changed

#### Why were you dissatisfied?

Availability time for classes and I was mis-advised for a year so I lost a year financially and time (P) some classes are only offered in the evening regardless, normally they'll rotate and be in the morning next year and I found one that was not and I cannot take evening classes and it really hurt my schooling

Because I have had no help financially and because I think the massage therapy program is very unorganized and expensive

Because of communication over financial aid.

Because of the way the associate's program for manufacturing was developed. If the person wanted to be a machinist they still had to take welding classes, so it was a waste of a lot of time and money, I continued the program and went through it, and at the last class told me the certificate for welding was optional! And the welding instructor dropped out of the class, so there was no instructor for robotics or welding, so they had to totally reformat the program which meant changing day classes to night, and I was working at night

Because the core engineering classic, the statics dynamics & strengths series was horrible, I've never had such a bad teacher and those are important classes. and I actually took the statics and the dynamics classes but I dropped the strengths class because I couldn't take anymore.

Because they're not very clear about how to get into the program. I always found out at the last minute there were shots required, always found out at the last minute there were prerequisite tests, there was poor counseling on the classes needed to complete the degree.

Because we had the instructor of record quit two days before the class, this is the second year of the program, the paramedic portion, and it's very important and the quality of the instruction is very poor, we've had 9 different instructors of record and no communication between them

Central OR. Uni. Center does not offer enough classes per term to finish in a timely manner.

I feel that the program could give people a better foundation and that some courses could have been taught better I just think that there needs to be more programs and more classes there, they get into the rotational thing, that sometimes a class is offered every two years. So if you miss the class you have to get on a waiting list of maybe 60 people

I just told you, I couldn't do what I wanted to with them. COCC is an excellent college and I'm satisfied with what they are doing there, its just not set up for what I want to do.

I was dissatisfied with the way the classes were scheduled, and that's the #1 reason.

I'm dissatisfied because they don't have a psychology program, I'm limited, and I'm not happy with some of the administration there

Oh I don't know, (p) I mean it's really actually hard to get into (p) Well the nursing program they only accept thirty people, to my understanding, so it's hard to get into, I'm not in the program yet so I'm dissatisfied.

The only thing I am dissatisfied about is the fact that they don't accept enough people. I think they should accept a larger number of people.

The program is not up to speed with the universities

Um, not too much, many, classes to chose from in computer science

Um, teachers were, they just didn't work with students. They were really strict, and they didn't care about the welfare of the students. That doesn't go for all of them, just a few of the teachers that I had.

Um, they're losing their community college atmosphere. they are so intent on making it a 4 year college that they are not meeting the needs of the community as a whole.

Unable to get clear answers and they don't let enough people in. It is extremely competitive. They should simplify the qualifications, they are not taking care of programs already existing yet they are expanding other depts.

When I went in with my credits and talked to Elisha Vick who does the selection process, I was told that with a 3.5 average I "would not get in the program on grades, period". that's her words exactly (p) she said you may get in under random selection, because they do 15 as year on grades and 15 on random selection. (p) basically, with that program in particular, lack of information, lack of support, they have one person choosing who gets in the program and people are killing themselves trying to get in the program, it's not fair

With the paramedic program the teacher quit two days before and they are scrambling to get a teacher and everything is not up to where it should be. (p) We pay a lot for the program and we don't seem to get our money's worth. Our labs are not fulfilling and we don't get what we paid for.

I got my degree (p) Now I got a job!

I got to do it at home

I guess it was the proximity, because I could stay at home and because I could get experience in the classroom and that would help me get a job here.

I guess would be the fact that I could do it quickly

I like the classes it was nice getting to know the teachers

I suppose I could get it here and I didn't do too much traffic.

I think it was the match of the type of teaching strategies that Lewis and Clark offers. (p) uh, it matched my learning style and I thought it prepared me for my job better, challenged me in a way that I wanted to be challenged.

I think the best part was that it was available without leaving Central Oregon

I was able to stay at home (p) Well I am married, we have a ranch, I've had a career, I've done the campus thing, (p) I had a ten year career in research and wanted to teach (p) I didn't have to physically move to go to campus.

I was able to work at the same time I was attending classes.

It really did not have to do with the center, but they accepted all credits transferred.

It was close to home.

It was local

It was, I just came out of high school, it was an inclusive environment which was good

Lewis and Clark was an excellent program and having it offered here was wonderful

A lot of it was distance learning (p) little support system your all on your own pretty much, Correspondence courses are really hard

Because I kept getting sick and had to start over

Because of the isolation you don't get to talk to your professor and classes that last until 10 o clock at night Computer class on CD Roms.

Courses cancelled due tech difficulties

EdNet -- video conferencing, televised classes.

Gosh I can't think of anything, it was a wonderful experience, too bad Lewis and Clark is withdrawing the program from Central Oregon.

Having to travel to La Grande for some of the work

Hmm, it was the, there wasn't enough space for the students in the classroom... it was just too crowded

I didn't really get to pick my classes, I had to take what was offered

I don't know, having to study all weekend every night

I guess it was probably the price and the location of schools for Central Oregonians.

I ought to put this very carefully, um, I felt like a few of the courses were watered down, for example, my federal tax class was through Ed Net and I didn't feel we had enough instructor contact. For the most part I was so thankful to get my degree, but for something like Accounting, that was an important class.

I wasn't able to get to my teachers to clarify things

It was fine

It wasn't the degree I would have normally gotten

Lack of availability of certain classes, in this case I even had to go for some classes in McMinnville

Lack of choices

Lack of communication, having to retake classes, there are numerous amount of problems with the program

Lack of instructors on site

Lack of options classes and degrees

Limited class selection

Limited classes

Not always having the courses available that I needed when I needed to take them.

Not as many classes available as I would have liked

Not being able to attend job fairs

Not being able to reach my teachers when I had a question immediately

Not being to get a class when I needed it.

Not geared toward practicing nurses ...not flexible

Poor quality of education--terrible professors, terrible curriculum

Probably access to research materials and textbooks

Probably EdNet

Probably the Ed Net process, I didn't like that (p) It's just hard to communicate over Ed Net.

Probably, it has nothing to do with the university center, its just that the professors at Eastern were not very fast at getting back to us

Program had faults and the distance learning

Quality of instruction was poor in comparison to COCC.

Some of the teachers were real jerks and you had to take more than one class with them

Teleconferencing

The absolute worst part was a computer course it was because of the instructor.

The amount of travel that was required in some cases

The cost

The Distance Education Classes, we did teleconferencing courses and they weren't very good. (p) The on-sight professors were excellent while the um the Eastern Oregon based Professors were sub-par or below average, in my experience in taking higher education courses. The professionalism from the Eastern Oregon Professors was like taking courses from Tumbleweed U.

The ed-net system

The expense, it was \$8000 for one year

The lack of direct contact with Professors.

The limit of classes offered, what they offered you had to take you didn't really have any choice in what you studied

The limited selection of classes.

The one course taught by an actual COCC professor

The televised classes

The worst part was the time and distance away from my family (p) when I went to Bend I had to stay there for four days.

The year I went through we had to go to eastern for summer school

There wasn't anything bad

There wasn't at the time any choice, it was the only degree offered

Uh, the money I had to spend (p) uh well just the fact that I had to pay my own credit money to get the credential.

Um probably taking all the classes over the satellite, sometimes that got kind of hectic. (p) Um for the teacher program we did a lot of classes over the satellite, (p) distant education program. (p) Um cause sometimes the satellite classes had technical problems, (p) loss of audio or visual, um, sometimes classes got cancelled but no one would tell us in advance so we'd show up at Eastern and no one would be there.

Um, the number of classes offered, there wasn't a large range of classes offered for that degree

Um. well the distance learning thing was hard because sometimes the satellite was down and we had to miss class, and our class work would not be sent on time due to mailing problems.

Um.. it was the distance learning concept.. the Ed net.. there was a lack of feedback and communication w/ professor. not as good as breathing and live in front of you

Um...It required an overwhelming amount of schoolwork while maintaining duties outside the classroom that were also related to the coursework.

Well I guess in my case since I live in madras the distance that I had to travel at the time

Well the worst part was that the base of the university center is in Corvallis and so the distance became a problem at times

Well there were times when classrooms were inappropriate and fixtures unsuitable, there were no overhead projectors or they didn't work. Un-conducive to the activities we tried to do.

What was the worst part, I'd probably say some of the teachers that actually taught the courses, I don't feel that it was the best education I could have gotten.

You don't want to hear my answer (laughter) No, you don't want to hear my answer. (p) I don't feel like I got a very good education my last year. I went to Eastern in La Grand for three years and I went here for my last year and it was a joke (p) in Central Oregon (p) COCC through Eastern. (p) Um...I'm trying to word this tactfully, it was too easy. a lack of effort maybe.

### Why were you dissatisfied?

Administration is horrible, financial aids situation is horrible, don't get recognition for 4 point, they don't know who you are at Eastern University...I think we pay more for our credits off campus. They get face to face attention here on campus, but we as EO students are paying more for headache and paperwork instead.

Again because of lack of personal attention and low quality of curriculum program, an assembly line approach. Because it is a new program and I think it is not really set up for a distance yet and bc it is not really what I wanted to study and I am taking it only bc it is here and it is not very well set up

Because it necessitated a year of student teaching and a minor in education which is something I wasn't interested in. I'm interested in teaching overseas. So none of that matters.

Because the courses that I need for counseling are not offered at the Center; I have to go to the valley.

Because the lack of choices and options that I can take though my degree because they offer the business degree I have to pick the classes from business degree to fit in to my degree.

Because they are cutting the program. Lewis & Clark started a grad program in ed. and they're cutting it, which forces me to go to Portland or Eugene. And if I wanted to live in Portland I'd be in Portland. I want to be in Central Oregon. I love it here. They are cutting it and I'm right in the middle of it. That's the whole reason I'm going to a private university instead of a state university--because they have a program. The state requires a master's in education and there's no place to do it now this side of the mountains,

Because they discontinued it (p) they still have the program but financial aid wouldn't cover it so there was no way I could afford it.

Extremely difficult to coordinate courses through another University through the University Center, and nobody knew what they were doing including counselors, staff and financial aid people. Even the degree course requirements were very unclear to students and staff at Bend (p) COCC and the University Center.

I didn't care for the format of the classes

I don't feel like it was comprehensive, put it this way, I don't feel I got enough feed-back

I don't know that the university center has competent teachers, organization, planning, resource availability, communication between eastern Oregon and the surrounding teachers that are working here at the university center

I feel that it was extremely unorganized and there's constant problems with the classes that I'm taking, for instance a lot of classes that I take require videos and the videos weren't made available until the second week of class which has put me back

I had problem with the instructor.

I think it's a new program and not a lot of my advisers for one, nobody really knows the answers to any questions I need, because nobody knows anything, I had problems with the OSU Distance Education phone line that you had to call, particularly I wouldn't receive my syllabus or my books until 2 or 3 weeks after a term would start. and I think that the classes offered are not as challenging as if you were in the class itself (p) nope

I think they had teachers teaching that were lazy about their subject matter (P) I knew more than they did and that shouldn't be the case, a lot of canned stuff was thrown at you just to say it was done instead of having productive discussions

I thought the quality of instruction was very poor. The ed net classes were inadequate and poorly coordinated. The program was not designed for people with families or who work. As an older student--it's maybe designed for

someone with any other commitments. And the fact that there are 9 classes plus 3 or 4 hours. Class prep and assignments was far too demanding and especially for someone older than forty. Communication with Eastern Oregon was very poor. There were numerous problems with registration. There were so many glitches.

I'm not very impressed with the quality of instruction or the organization of the program. it has not been well organized It was not at the level that I was expecting, it was more at the entry level, it was made more for nurses that had never worked (p) and that did not have clinical experience

Lack of professionalism and organization of admin and instructors

Lewis and Clark pulled their program and there's not place to get the program I need to keep my job this side of the

No local support of the Eastern program at that time, I know that they have changed it since.

Not happy about facilities for research as a graduate student.

One of the things that was not up to snuff as far as I was concerned was you were supposed to be able to do some of the work over the internet and they didn't have that up and running in a timely fashion, I think they didn't get anything going until the middle of October and I was disappointed in it. (p) Also they wanted me to have ten PE credits and I found out later that it's not something I can do through distance learning. (p) I had thought I'd be able to do the health option but I was told I needed to have these PE credits to teach.

Only one class in field and it did not work for working people and their schedules

Poor quality of instruction

Some professor didn't fulfill the expectations of their jobs and I was misinformed on some things

The administration of the program was "liquid," not knowing what they were doing from one student to the next.

The program itself was lacking in content to prepare to me to be a teacher

The quality of instructions was very poor

There is an instructor there who is discriminatory, she would make it very difficult for some students. I left hoping that she would leave as Dean, and that I could continue. She was so discriminatory that it verged on civil rights violation. I did not want to continue because I feared that she commanded the who program and she was discriminatory against people who came from other areas besides Portland. Everyone I know who has gone through the program has had to put up with her treatment of them. If she knew I made these comments it would

They are not offering a class

They discontinued the program.

Um just disorganization (p) um, well the first year that they started it (p) the University Center where I could get my degree at the U of O, nobody at the Financial Aid Office (p) at COCC had any information or knew how the financial aid worked when a student was enrolled at COCC and U of O at the same time. That delayed my getting into the program by one term. Then also, for the Anatomy and Physiology classes, to make it a U of O credit you have to take an extra lab that uses the CD Rom and the CDs were not compatible with COCC computers.

Um, mainly because we just kind of been neglected, they started out making a lot of promises to upgrade the way the program was supposed to operate and they just have never come through, so more specifically like, um they have the capability to run these classes live and they just won't, through live video feed, and they won't. (p) I guess the other is that there is very little commitment from the Professors who have to teach distance learning, to do the most that they can with the program.

Um. How can I put this? Commitment from PSU for a quality program. Or lack of commitment from them. Well because they didn't see the program through the completion...they came up short and left me. they dropped the

ball, it was the pilot program and they pulled out of it.

Well, because it was too frustrating, I was doing a lot of the distance education programs and there was a lot of confusion in getting the wrong assignments, and also with their distance learning office there was bad communication with them, and with the teachers [bad communication?] yeah.

"This survey is ridiculous, asking people who took one class all about their "program" when they didn't even enroll in a program."

[R lives and teaches in Gresham, she took a 1-week course in Bend for her Master's at Lewis and Clark]

Added that she knows there are people in central Oregon who are very interested in special education degrees and she would like to see them continue. [R teaches some classes in the area; was very concerned about the confidentiality of the survey because her answers regarding the criticism of a professor could hurt her professionally & prevent obtaining an important certification.]

Both my children: I wish that the university center could offer courses that my children could take instead of having to go elsewhere; and because of expenses

Central Oregon Community College campus was very unhandy, R attended class in person one time and it was a terrible ordeal to get around on campus, it was one hundred and twenty miles away from home, parking was terrible, trying to get to the room was terrible, although R had gone before, that is why R has taken classes on the internet ever since, she would not go back on the COCC campus.

He said he moved to Klamath Fall, he said he was not sure if Klamath Falls is considered Central OR. He said sometimes people said Klamath Falls is Southern OR. I entered yr. that he moved to Klamath Fall.

I am thrilled that the College, COCC is a very high standard school and personally I think it is tougher than a lot of 4-year schools. Last trimester I took a class up there, and boy, it was tough. I hope they can keep up the high standard.

I could only enroll in a Bachelors program if they offered it here in Central Oregon

I got screwed in the (nursing) program I took classes and the teachers were good but the administrators basically told me one thing and did another and there are several other people that have had this problem(p)they had problems getting my high school transcripts and this problem put me out of the selection program, they said they would put my name in twice next year but I'm in EMS now

I ran out of room for why R dissatisfied with the program. He also sd. it was a waste of time and money for him to take a bunch of welding classes when he wanted to be a machinist.

If we can receive a quality education here instead of relocating it's advantageous to ourself and our community, anything less is really a hardship

Lewis & Clark has an excellent Master's degree program in education and they shouldn't cut it. I believe education is really important and we should have an opportunity to further our education here in Central Oregon.

Lives in Klamath Falls, is taking correspondence courses from Eastern

Lives in southern Oregon and never lived or worked in Central Oregon. He attended one class in Bend, apparently through the Central Oregon University Center (although he did not recognize that name) to finish his certification (not really a program or degree, he explained). The miles he travels to school are from southern Oregon to Eugene to attend the University of Oregon, he said.

R at first said she is attending Eastern Oregon University and asked for a definition of Central Oregon University Center, she had never heard of it. Then her husband overheard her and told her that she is taking courses at Eastern Oregon University through Central Oregon University Center and she was able to continue with the interview, but for a moment we were hung up.

R did not realize that the classes she was taking at Oregon State University or the class she had taken at Eastern Oregon University were through the Central Oregon University Center.

R did not recognize the name Central Oregon University Center but with a lot of probing we determined he attended Lewis and Clark through the extension program as they brought some instructors to a nearby location for some classes.

R did not understand at first what we meant when we referred to Central Oregon University Center. She kept saying she only took one class at COCC and that her program was at Eastern Oregon University, and explained that her last year, she finished the Education Program through EOU but physically at COCC. It required a lot of probing to get answers from her. It was as if she'd never heard of COUC.

R didn't want to divulge age, she's lived in central Oregon all her life though, she had to refuse that question too or we would have figured out how old she is

R explained that after attending Oregon State University through the Central Oregon Community College for a year, she moved to Corvallis to attend OSU directly and work there. R grew up in Central Oregon and wanted to go to a different community. She is currently enrolled in a Bachelor program in Education at OSU and probably will enroll in a Masters program in Education.

- R explained that she didn't enroll in a program at COUC. She got her reading endorsement for her teaching certificate there, but had to take correspondence courses through EOU on an independent study basis. She had received her teaching degree at a 4-year College elsewhere.
- R had never heard of Central Oregon University Center but with probing he realized the courses he is taking at Lewis and Clark is through COUC.
- R had to estimate that she went to the other schools (Lane Community College and the other four year school) for two years because she went part time sometimes.
- R is attending Oregon State University through the World Wide Web. He did not recognize the Central Oregon University Center. R is an administrator at a school but the miles he travels (one hundred fifty) is not to work.
- R is not currently attending at COCC. R did not know what Central Oregon University Center was but she offered that the four year institution that she attended was Eastern Oregon University. R offered that she has a four year degree and is teaching.
- R is not currently attending school. R had to travel about thirty miles to school when she was attending. Although R is teaching, the thirty miles does not reflect the distance she travels to work.
- R is not currently enrolled so the twenty miles he'd travel one way would be if he were enrolled. R is teaching currently, but he did not mean twenty miles to work, because he asked "to the University?".
- R is taking courses at COCC still, she does want to attend a four year College but there is nothing around there, she is just taking music-related courses.
- R is very satisfied with the counselor that she has who is not located at the Central Oregon University Center, she has her own office off campus. R has never had a good experience at the University Center. R has a son who goes to College at COCC, they're terrible. R deals with the admissions office at Eastern University who are helpful and concerned, in contrast with COUC office at COCC.
- R never lived in Central OR. She took 2 classed offered from UO only in summer.
- R offered that "they will \*never\* create a four year degree in Forestry" in Central Oregon, but then said if they did he'd definitely enroll full time.
- R offered that he also attended Oregon State University, Portland State University and Western Oregon University.
- R offered when asked how long she attended another four year institution that she got an endorsement, ESOL (English for Students of Other Languages) at Lewis and Clark located at Madras through "another extension program" which when probed she said it was eighteen units and that "they got a grant to do it". I think this may have also been through Central Oregon University Center?
- R said "when they offer what(the class) I want I'll take it"
- R said he already has a Bachelors degree but if they offered a Masters degree in Education in Central Oregon he'd definitely enroll full time. R said that if he were enrolled currently he'd travel fifty miles to school but he is not enrolled now (he teaches but his answer is not how far he travels to work).
- R said he can take courses from home so he doesn't travel to school. R said that he has other concerns that weren't covered with these questions. The programs that Central Oregon Community College offers through the University Center are good, however, the communication lines between the community College and the university center "are terrible".
- R said he took some classes at Central Oregon Community College only to fulfill some requirements for the program he is enrolled in at Linfield College.
- R said particularly enjoyed Dr. Haley's Biology Class, and loved ART 101 Internet Class through OSU
- R said she did not get financial aid to attend, but that she was reimbursed for her education by her employer.
- R said she graduated from her program at COCC in 1977. R said she is currently enrolled at COCC but has been accepted into COUC for next year.
- R said she is not sure but if she enrolled in a Bachelors or Masters program it would be in Nursing and she would prefer to enroll somewhere else besides in Central Oregon.
- R said she is undecided whether she wants COCC to become a four year College. She said that it is a real controversial subject
- R said that she had taken a form of this survey in printed form at COCC
- R said that she has inquired into the Extension Program but has not enrolled in it yet.
- R sd. his reason for wanting a degree in forestry was involved so he didn't want to go into it, although I told him he could say whatever he wanted
- R teaches at one of the schools (COUC I think)
- R took courses from Chemeketa CC, but wasn't sure if he went through COUC
- R wanted to make comment at end; I have attended the Sylvania Campus, Portland CC, and Quality of COCC is much better than Portland CC
- R was never in a program at COCC, she just took classes there. R also never enrolled at COUC to her knowledge
- R wasn't familiar with the name Central Oregon University Center. R said she completed her coursework and is waiting for her grades to get her certificate, so she considered herself still enrolled. She said sometimes courses were held in Redmond, in which case she travels two miles one way to school, and sometimes classes are held in Bend, in which case she travels twenty miles to school.
- R wasn't familiar with the term "Čentral Oregon University Center". R was thrown off by the term "program" so I probed with Associate of Arts, Bachelor of Arts. R gave her best estimate of what years she attended COCC or started at OSU (COUC). R said she wasn't sure where her job is because she didn't know if Warm Springs is considered in Central Oregon or another part of Oregon.

- R would enroll in a Bachelor's Program if they offered it (she had to enroll in two minors to create a major) plus R would enroll in a Master's Program someday to get her certificate in Teaching, because the State of Oregon requires it in order for teachers to be able to maintain their certificate and continue teaching. R would enroll in both, if offered, because of her interest.
- R: I am Extremely frustrated the Lewis and Clark are moving their program to Portland, the Masters Program.
- R: I feel weird because the survey doesn't allow for comments, I'm a real advocate at Eastern Oregon. I'm able to have a career, family and at two in the morning, I think that what confuses me. Me and a friend take tests. She at COUC and me more locally.
- She confused COCC w/COUC, but she corrected that when I clarified it.
- She had mentioned that she was somewhere between dissatisfied and satisfied w/ COUC but that satisfied because she did what she had to do for the program. Although she says she is enrolled, she hasn't attended the last two terms. Is close to graduation.
- She said she would enroll in a master degree program if it was available.
- She went to Eastern Oregon U., and studied by long distance, didn't travel to school at all. She at first refused that she went to Central Oregon. She didn't move to central OR either. She said she wouldn't enroll in any programs(full or part time) if they are not long distance learning.
- The average student with the Eastern program, I tended to feel a lot like a guinea pig and as things have changed, they change things and tell you at the last minute, or classes that you take that they said you had to take don't count for anything, records get lost, it just needs to be tightened up, I'm glad its here but it's not run very well, but my 2 children I wouldn't encourage them to
- The number of years attending all schools was not necessarily full time, only part time lasting 15 including the first four full time for her BA
- The nursing program and what is going on with it is very Hush-hush, they keep a blanket over it and no one knows what is going on.
- The solution was that the students in the Anatomy and Physiology class took their work home and used Power Point, a program on the computer, and e-mailed their work to the school, and I did not have that (p) Power Point, so I just fell behind in that class. (p) I don't even know if I ever got a grade for the lab. I think I have to take it over because I know they worked on it last year.
- They are not asking helpful questions. They really should address a student forum to really find out what students think. This woman was also taking classes at Linfield through COUC, and was six weeks away from graduating with a bachelor's degree.
- To clarify, R is a pre-major at Central Oregon Community College but was just accepted at Eastern Oregon University. R is currently officially a pre-major but "in a year" she will enroll in the Education program.
