#### Abstract

Note: This is a facsimile of the survey programmed into OSRL's computer-aided telephone interviewing system (CATI). Variable names, interviewer instructions, and answer categories are indicated in CAPITAL letters and are not read aloud. Experimental questions are presented side-by-side. If no respondent answered "don't know" "refuse" or "no answer" to an item, those answer categories were removed to save vertical space.
