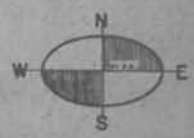
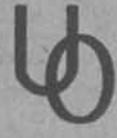

During the academic year, this schedule is rotated to afford students an opportunity to register early one term. You are encouraged to complete your registration on date and time specified. If because of conflict, you are unable to register at time scheduled, you may register any time after your scheduled time.

### Assignment to Classes

Unless specifically exempted in the Notes Column of the time schedule, registration for all courses will be accepted on a first-come-first-served basis. However, acceptance into sections of multi-section courses may be controlled to assist in achieving a balanced enrollment in all sections offered.

Be careful to check the notes of all courses in which you plan to enroll to insure that you meet the requirements

and conditions for enrollment in that class. For example, courses limited to majors frequently require instructor's or departmental permission and are coded I. A course noted as "preference to majors" is open to a limited number of non-majors who meet course prerequisites on a "first-come-first-served" basis.

Most classes will be over-enrolled to take into consideration enrollment reductions because of early withdrawals. If a section or course is listed on the Closed Section Board, you should plan to enroll in an alternate course, since there will be little or no opportunity to add your preferred course at a later date. If, as a graduating senior, you experience difficulty in registering for a course required for graduation see the Registrar's staff for assistance.

Advanced course reservation is limited to courses for majors only and students in the second or third terms

of bonafide sequence courses. If you believe you are eligible for any course reservation, check with the appropriate departmental office in advance of registration.

Departments have been instructed to honor course enrollment requests only upon presentation of a Registration Packet. Packets will be issued to all students at their scheduled time if they are eligible to enroll. If no packet has been prepared for you, go to the Registrar's Table in McArthur court for assistance.

NOTE: The University reserves the right to cancel courses listed in the Time Schedule for which there is insufficient registration to justify their being offered or continued.

## PRIOR TO REGISTRATION

### 1. Student Identification Card (I.D.):

New students who were mailed an embossed identification card with their Notice of Admission are requested to bring this card when reporting for their photograph.

B. Lost I.D. Card: Replacement fee is \$4.00. Instructions for obtaining a replacement are available in 364 Oregon Hall.

C. Cards unfit for use due to normal wear will be replaced without charge to the student.

D. Misuse of Student I.D. is subject to the provisions of the Student Conduct Code.

### 2. University Academic Record:

The Admission Statement and Advanced Standing Reports furnished at the time of admission provide full information on university standing for new students. It should be used as a basis for planning your academic program this term.

### 3. Academic Adviser:

Report to your adviser each term, if needed, to plan your schedule of courses. (See Advising, Page 10, for requirements for NEW UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS)

### 4. Instructors Consent or Variable Credit Courses:

Secure advanced approval where applicable. (See course listings, pages 13 to 97, notes column).

### 5. Planned Course Schedule (Page 112):

Complete your schedule each term and retain it after registration to use as a record of your study program for class attendance. (New undergraduate students may obtain required adviser's signature on this form.)

### 6. PL-3:

"Closed and Added Section" information related to course registration will be telecast over PL-3, Channel 3 or Cable 7, beginning at 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. during registration each term.

## REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

### (McArthur Court)

### 1. Report on day and time specified for issuance of your registration packet. (see Page 3):

#### A. Your registration packet will include:

- 1) Registration Form A and B
- 2) Fee Card
- 3) Registration Certificate
- 4) Student Health Insurance Card (New students only)

### 2. How To Enroll In Classes:

A. Go to North Bleachers, McArthur Court, as illustrated on diagram (cover page), and secure a lap-board. (#2 pencil must be used to fill out registration forms.)

- 1) Check "Closed and Added Section Board."
- 2) Fill in course selections on Part B.
- 3) If a course is selected that has a (+) printed following the days listed for the course, also enroll in the Lab or Discussion section(s) which follows the course entry.
- 4) If a course is selected which has a second time listed for a single TLN, a student must include both times in his schedule, i.e.,

- 5) Proceed to departmental stations and obtain department stamp for each course you wish to enroll in. You may cancel a course registration by securing "Department Stamp" imprint over the "Term Line Number" of the course to be dropped, erase gridding and then grid 9999.
- 6) Return to North Bleachers or writing areas and complete Part B Registration Form, gridding all information requested. *It is important that Part B be completed carefully and accurately.*
- 7) Grading Option—It is important to mark your selected grade option. Your grading option will be assumed "graded" (A, B, C) if not marked.

3. Complete Part A of your registration material.
4. Report to Center Court to obtain clearance from any agencies listed on the top portion of Part A of your Registration material.
5. Report to Checkers Stations in East Court for final processing of your registration.
  - A. Your registration forms will be checked with you.
  - B. Preassessed tuition will be verified or adjusted as required.
    - 1) After tuition assessment, your registration forms will be collected and your Fee Card and Registration Certificate will be returned to you. *You are not considered officially registered until you have paid your tuition.*

#### LATE REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

Students who do not register in McArthur Court during Registration report to the Office of the Registrar to pick up registration packets.

1. Complete Part A, Registration Form.
2. Report to departmental office for approval of courses selected; then complete Part B.
3. Report to Registrar's Office for A and B checking and tuition assessment; 2nd Floor West, Oregon Hall.
4. Report to Cashiers to pay tuition. See "Payment of Tuition" above for locations and hours.

5. To obtain clearance from any agencies listed on the top portion of Part A report to the appropriate department.

#### CHANGES IN REGISTRATION (Undergraduate and Graduate Students)

It is your responsibility to see that you are properly registered. You must initiate and complete all changes in your registration. Changes in registration become effective on the date your "Drop/Add" form is received in the Office of the Registrar. (See "Important Dates," page 6.)

## Auditor

## Nonmatriculant

- General Deposit (against breakage or loss of University property; refundable†) per year (not including Summer Session†\*) ..... 25.00

† The General Deposit, less any deductions which may have been made, is refunded about six weeks after the close of the academic year. Upon petition to the Business Office students who discontinue their work at the University before the end of the year may receive refunds approximately six weeks after the close of the current term. If in any term a student's charges against his General Deposit become excessive he will be required to replenish his deposit in full before he registers a following term.

†\* Students who have their regular academic year \$25.00 General Deposit intact and will be attending Summer Session may, by request at the Business Office, Accounting Department, have \$10.00 transferred to pay their Summer Session General Deposit.

†† Instructional fee determined by maximum course load as shown in schedule.

## REFUND POLICIES

Students completely withdrawing from school will be given refunds in accordance with the Tuition Refund Schedule.

Students whose initial registration load was at or below the maximum for full-time students (21 undergraduate and 16 graduate credit hours) are eligible for a refund for course load reduction to part-time status in accordance with the Tuition Refund Schedule.

Students carrying an overload (22+ undergraduate and 17+ graduate credit hours) are not eligible for refund upon reducing their course load.

All students, regardless of course load, will be eligible for refunds if their course load is reduced for reasons beyond their control.

- For example:
- A course is cancelled by the University.
  - The prerequisite or time of a course is incorrectly stated in the Time Schedule or Time Schedule Supplement thereby causing a conflict with other elements of the student's schedule.

*Any claim for refund must be requested by the student at time of changing course load or in writing during the current term but no later than the close of the following term. Refunds are calculated from the time the student is officially withdrawn, not from the date of last class attendance.*

No refund may be allowed for registration at staff rates nor for Senior Citizens auditing on reduced fees.

Approximately six weeks should be allowed for processing tuition refunds.

### DEFERRED TUITION

#### Deferred Tuition for purposes of Tuition Only:

Students who experience difficulty in meeting payment of tuition at the time of registration may apply for a Deferred Tuition Loan in the amount of 2/3 of academic tuition. Excluded from the deferred tuition plan are board and room, married housing, fines, penalties, program changes, deposits, and other special charges.

#### 1. Eligibility:

- a. Any student assessed full time or part-time undergraduate or graduate tuition will be eligible for a deferred tuition loan.
- b. The student must not have nor have had delinquent University of Oregon accounts.

#### 2. Deferred Tuition Policy:

- a. Tuition will be payable one-third at time of registration, plus general deposit and special fees, with the balance payable in two equal installments.
- b. First and second installments are due on first, or following Monday if due date falls on a weekend, in accordance with the following schedule:

Term	First Installment	Second Installment
Winter	February 1	March 1
Spring	May 1	June 1

- c. A service charge of \$3.00 will be assessed to cover administrative costs. Late charges will be assessed

in the form of interest at the rate of 10% per annum on any past due amounts.

- d. In addition to interest above, all amounts outstanding at the end of the term will be subject to collection charges and attorney fees.
- e. In the event of a withdrawal all refunds will be applied to any outstanding balance and any unpaid balance will be immediately due and payable in full.

#### 3. Steps to Obtain Deferred Tuition Loan:

- a. Pick up all credit cards (NDSL, EOG, Need Grant, etc.) at the scholarship desks (if applicable). (See page 5 for locations.)
- b. Report to the Deferred Tuition table with official plastic I.D. card, Certificate of Registration, assessed tuition card and University of Oregon credit cards.
- c. Upon determination of eligibility the Business Office clerk will compute the amount and issue the promissory note which will be signed by the student. In computing the student's maximum Deferred Tuition eligibility all University of Oregon credit cards will be deducted from tuition assessed. Two-thirds of the balance may be deferred. When extreme student aid needs are revealed, unrestricted credit cards will be exempt from above computations.

If a student paid his tuition in part with a Deferred Tuition Loan prior to the availability of his University of Oregon credit cards and later receives his credit card, this credit will first be applied to the student's Deferred Tuition Note. If in excess of note and service charges, the student will receive the difference in cash. When extreme student aid needs are revealed, unrestricted credit cards will be exempt from above credit application.

- d. Student will be given the Deferred Tuition Loan for presentation to Cashier when paying tuition.

#### 4. Other Student Aid:

Should this Deferred Tuition Loan Program not meet your immediate needs for paying tuition, check with the Office of Student Financial Aid, 270 Oregon Hall, for other possible resources.

- National Direct Student Loans (NDS)** Students receiving NDS loans must have their tuition assessed and sign for their loan at the National Direct Loan table. See table on page 5 for location and time. The NDS credit card may be used to pay student's tuition, but cannot be cashed unless it is used to pay tuition or with presentation of tuition paid receipt.
- Guaranteed Student Loans (G.S.L.)** Students receiving G.S.L. checks must have their tuition assessed before signing for their loans at the Office of Student Financial Aid, Room 270, Oregon Hall.

These checks can be used for tuition payments. (Students enrolled and using proceeds from a Guaranteed or Federally Insured loan and who withdraw may have any refund to which they are entitled sent to their lender to be applied as a credit against their loan principal. If a student wishes to exercise this option such a request must be made at the Office of Student Financial Aid at the time of withdrawal.)

- Credit cards—Scholarships and Grants (including foreign students)**
  - These awards will be at the Scholarship table. See table on page 5 for location and times.

Advising will be available for most students with early registration periods after the meeting and for others, directions for obtaining your permanent adviser will be given at the meeting. The name on your admission statement is the advising coordinator for your department and in most cases will not be your permanent faculty adviser. Representatives from all offices serving students will be available at the meeting to answer your questions about the University.

Every new undergraduate student (freshman or transfer) must consult with an academic adviser before registering for the first time at the University. *New students are required to present a program signed by their adviser when their registration materials are checked.* If you miss the evening orientation meeting, you should report on Monday, January 5, to the office indicated in the "Advising Coordinators" list below. Those who have not yet chosen a major (Liberal Arts Undeclared) should report to the Office of Academic Advising, 107 Friendly Hall.

Students in Elementary Education report to the School of Education Office listed. Secondary Education students are advised in their intended academic department. Honors College students report to the Honors College for assignment to an adviser. Continuing or re-enrolling students should go directly to their assigned adviser if they wish to discuss their programs.

The Office of Academic Advising staff will be available in McArthur Court to assist anyone having difficulty during registration. Also, the students may come to the Office of Academic Advising, 107 Friendly, or call EXT 3045 if they have further questions concerning academic problems.

\* A student completing an advanced degree must obtain authorization to continue the following term in a graduate program. This is accomplished by the student's submission of a "Permission to Re-register" form via your Major Department.

*Note 1.* University of Oregon bachelor degree recipients who are continuing must complete and receive formal admission to Graduate School to insure a registration packet. (See Table above.)

*Note 2.* Since the graduate program is under an enrollment limitation, it is the students' responsibility to inform the Graduate School and appropriate departments of their intentions to attend school Fall Term, by filing an "Intent to Re-Enroll" form with the Graduate School.

*Note 3.* Graduate students admitted for Summer Session, who intend to re-enroll Fall Term, must submit an "Intent to Re-Enroll" form with the Graduate School. Those who were not admitted to an advanced degree program but attended Summer and desire to continue Fall Term must submit an application to their Major Department for graduate admission to obtain registration material.

*Note 4.* If for any reason your registration has been interrupted for a term or more and not covered by authorized leave, you must be re-admitted by submission of the "Permission to Re-register" form to your Major Department one month prior to the beginning of the term you plan to attend.

## ADDRESS REQUIREMENTS

Each student registering at the University is required to file a home address and a "campus address" if different. In an effort to reduce the number of times that an address card must be prepared, students are requested to furnish address information that can be stored centrally.

1. If your campus or home address is currently included in the central file they will appear on the preprinted registration forms. If correct, no further filing of addresses is required.

2. If one or both of the required addresses are missing or incorrect proceed as follows:

A. Campus Address: If you are living on campus in a University dormitory, private dormitory, Cooperative, Fraternity, or Sorority, find your living unit in the listing on Part A of the registration form. Mark its code and your room number (if any) in the appropriate sections.

If you are living off-campus file an "Off-Campus Address Sheet" as described in the next paragraph.

B. Off Campus Address:

1. Obtain an "Off Campus Address Update Sheet" for each separate address you must file.

2. In the upper left corner are a group of boxes describing the type of addresses included on the sheet. If the address being reported is your home address only, mark the home address box. If it is also your U of O address, mark this box also. The boxes marked should fully describe the address coded on this single sheet.

3. Each sheet must also have your student body number (Social Security Number) printed and gridded in the "Student Number" block in the lower right corner of the sheet.

4. Each block used must be complete, e.g., when entering your street address in the middle block make certain that the complete address is gridded.

5. Any data block on the form which is not relevant to the address being submitted may be omitted, e.g., if there is no telephone at this address, the "Telephone No." block can be ignored.

6. Each grid area consists of one to three columns alternately shaded and clear, and represents a coding area for one number or letter. There should be one mark only in a single grid area. Each grid area contains all or part of the following:

To complete the gridding, print the letter or number above the grid area and then mark the corresponding character from one of the three vertical areas immediately below.

7. If your Registration Form Part I shows an incorrect address, you may correct it by filing a new Address Update Sheet which includes the address description, your student number (Social Security Number) and only those address data areas which must be modified.

8. When completing the mailing instructions on Part A of registration form for grades and fee deposit refunds, make certain that you have on file, or are filing, addresses matching the ones you have designated.

#### STUDY LOAD

Undergraduate: Maximum of 21 credit hours. Normal load is 15 to 16 hours per term. Exceptions to the 21 hour maximum may be granted with the approval of the Head Advisor of the major department up to 24 hours. Enrollment in excess of 24 hours must be by petition to the Academic Requirements Committee. Additional fees are assessed for credit exceeding 21 hours. Students who have been placed on academic warning or probation will be limited to 18 credit hours per term. Enrollment in excess of 18 term hours must be by petition to the Academic Requirements Committee.

Graduate: Minimum 3 hours. No stated maximum (except GTFs) but added fees for hours exceeding 16. (GTFs see Registration Fees, page 7, for maximum course load). However, specific restrictions may be established by major departments or by financial award.

#### FULL-TIME STATUS

University officials are asked to determine and certify that you are a full-time student for a variety of purposes. Only U/O courses can be certified by the University. Courses taken concurrently must be certified by the school concerned. The following is provided as a guide in meeting specific definitions:

## COURSE NUMBERS

The alphabetic abbreviation preceding the course number designates the department. The number following the department abbreviation designates the course level. Both should be used in designating a course. Course numbers suggest the level of students for which they are intended as follows:

- 50-299—Lower Division (freshmen and sophomores)
- 300-499—Upper Division (juniors and seniors)
- 500-599—Graduates. Graduates may also take 400-499 courses for graduate credit if the courses are designated with a "G" or "M" (see below).

- "M"—graduate credit for minors, non-majors
- "P"—graduate credit in professional field
- "R"—may be repeated for credit

## CLASS HOURS

Classes on Monday, Wednesday, Friday begin on the half hour and close twenty minutes after the hour, from 07:30 a.m. through the noon hour to 5:20 p.m. Classes on Tuesday, Thursday and evening classes begin on the hour and also on the half hour and close ten minutes before or twenty minutes after the hour.

## COMPLETE WITHDRAWAL

A student may withdraw completely from the University for good cause upon receiving approval from the Office of Student Services. Tuition refunds will be made in accordance with the Refund Schedule, page 6.

## ACADEMIC WARNING, PROBATION, DISQUALIFICATION, REINSTATEMENT POLICIES

The Scholastic Deficiency Committee is composed of 7 faculty members and 4 ex officio members appointed by the President upon recommendation of the Committee on Committees. Two student members are appointed by the President upon recommendation of the ASUO.

The Committee administers, within the framework of faculty legislation, the undergraduate academic standards of the University as they pertain to the level of academic performance and progress toward a degree. When there is evidence of lack of satisfactory progress, the Committee may place a student on academic probation or disqualification from further attendance at the University. The Committee will exercise this function over Summer School performance as well as performance during the regular academic year.

### 1. ACADEMIC WARNING

Academic warning is given as a courtesy action to advise a student of potential difficulty. Subsequent action is not dependent on receiving a warning notice, nor will a warning become part of the permanent record.

A student who is not on Academic Probation will be given a warning whenever any of the following conditions exist:

- a. An accumulated total of University of Oregon hours of non-passing grades earned since Fall Term 1969 reaches the level specified below:

- b. six or more hours of N are received for the term
- c. less than 65% of the course work attempted for the term has been completed with credit. (Grades and marks of A, B, C, D, P, N, I, and Y are counted as work attempted.)

Students given academic warning will be limited to a study load of 18 hours.

### 2. ACADEMIC PROBATION

A student will be placed on Academic Probation whenever any of the following conditions exist:

- a. An accumulated total of University of Oregon hours of non-passing grades earned since Fall Term 1969 reaches the level specified below:

- b. If in each of two consecutive terms either of the following conditions exist:
  - a) six or more hours of N are received.
  - b) less than 65% of the course work attempted has been completed with credit. (Grades and marks of A, B, C, D, P, F, N, I, and Y are counted as work attempted.)
- c. Based on the University of Oregon cumulative credit hours earned since Fall Term 1969 for student with Junior Classification or above, less than 80% of the course work completed has been passed satisfactorily. (Grades of A, B, C, D, P, F, and N are counted as work completed.) This rule will not apply until a student has accumulated 25 or more credit hours at the University of Oregon.
- d. A record at the time of initial admission or re-enrollment which would have caused a student to be placed on warning or probation under current University of Oregon regulations. Notification of such action will be given to the student at the time the action is taken.

Students placed on Academic Probation will be limited to a study load of 18 hours.

A student will be removed from Academic Probation if, during two consecutive terms in residence, at least 24 hours of credit has been accumulated without disqualification and satisfies all conditions for removal (see rules listed under "Academic Disqualifica-

tion"). Part-time students (enrolled for at least 3 hours but less than 12 hours per term) will be removed from Academic Probation if they have satisfactorily completed three consecutive terms in residence with a minimum of 3 credit hours per term. Enrollment for less than 3 hours will not be considered in determining the sequential enrollment pattern for establishing eligibility for removal from probation.

### 3. ACADEMIC DISQUALIFICATION

A student on Academic Probation will be subject to Academic Disqualification whenever any of the following conditions exist:

- a. An accumulated total of University of Oregon hours of non-passing grades earned since Fall Term 1969 reaches the level specified below:

- b. In the current term, six or more hours of N are received . . . or less than 75% of the course work ATTEMPTED has been completed with credit.
- c. Based on the University of Oregon cumulative credit hours earned since Fall Term 1969 for students with Junior classification or above, less than 80% of the course work completed has been passed satisfactorily.
- d. Whenever the academic record is such as to provide persuasive evidence that the University requirements for an undergraduate degree cannot be met within a reasonable period of time.

### 4. LIMITED LOAD PROBATION

Effective Fall 1975 the Scholastic Deficiency Committee initiated a limited load probation status as an alternative it may offer to academic disqualification. Under this status a student is permitted to register for a maximum of 8 credit hours per term, and must complete satisfactorily all course work attempted. When at least 12 credit hours are so completed, the student is transferred to regular academic probation and continued in that status until conditions for removal are met.

### 5. ACADEMIC REINSTATEMENT

Consideration of reinstatement to the University will be acted on by the Committee only after receipt of a formal petition from the student. Each request will be evaluated on individual merit of the case and on supportive evidence provided by the student. All students reinstated will be placed on probation.

The petition for reinstatement will be considered by the Committee contingent upon receipt of grade or mark changes, transcripts, petitions and all supporting documents on file in the Office of the Registrar no later than 30 calendar days prior to the first day of classes; later receipts of documents will be considered for the subsequent term.

### 6. SPECIAL NOTE: EVALUATION CRITERIA

In determining the number of non passing hours to be counted toward probation/disqualification action, all University of Oregon work completed by students Fall Term 1969 and thereafter will be included.

In all instances, the grades reported to the Registrar within the designated grade reporting period will determine the action of the Committee. The receipt of subsequent changes in grades or marks, or of late grades or marks will be reviewed by the Committee when considering actions for the next term.

## DECISIONS/EXCEPTIONS REGARDING ACADEMIC POLICIES

### ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS PETITIONS

The Committee is composed of 8 faculty members and 2 ex officio members appointed by the President upon recommendation of the Committee on Committees. One student member is appointed by the President upon recommendation of ASUO.

The Committee has the responsibility for the administration and interpretation of academic requirements for baccalaureate degrees, and for action on student petitions for exceptions to these requirements and other academic regulations. (It does not have jurisdiction over regulations governing graduate degrees.)

This Committee reviews petitions by students for adding and/or

dropping courses after the last day to change courses. Petitions may be obtained from the Office of the Registrar where complete instructions for procedure are given with each petition.

Note: **Seniors**—You are encouraged to request a degree analysis from the Graduation Requirements Staff, Office of the Registrar. Forms are available at degree table, East Court, during registration.

## APPLICATION FOR DEGREES

If you intend to graduate this term please complete the "Application for Degree" form at the Degree Section, Exit, East Court during registration. All applications must be on file in the Office of the Registrar by the close of the third week of classes (see Important Dates, page 6).

Any applications received after that date will be considered for next term graduation.

Diplomas for successful degree candidates will be mailed approximately 8 weeks after the close of the term. A student may request a certification of degree from the Office of the Registrar, if such verification is needed prior to the receipt of the diploma.

1. **Social Science Fields:** Anthropology (except those listed under Science), Economics, Ethnic Studies, History, Linguistics 489, 490, Philosophy, Political Science, Geography (except Geog 101, 481, 482, 487, 488, 489), Psychology (except those listed under Science), Religious Studies, Sociology, Women's Studies.

2. **Science Fields:** Anthropology 101, 320, 321, 322, 323, 470, 474, 475, 476, 477, 478, 479, General Science, Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Geology, Geography 101, 481, 482, 487, 488, 489, Linguistics 290, 411, 412, 450, 451, 460, Mathematics, Nursing 121, Physics, Psychology 211, 212, 213, 217, 218, 219, 324 and courses numbered 411 to 450.

**4. General Limitation**

- a. Credit transferred from an accredited community college or junior college may be counted only as part of the first 108 credit hours earned toward the bachelor degree.
- b. Correspondence study: maximum, 60 term hours.
- c. Law, medicine, dentistry, technology: maximum, 48 term hours in professional courses toward any degree other than a professional degree.
- d. A maximum of 24 hours with not more than 12 in any one of the following areas:
  1. Lower division vocational technical courses.
  2. Physical Education activity courses (normally MPE, WPE and CPE), except for majors in Health, Physical Education and Recreation.
  3. Studio instruction in Music, except for majors in Music.
- e. Music Majors: towards the B.A., B.S. degree, a maximum of 24 hours in studio instruction of which not more than 12 hours may be taken in the student's freshman and sophomore years.
- f. Changes of grades including removal of incompletes must be filed within 30 days after the granting of a degree.

**GRADUATE SCHOOL****A. Master's Degree**

1. Minimum credits (courses carrying graduate credit): 45 credit hours.
2. Graded Hours: 24 graded hours (UO).
3. Residency: 30 credit hours of work as a UO Graduate School student.
4. Major: 30 credit hours.
5. Grade Point Average (GPA): 3.00 cumulative in UO graded hours. (A, B, C)
6. Changes of grades including removal of incompletes must be filed within 30 days after the granting of a degree.
7. 500-level courses: 9 credit hours (UO courses)
8. Time limit: 7 years from first term of admission to the Graduate School to completion.
9. Continuous enrollment: Students who have attained Graduate School standing must enroll each term (except summer session) for at least 3 credit hours.
10. Thesis: The student who takes a Master's degree with a Thesis must complete a minimum of 9 credit hours in Thesis (503) or 6 credit hours of Thesis and 3 credit hours of Research (501).

**B. Doctor's Degree**

1. Credit hours: No requirement set by the Graduate School. The major department normally requires specific courses.
2. Residency: Three years of full time work beyond the bachelor's degree, of which at least one academic year (three consecutive terms of full time study, minimum of 9 credit hours per term) must be spent on the University campus. If the Master's degree was earned at the University, three consecutive terms of 9 credit hours per term must be completed subsequent to the completion of the Master's degree.
3. Graded hours: No specific requirement.
4. Grade Point Average (GPA): 3.00 cumulative in UO graded hours (A, B, C).
5. Time limit: Three calendar years for completion after advancement to candidacy for the degree.
6. Continuous enrollment: Three credit hours per term (except summer session).
7. Dissertation Registration: A minimum of 18 credit hours of Thesis (503) or 12 credit hours of Thesis and 6 credit hours of Research (501).

# Student Conduct Program

Published as Revised February 5, 1975

## I. THE CODE OF STUDENT CONDUCT

### A. General Policies

1. The University is dedicated not only to learning and the advancement of knowledge but also to the development of ethically sensitive and responsible persons. It seeks to achieve these goals through a sound educational program and policies governing student conduct that encourage independence and maturity.
2. The University distinguishes its responsibility for student conduct from the control functions of the wider community. When a student has been apprehended for the violation of a law of the community, the state, or the nation, the University will not request or agree to special consideration for the student because of his status as a student. The University will cooperate fully, however, with law enforcement agencies and with other agencies in any program for the rehabilitation of the student. (April 16, 1969)
3. The University may apply sanctions or take other appropriate action only when student conduct directly and significantly interferes with the University's (a) primary educational responsibility of ensuring the opportunity of all members of the University community to attain their educational objectives, or (b) subsidiary responsibilities of protecting the health and safety of persons in the University community, maintaining and protecting property, keeping records, providing living accommodations and other services, and sponsoring non-classroom activities such as lectures, concerts, athletic events, and social functions.
4. Procedural fairness is basic to the proper enforcement of all University rules. In particular, no disciplinary sanction as serious as expulsion, suspension, disciplinary probation, or entry of an adverse notation on any permanent record available to persons outside the University shall be imposed unless the student has been notified in writing of the charges against him and has had an opportunity (a) to appear alone or with any other person to advise and assist him before an appropriate committee, court, or official, (b) to know the nature and source of the evidence against him and to present evidence in his own behalf, (c) to question all witnesses, and (d) to have his case reviewed by the University Appeals Board. (June 5, 1974)
5. Students shall have an opportunity to participate fully in the formulation of all policies and rules pertaining to student conduct and in the enforcement of all such rules.
6. Rules and sanctions affecting the conduct of men and women shall be based on general principles of equal treatment, including like penalties for like violations.
7. The Code of Student Conduct applies to any student who either is registered for one or more hours or is enrolled in a special program approved by the University.
8. No sanction or other disciplinary action shall be imposed on a student by or in the name of the University except in accordance with this Code.

### B. Violations

1. Expulsion or suspension from the University, or any lesser sanction, may result from the attempt to commit, the commission, or the intentional assistance in the commission of any of the following offenses: (June 5, 1974)
  - a. Academic plagiarism, defined as the intentional (1) submission for evaluation to a University officer of instruction or administration of (2) material based in significant part on work not done by the submitter (3) without reasonable written indication to the evaluator of the material's true source. (June 5, 1974)
  - b. Academic cheating, defined as the intentional (1) submission for evaluation to a University officer of instruction or administration of (2) material based in part on a source or sources forbidden by (i) generally accepted academic standards or (ii) regulations the evaluator has established and disclosed in a reasonable manner. (June 5, 1974)

- c. Furnishing false information to the University with intent to deceive.
  - d. Forgery, alteration, or misuse of University documents, records, or identification cards.
  - e. Detention or physical abuse of another person in the University community or conduct which is intended to threaten imminent bodily harm of any such person.
  - f. Malicious destruction, damage, or misuse of University property or of personal property on the University campus. University property is defined as all real and tangible property owned or controlled by the University, including but not limited to, buildings, grounds, equipment, motor vehicles, and library or other instructional materials. (February 5, 1975)
  - g. Theft or conversion of another's property occurring under the conditions of I.A.3.
  - h. Vandalism or kidnapping committed on this or any other campus. (June 5, 1974)
    - i. Participation in hazing.
    - j. Lewd or indecent conduct occurring under the conditions of I.A.3.
    - k. Conduct which intentionally obstructs or disrupts the University functions under the conditions of I.A.3. Obstruction is defined as physically blocking, hindering, or impeding any of the following: (1) normal operations of the campus, (2) building ingress or egress, (3) pedestrian or vehicular traffic, or (4) the obtaining or providing of University services.  
Disruption is defined as any of the following: (1) physical or forcible interference or interruption of University services, activities, or any lawful assembly of persons on campus, or (2) the intimidation by violence or the threat of violence of students, faculty, staff, or campus visitors. (June 5, 1974)
  - l. Possession or use of firearms, ammunition, explosives, or dangerous chemicals, or use or threatened use of knives or any other objects as weapons on University property (defined in I.B.1.f.) except as expressly authorized by law or institutional regulation. (February 5, 1975)
  - m. Two or more offenses (including the repetition of a single offense) listed in I.B.2.a-d. and committed on different occasions. (June 5, 1974)
  - n. Failure to comply with the terms of any sanction applied under this Code.
2. Disciplinary probation or any lesser sanction may result from the commission of any of the following offenses:
    - a. Possession, consumption by persons under 21 years of age or furnishing of alcoholic beverages to persons under 21 years of age on University-owned or controlled property in University related housing for single students, or at University sponsored or supervised functions. Possession, consumption, or furnishing of alcoholic beverages by those, or to those at least 21 years of age is permissible only in such areas that the President may designate.
    - b. Disorderly conduct, including disorderly conduct resulting from drunkenness, occurring under the conditions of I.A.3. Disorderly conduct is defined as knowingly and intentionally engaging in violent, tumultuous, or threatening behavior which (1) results in inconvenience, annoyance, or alarm, (2) creates unreasonable noise, or (3) disturbs any lawful assembly of persons. (June 5, 1974)
    - c. Raiding of University related living units.
    - d. Violation of any University rules approved by the Student Conduct Committee for the infraction of which sanctions may be imposed under this Code.
  3. All rules approved by the Student Conduct Committee pursuant to Sections I.B.2.d., I.E.1., and I.E.4. shall be published, distributed, or posted in such a manner as to furnish adequate notice of their contents to students affected by such rules. The University's failure to comply with this requirement shall be a complete defense to any charge of violation of a rule of which the student has no actual knowledge.

### C. Sanctions

1. Sanctions which may be imposed for the commission of University offenses shall include the following:
  - a. Expulsion from the University.
  - b. Suspension from the University for a definite or indefinite period of time.
  - c. Suspended sanction. The Student Court may suspend the execution of any sanction authorized under this Code.

When imposing a suspended sanction, the Court shall specify (1) a time limit for the suspension period, and (2) subsequent violations of the Code for which, upon the defendant's conviction during the suspension period, the suspension shall be terminated and the original sanction imposed by the Coordinator of Student Conduct. In the absence of such conviction(s), the sanction shall be deemed completed at the end of the suspension period. (February 5, 1975)

- d. Disciplinary probation with or without loss of designated privileges for a definite period of time. The violation of the terms of disciplinary probation or the infraction of any University rule during the period of disciplinary probation may be grounds for suspension or expulsion from the University. The parents of any student who is placed on disciplinary probation, suspended, or expelled may be so notified at the discretion of the Court.
  - e. Restitution for damaged, stolen, or misappropriated property or stolen or misappropriated money.
  - f. Participation in a social service project. (June 5, 1974)
  - g. Loss of privileges:
    - (1) Removal from dormitory or other University housing.
    - (2) Loss of such other privileges as may be consistent with the offense committed and the rehabilitation of the student.
  - h. Admonition and warning.
  - i. Such other sanctions as may be approved by the Student Conduct Committee.
2. The sanctions of expulsion or suspension may be imposed only upon proper determination by the Student Court, the University Appeals Board, or the Student Conduct Committee. No minor tribunal shall have jurisdiction to impose the sanctions of expulsion or suspension. (June 5, 1974)
  3. The general policies, violations, and sanctions shall be printed and made readily available to all students.

#### D. Group Offenses

1. Living organizations and registered or recognized groups are responsible for compliance with this Code and with University regulations on discrimination. Upon satisfactory proof that the group has encouraged or did not take reasonable steps, as a group, to prevent violations of this Code or University regulations on discrimination, the group may be subjected to the following sanctions:
  - a. recommendation to the appropriate body that the group be denied the use of University facilities.
  - b. restitution for damaged, stolen, or misappropriated property or stolen or misappropriated money.
  - c. recommendation to the appropriate body that the group's charter, recognition, or registration be permanently or temporarily suspended.
  - d. such other sanctions as may be approved by the Student Conduct Committee.
2. The determination that a group is sanctionable under this Code shall be made by the Student Court at a hearing held for that purpose. (February 5, 1975)
  - a. The president, principal officer, contact person(s), or other students designated by the group as being agents on behalf of the group shall be given reasonable notice of the charges in accordance with I.I.B.1. The president, principal officer, contact person(s), or group agent as defined above shall be required to represent the group before the Student Court. Failure to appear and represent the group may result in the Court disposing of the case under the authority of I.I.B.2.a. (February 5, 1975)
  - b. On behalf of the group, the president, principal officer, contact person(s), or other students designated by the group as being agents on behalf of the group shall be afforded all procedural rights set forth in this Code. (February 5, 1975)
3. Nothing herein authorizes the imposition of individual sanctions on any person other than in accordance with the Code of Student Conduct.

#### E. The Student Conduct Committee

1. The Student Conduct Committee, by faculty legislation and by delegation of the President of the University, is designated as the agency within the University which has primary responsibility for the Student Conduct Program. The Committee shall be responsible to the faculty and the President

of the University for recommending policies relating to student conduct, for formulating or approving rules and enforcement procedures within the framework of existing policies, and for recommending to the President of the University changes in the administration of any aspect of the Student Conduct Program. (March 4, 1970)

2. The Committee shall consist of four faculty members and four student members, each appointed by the President of the University. Each member shall serve for a period of 12 months with one faculty member and one student member retiring at the end of each academic term (Fall, Winter, Spring, and Summer). Members of the Committee may be reappointed. The President may appoint temporary members of the Committee to serve during a summer session or such other times as are necessary to assure full membership of the Committee.
3. The President of the University shall designate a Coordinator of Student Conduct who shall serve as Secretary of the Committee and assist the Committee in the discharge of its responsibilities. He shall coordinate the activities of all officials, committees, student groups, and tribunals responsible for student conduct.
4. All regulations or rules relating to student conduct that are established by any University official, committee, or student group, and for which sanctions may be imposed in the name of the University, must be submitted to, and approved by the Committee. Fraternity, sorority, residence hall, or cooperative "housekeeping" rules adopted by members for the internal management of the living unit are not considered University rules for the purpose of this Code. Campus traffic regulations are likewise not considered to be University rules for the purpose of this Code.
5. The Committee may delegate jurisdiction to handle infractions of University rules to the Student Court and such other tribunals as may be established. With the consent of the President of the University, the Committee also may delegate such jurisdiction to appropriate University officials. In all instances such jurisdiction shall be defined by the Committee, ordinarily in terms of specified offenses, maximum sanctions, or designated living units. The Committee may, at its discretion, withdraw delegation of jurisdiction in any case and dispose of such case itself.
6. The Committee shall require from University officials and tribunals periodic written reports of the disposition of all student conduct cases handled under their jurisdiction. The gathering of such reports and their submission to the Committee shall be the responsibility of the Coordinator of Student Conduct. The Committee shall examine such reports for consistency with existing policies and, where necessary, review the reports with the appropriate officials or tribunals.
7. Each Fall, the Committee shall submit to the President, Faculty Senate, Deans, and Department Heads of the University a written report covering the entire Student Conduct Program, including an evaluation of the existing rules, policies, and enforcement procedures. This report shall also detail all Code revisions approved during the previous year and shall be available to any person who requests a copy. (June 5, 1974)

#### F. University Appeals Board (March 4, 1970)

1. The University Appeals Board, by faculty legislation and by delegation of the President of the University, is the final appeals body under the Student Conduct Code.
2. The Board shall consist of three faculty members and three student members, each appointed by the President of the University. A quorum shall consist of two students and two faculty members. Terms of membership shall be 12 months from the time of appointment. Members may be reappointed, but no member may serve more than two consecutive terms. The President of the University may appoint temporary members to the Board to serve during such times as are necessary to assure full membership of the Board. The Board shall elect its own chairman. The Board shall establish rules of procedure for itself. An affirmative vote of a majority of the Board members present shall be necessary to overrule a decision of a lower court. Inability of the Board to make an affirmative decision to overrule shall be deemed a decision to affirm.
3. In any case the Student Conduct Committee may appoint one of its members to serve as an additional non-voting member of the University Appeals Board. The presence of this member will not affect the Board's quorum.



## G. Student Tribunals

1. The President of the University shall appoint six members to a Senior Court Panel, no more than three of them from the faculty and the rest from the student body. The appointments will be for 12 months but members may be reappointed, and the President is urged to preserve continuity of membership from year to year. Senior Court Panel members shall be selected for their knowledge of the Student Conduct Program in general and for their understanding of the operation of the Student Court in particular.

The Student Conduct Committee will select an impartial system for choosing a court for each case and will be responsible for formulating rules of practice and procedure in hearings under this Code.

2. The President of the University shall appoint a Panel of Associates. The size of this panel shall be determined by the Student Conduct Committee, but no more than one-third of its members shall be from the faculty. The student members shall be recommended by the President of the Associated Students.
3. A Student Court shall consist of three members, at least two of whom shall be students. One member of each Student Court shall be chosen from the Senior Court Panel, and this member will be the Chairman of the Student Court. The remaining members of the Student Court may be chosen from either the Senior Court Panel or the Panel of Associates. The jurisdiction of the Student Court shall be determined by the Student Conduct Committee.
4. A Student Court shall decide on all matters of fact, on the ultimate question of whether the Code has been violated, and on the sanction to be imposed, by majority vote. Decisions on procedural matters (e.g. on the admissibility of evidence) will be made by the Chairman of the Court. The Chairman will also decide which are matters of substance and which are matters of procedure, though on such decisions he may well seek the opinion of the other members of the Court before ruling. A decision of the Chairman of the Court under this section can be reviewed only by appeal to the University Appeals Board.
5. The Student Conduct Committee, with the assistance of the Coordinator of Student Conduct, may establish minor tribunals composed of students. When appropriate, University officials or faculty members may serve as advisers.
6. No tribunal shall have any function except the enforcement of University rules or the performance of other duties which may be delegated to it by the Student Conduct Committee.

## H. Records

1. The Coordinator of Student Conduct shall be responsible to the Student Conduct Committee for the maintenance of adequate records pertaining to the Student Conduct Program.
2. These records shall include a report on the disposition of each disciplinary case. Such reports shall be submitted to the Coordinator of Student Conduct by every official, tribunal, court, or committee authorized to impose sanctions under this Code.
3. In order to accomplish these record-keeping responsibilities, the Student Conduct Committee and the Coordinator of Student Conduct may prescribe reporting procedures to be followed by those authorized to impose sanctions under this Code.

## I. Amendments

1. The above Code may be amended only by action of the general faculty of the University of Oregon.

A copy of the complete Student Conduct Code, including the administrative procedures, is available in the office of the Coordinator of the Student Conduct Program, 472 Oregon Hall.

## II. POLICY ON STUDENT RECORDS

Higher education is concerned with the full development of the student's potentialities. It is realized that individuals differ in ability, background, interests, social maturity, emotional maturity, and goals. To plan educational opportunities to meet the needs of individual students and to counsel effectively with them, the University must accumulate data and keep records. The personal records enable the faculty and administrators of the University to understand the individual student better so that they can provide more effective education and counseling assistance.

Thus, it is recognized that from the time a student enters the University and submits the required personal data for academic and personal records, there is an implicit and justifiable assumption of good faith placed in the University as custodian of these data. The University maintains a similar posture relative to subsequent data generated during the student's enrollment. Preserving the confidential nature of student records protects the individual's right to privacy and enhances the effectiveness of the University's educational and counseling processes. Accordingly, the University intends to exercise care and concern in obtaining, recording, maintaining, and disseminating information about students with duplication of records kept to a minimum.

Under University policy, only directory information (information generally needed in identifying or locating a named student) and objective evidence of the student's academic achievement (number of credits earned and degree(s) earned) may be released without the consent of the student. All other information contained in student records is considered personal and confidential and may not be released without the student's written consent.

Pursuant to Public Law 93-380, recently enacted Federal legislation, students may see and review with a staff member of the department that maintains the record, all official records, files, or data that pertain to that student with the following exceptions: (1) confidential letters of appraisal received prior to January 1, 1975, (2) confidential letters of appraisal received after this date and for which the student has signed a waiver of the right to access, (3) psychiatric, medical, and psychological records, and (4) records of administrative and instructional personnel that are created for that member's eyes only and which are not accessible to any other person(s).

Student access to records shall be provided as early as practicable but must be within 45 days of the student's request. Copies of such records shall be provided at the student's request and shall be at the student's expense.

A student may challenge the content of a record in order to ensure that the record is not inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the privacy or other rights of the student. (Grades, however, are specifically excluded from this policy unless the accuracy of the recording of the grade is contested.) If the custodian of that record does not concur with the student's request for deletion or modification of the challenged record, the student is entitled to an administrative hearing. All requests for such hearings shall be directed to the Vice President for Student Services as Custodian of Student Records.

In any instance where the provisions of this University student records policy are determined by legal counsel to be inconsistent with the requirements, limitations, or restrictions of Public Law 93-380, the University Custodian of Student Records is empowered to waive the provision in question and to administer this policy consistent with Public Law 93-380 and its implementing regulations.

## SPECIAL REGISTRATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR NONMATRICULANT (NON-DEGREE) STUDENTS

The University of Oregon has initiated a simplified admissions and registration procedure for part-time, non-matriculant (non-degree) students.

To encourage participation in this program, the University has scheduled many courses for late afternoons and evenings. While regular students will have priority in registering for classes, any University course is now available for credit to the general public if course prerequisites are met.

### *Nonmatriculant Status*

You may register for courses as a nonmatriculant if:

1. You have never been enrolled as a regularly admitted student at the University of Oregon OR
2. If you have not attended the University as a regularly admitted student since completion of a University of Oregon degree.

If your status does not meet the above conditions, it will be necessary for you to enroll as a regular student. You will be requested to complete a re-enrollment request card and, if you left the University in good standing, registration material will be prepared for you.

### *Credit*

As a nonmatriculant you may register for up to 6 credit hours per term. The credit you earn will be entered on your University record as fully bona fide college-level credit. If you apply later for admission to the University and are accepted as a regular University student, the credit earned in this program will be treated as transfer credit.

*NOTE:* While transfer credit can be applied toward University graduation requirements, it cannot satisfy the "residence" requirement. Candidates for a bachelor's degree must complete 45 of their last 60 hours in "resi-

dence" as regularly admitted University of Oregon students. Graduate students may, with departmental approval, transfer up to 15 hours of graduate credit towards an advanced degree.

### *Selection of Courses*

The *General Catalog* contains course descriptions and prerequisites. Consult the *Time Schedule of Classes* for details such as who is teaching a course, when and where it meets and the credit it carries. The above listing of courses offered after 3:30 p.m. listed by time and day is included for your convenience. Check complete schedule for details.

### *Registration Priorities and Limitations*

Nonmatriculant and matriculated students are subject to the same course prerequisites as listed for individual courses in the *General Catalog*. When in doubt as to whether or not previous course work or non-academic experience would qualify in lieu of listed prerequisites, contact the instructor by phone or at the first class meeting.

### *Academic Advising*

Faculty advisers are available to students who wish to discuss their academic goals and are seeking information about various academic programs offered at the University. Students are encouraged to take advantage of this service.

Faculty advisers to help with course selection and long term planning will be stationed at McArthur Court, January 6, 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. and in the Lifelong Learning Office, 164 Oregon Hall, January 7 through January 9 from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. The Office of Academic Advising can assist students Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. in Room 107, Friendly Hall.

### *How to Register*

An arena registration will be held from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. on January 6 in McArthur Court.

1. Report to reception table for registration materials. (Complete instructions are included with these materials.)
2. Pick up a Time Schedule of Classes.
3. Go to North Bleachers in the Main Court and fill out registration materials.
4. If your registration involves more than two term line numbers, please request an additional form from the Registrar's table.

5. Check "Closed and Added" section board. If a Term Line Number (TLN) is posted on the "Closed Section Board" that corresponds to a course or section you have chosen, you must then select another course or section.
6. Secure departmental approval for your selection of courses. (See front cover of Time Schedule for location of departments.)
7. Report to the Checker-Tuition Assessment station, East Court.
8. If registering as a nonmatriculant for the first time report to ID Station for identification photograph. An ID card will be sent to you shortly after the beginning of the term which can be used to facilitate your use of the Library and registration in subsequent terms.
9. Pay your tuition at the Cashier's station. (East Court.)

Students registering after Tuesday, January 6 should first report to the Registrar/Admissions offices between 8:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., January 7 through January 9. These offices are located on the second floor of Oregon Hall.

### *Late Registration Fees*

Nonmatriculant late fines for Winter Term are \$5.00 for the week beginning January 19, 1976, and \$2.50 additional for each week thereafter.

### *Course Change Procedure*

Note the academic deadlines, pages 5-7 of the *Time Schedule of Classes*, regarding changes you may wish to make in your registration, i.e., adding or dropping a course, withdrawing completely from all courses, etc.

Drop/add change forms are available in the Registrar's Office, 220 Oregon Hall, 10:00 a.m.-4:30 p.m., or in the Office of Lifelong Learning, 164 Oregon Hall, weekday evenings until 7:00 p.m. Return completed forms to the Office of Lifelong Learning, 164 Oregon Hall.

The regular procedures for changing your registration are noted on the drop/add change form. However, if you have *only evening classes* the instructor's signature will be accepted in lieu of the departmental stamp.

### *Table of Tuition Charges*

Nonmatriculant tuition is based on the academic level of the course. To determine tuition for undergraduate courses only, refer to the ruled vertical column (three credit hours would cost \$50). To determine tuition for

graduate courses only (400M/G-599), refer to the ruled horizontal column (three credit hours would cost \$98).

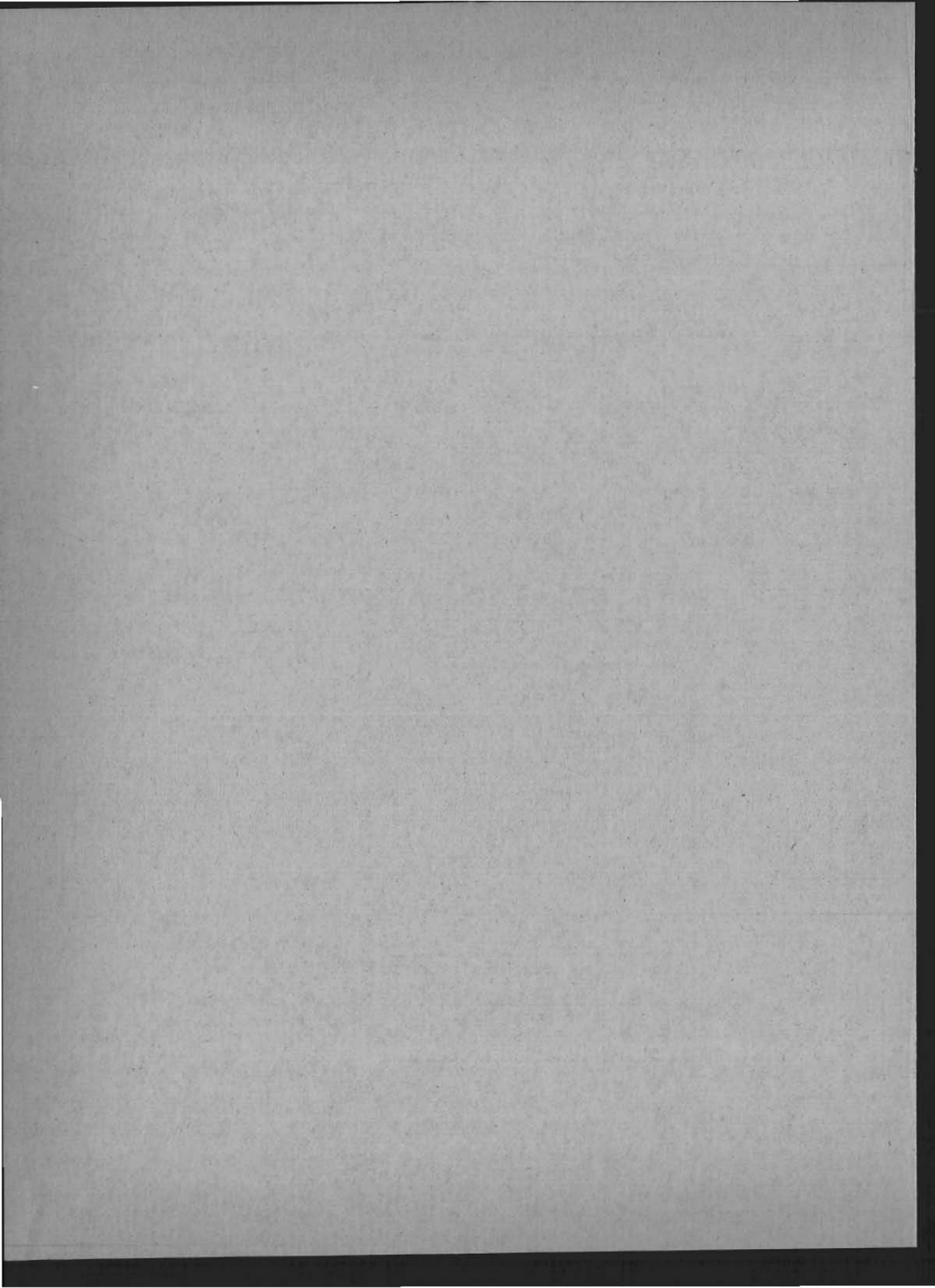
