How to Register (Undergraduates)

Any undergraduate qualified to carry work may enter the summer session without submitting entrance credentials, but in order to become a candidate for a degree, all entrance requirements must be fulfilled:

Step 1. Secure registration cards from the table in the lobby of Friendly Hall.

Step 2. Select as adviser from the list on page 3 the person who represents your major department or the department in which you expect to carry the most work. He will assist you in filling out your cards and will sign them as your adviser.

Step 3. Take your cards to the cashier on the second floor (window 3 or 4) of Johnson Hall (Administration building) and pay your fees. Leave all cards with the cashier.

How to Register (Graduates)

Step 1. Secure registration cards and other material from the table in the lobby of Friendly Hall.

Step 2. Select as your adviser from the list on page 3 the person who represents your major department or the department in which you expect to carry the most work. He will assist you in filling out your cards and will sign them as your adviser after you have secured your instructors' signatures on the study program.

Step 3. Secure the signature of the Dean of the Graduate School.

Step 4. Take your cards to the cashier on the second floor (window 3 or 4) of Johnson Hall and pay your fees. Leave all cards with the cashier.
