Appeal Procedures*

DLCD ACKNOWLEDGMENT or DEADLINE TO APPEAL: March 15, 2006

This amendment was submitted to DLCD for review prior to adoption with less than the required 45-day notice. Pursuant to ORS 197.830 (2)(b) only persons who participated in the local government proceedings leading to adoption of the amendment are eligible to appeal this decision to the Land Use Board of Appeals (LUBA).

If you wish to appeal, you must file a notice of intent to appeal with the Land Use Board of Appeals (LUBA) no later than 21 days from the date the decision was mailed to you by the local government. If you have questions, check with the local government to determine the appeal deadline. Copies of the notice of intent to appeal must be served upon the local government and others who received written notice of the final decision from the local government. The notice of intent to appeal must be served and filed in the form and manner prescribed by LUBA, (OAR Chapter 661, Division 10). Please call LUBA at 503-373-1265, if you have questions about appeal procedures.

*NOTE: THE APPEAL DEADLINE IS BASED UPON THE DATE THE DECISION WAS MAILED BY LOCAL GOVERNMENT. A DECISION MAY HAVE BEEN MAILED TO YOU ON A DIFFERENT DATE THAN IT WAS MAILED TO DLCD. AS A RESULT YOUR APPEAL DEADLINE MAY BE EARLIER THAN THE DATE SPECIFIED ABOVE.

A BILL FOR ORDINANCE NO. 9-06 1 2 AN ORDINANCE relating to the COMMERCIAL OFFICE (CO) ZONE amending SRC 3 150.020(i)(8). 4 THE CITY OF SALEM ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS: 5 Section 1. SRC 150.020(i)(8) is amended to read: 6 150.020. PERMITTED USES. The following uses, when developed under the general development standards in this zoning code applicable to the CO district and to all such uses, generally 7 8 are permitted in the CO district: 9 (a) Residential: 10 (1) One single family dwelling or duplex, other than a mobile home, per lot; 11 (2) Unlimited number of dwelling units and guest rooms in apartment houses, court 12 apartments, condominiums, and residential hotels; room and board facilities serving five 13 or fewer persons; 14 (3) One dwelling unit for each business use on the lot; 15 (4) Residential care (836), except homeless shelters serving more than five persons; 16 (5) Adult day care home. 17 (b) Agriculture and forestry: 18 (1) Agricultural production - crops (01); 19 (2) Retail sales area for agricultural products, provided that the sales area is no greater 20 than 1,000 square feet; that one off-street parking space for each 200 square feet of sales 21 area is provided in addition to all other applicable parking requirements; that the retail 22 use is conducted only between dawn and sunset and only for a continuous period of no 23 more than seven months per calendar year beginning no earlier than April 1; and that any 24 sign erected in connection with the retail use complies with the Salem Sign Code and is 25 not in any way artificially illuminated or electrically operated; 26 (3) Landscape counseling and planning (0781); 27 (4) Timber tracts (081); 28 (5) Forestry services (085);

16	(1) Customary residential accessory buildings and structures for private use of the
17	property and its occupants;
18	(2) A garage or parking area serving the main building or use;
19	(3) Storage for commercial vehicles used in connection with any use listed in subsections
20	(d) to (f) of this section, or kept by the occupant of a dwelling unit with a maximum of
21	one commercial vehicle per dwelling unit;
22	(4) Sleeping quarters for domestic employees of the resident of the main building;
23	(5) Guest houses and guest quarters not in the main building provided such houses and
24	quarters are and remain dependent upon the main building for either kitchen or bathroom
25	facilities or both, and the guest facilities are used for temporary lodging and not as a
26	place of residence;
27	(6) Home occupations; and
28	(7) The taking of boarders or leasing of rooms by a resident family providing the total

1	number of boarders and roomers does not exceed two in any dwelling unit.
2	(8) Eating places (5812) in buildings devoted principally to uses otherwise permitted as
3	main uses under SRC 150.020 to 150.040; provided that the entrance to the eating place
4	is within the building and not directly from the outside; that the only sign advertising the
5	cating place visible from outside the building is a non-illuminated window or wall sign
6	not more than two square feet in area, and that not more than 25 percent of the floor area
7	of a one story building and not more than 50 percent of the floor area of a building over
8	one story is occupied by the eating place.
9	Section 2. Severability. Each section of this ordinance, and any part thereof, is severable, and if any
10	part of this ordinance is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this ordinance
11	shall remain in full force and effect.
