Appeal Procedures*

DLCD ACKNOWLEDGMENT or DEADLINE TO APPEAL: May 23, 2007

This amendment was submitted to DLCD for review 45 days prior to adoption. Pursuant to ORS 197.830 (2)(b) only persons who participated in the local government proceedings leading to adoption of the amendment are eligible to appeal this decision to the Land Use Board of Appeals (LUBA).

If you wish to appeal, you must file a notice of intent to appeal with the Land Use Board of Appeals (LUBA) no later than 21 days from the date the decision was mailed to you by the local government. If you have questions, check with the local government to determine the appeal deadline. Copies of the notice of intent to appeal must be served upon the local government and others who received written notice of the final decision from the local government. The notice of intent to appeal must be served and filed in the form and manner prescribed by LUBA, (OAR Chapter 661, Division 10). Please call LUBA at 503-373-1265, if you have questions about appeal procedures.

The City of Cannon Beach does ordain as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> Amend the Comprehensive Plan Background Report, Cannon Beach: An Integrated Approach to Sand Management, Part IV, Sand Management Strategies for the Cannon Beach Area by adding the following paragraph after the last paragraph in this section:

A design criterion for the implementation of the foredune grading plans is dune shaping and regrading in a manner that retains some of the natural appearance of the dune forms. Grading with this objective in mind results in the retention or creation of dune hummocks and reshaped dune crests with variable topography. The experience with four phases of dune grading at Breaker Point indicates that this design criterion does result in graded dunes that, at least in part, mimic the shape of "naturally" accreting dunes. However, the resultant variability in the topography of the graded area means that some areas accrete new sand deposition at accelerated rates. These areas of accelerated sand accumulation in turn can impact views at a time when the majority of the graded area continues to provide for the ocean views that were the objective of the initial dune grading. To address this issue of variable dune accretion rates, within the context of a foredune grading plan for a specific area, an additional sand management strategy is provided for, maintenance foredune grading. Maintenance foredune grading permits the grading of limited areas within an overall management area, or phase within a management area, without the need to obtain either a conditional use permit or comprehensive plan amendment to modify the dune grading regimen in a specific area. Maintenance foredune grading is subject to specific criteria to ensure that the grading occurs in a manner that is consistent with the overall foredune grading plan for the management area.
