Individual psychotherapy is combined with group, art, activity, and recreation therapies in a specialized milieu. Staff are trained and experienced in working intensively with MPD patients and the entire spectrum of dissociative disorders.
- ▲ As a tertiary facility, Ridgeview has made a special commitment to the more intensive modalities required in the treatment of many dissociative disorder cases. Our highly specialized inpatient program permits patients to move to the least restrictive level of clinical care appropriate to their clinical needs.
- ▲ Providing mainstream support for research and education in the field, Ridgeview publishes DISSOCIATION, the journal of the International Society for the Study of Multiple Personality & Dissociation, edited by Richard Kluft, M.D. It also publishes the Society's quarterly newsletter, edited by Bennett Braun, M.D.
