This amendment was submitted to DLCD for review prior to adoption pursuant to ORS 197.830(2)(b) only persons who participated in the local government proceedings leading to adoption of the amendment are eligible to appeal this decision to the Land Use Board of Appeals (LUBA).

If you wish to appeal, you must file a notice of intent to appeal with the Land Use Board of Appeals (LUBA) no later than 21 days from the date the decision was mailed to you by the local government. If you have questions, check with the local government to determine the appeal deadline. Copies of the notice of intent to appeal must be served upon the local government and others who received written notice of the final decision from the local government. The notice of intent to appeal must be served and filed in the form and manner prescribed by LUBA, (OAR Chapter 661, Division 10). Please call LUBA at 503-373-1265, if you have questions about appeal procedures.

- *<u>NOTE:</u> The Acknowledgment or Appeal Deadline is based upon the date the decision was mailed by local government. A decision may have been mailed to you on a different date than it was mailed to DLCD. AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AMENDMENTS TO THE DOUGLAS COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE ORDINANCE NO. 2011 - 12 - 01

RECITALS

A. Amendments to the Douglas County Comprehensive Plan are needed to: update reference citations in the Plan Introduction; incorporate the 2011 consolidation of the Planning Advisory Committee (PAC) Program from nine PACs to six; include Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) funded projects in the Transportation Element of the Plan as required by the State Transportation Planning Rule, and; acknowledge financial assistance provided by the Oregon Coastal Zone Management Act for a Coastal Technical Assistance Grant to update the Coastal Resources Plan.

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B. On November 17, 2011, the Douglas County Planning Commission held a Legislative hearing and recommended that the attached amendments be adopted by the Board of Commissioners.

THE DOUGLAS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION ONE</u>: The amendments contained in the yellow-cover attachment titled "Amendments to the Douglas County Comprehensive Plan," "First Draft," dated September 2011, are ADOPTED and by reference made part of this ordinance.

<u>SECTION TWO</u>: The amendments are necessary and appropriate and shall become effective on January 6, 2012.

<u>SECTION THREE</u> Severability: If any provision of this ordinance is held to be invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of any other provision of the ordinance. The ordinance shall be construed as if such invalid provision had never been included.

Introduction

a. Reference Material

Purpose: Proposed update to the Comprehensive Plan Introduction to update existing reference material citations and to insert a reference to the Transportation System Plan.

Background: The Comprehensive Plan cites documents that have been updated. This change provides the current document citation and adds a new reference the Transportation System Plan.

<u>Amendment</u>: Comprehensive Plan Introduction Page - IX and X. Amend the Important Reference Material section second to the last sentence on Page IX.

"The Industrial Site Inventory, Second Edition establishes the basis for designating industrial land."

Amend the first sentence on Page X as follows:

"In 2006, Douglas County published the <u>The</u> Rural Community <u>Inventory</u> and Rural Residential <u>Land Inventory and Analysis</u> Inventories <u>are documents</u> which are a part of the Plan by reference."

Add new paragraph after the first paragraph on Page X as follows:

"The Transportation System Plan (TSP) is an important part of the Comprehensive Plan. It was developed to implement Statewide Planning Goal Twelve and Oregon Transportation Planning Rules. The components of the TSP which guide development have been integrated into the Comprehensive Plan and are included in the Transportation and Land Use Elements of the Plan. The TSP includes the Transportation Element, Urban Unincorporated Area's plans and Interchange Area Management Plans as part of its content. The TSP is a part of the overall Comprehensive Plan by reference. It is published separately from the overall Comprehensive Plan because of its specialized scope and size."

b. PAC Consolidation

Purpose: Proposed update to the Comprehensive Plan Introduction to address the consolidation of nine PAC's into six.

Background: The 2011 PAC consolidation was required to address three factors: budgetary constraints, reduced staffing and the impact of recession on land use actions. The consolidation provides for a continuation of high quality staff support to a fewer number of PAC's. The consolidation program was designed to provide for consolidation to be reversed in the future, if needed, and utilize the previous PAC boundaries.

<u>Amendment</u>: Comprehensive Plan Introduction Page - X and Map on page XI Add the following information and table prior to the last paragraph on Page X and replace the map on page XI.

"The following map of the County illustrates the PAC area boundaries."

"PAC Consolidation

The 2011 PAC consolidation was required to address three factors: budgetary constraints, reduced staffing and the impact of recession on land use actions, The consolidation provides for a continuation of high quality staff support to a fewer number of PAC's. The consolidation program was designed to provide for consolidation to be reversed in the future, if needed, and utilize the previous PAC boundaries."



2011 Planning Advisory Committee Consolidations

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Transportation Element

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<u>Purpose</u>: Proposed update to the Comprehensive Plan Transportation Element to address projects contained in the 2012-2015 State Transportation Improvement Plan.

Background: Oregon Department of Transportation integrated statewide transportation and land use planning provides within the context of financial planning. Comprehensive planning at local and regional levels support state decision making. Every community develops a comprehensive plan and local land use that must be consistent with state goals.

<u>Amendment</u>: Comprehensive Plan Transportation Element Page - 13-14 Add the following information to the end of Finding 33.

<u>OR 42 Expressway Upgrade. The project is expected to add increased capacity</u> on Or 42. The new frontage road (necessary local) will relocate a number of driveways. Two street connections will also be closed. With Rolling Hills constructed and signalized, it will improve traffic and safety operations at the Carnes Road intersection with OR 42.

<u>Amendment</u>: Comprehensive Plan Transportation Element Page - 13-15 Add the following information to the end of Finding 34.

OR 138E Corridor Solutions (Roseburg) increases Capacity along Hwy 138 Corridor and Provides Safety Improvements

The project is located on Diamond Lake Boulevard (Highway 138) between Interstate 5 (I-5) exit 124 and Fulton Street in the city of Roseburg. The alignment of the State corridor through downtown Roseburg requires maneuvering a frequently congested and circuitous course of sharp turn movements. The project will improve the congestion and safety issues between I-5 and Fulton Street on OR-138E.

Amendment: Comprehensive Plan Transportation Element Page 13-17

Combine existing Findings 57 and 58 into one finding (Number 57) as follows:

57. Modal plans for highway, aviation, transit, rail, bicycle and ports/waterways have been developed to carry out the Oregon Transportation Plan. The Highway 38/42 Corridor Plan is a multi-modal plan. The purpose of the corridor plan is to outline ODOT's management direction for the operation of the elements of the transportation system for which it is responsible.

Add a new Finding using Number 58 as follows:

58. An interchange area management plan (IAMP) addresses highway interchange areas and the adjacent roadway system. The County has coadopted IAMP's for Exit 103, 106, 108, for Exit 119/120 and for Exit 129 and integrated these documents into the Transportation System Plan.

Coastal Resources Plan

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Purpose: Coastal Technical Assistance Grant Special Award Condition 4 required acknowledgment of the financial assistance provided by the Oregon Coastal Zone Management Act.

Background: Douglas County was awarded Grant TA 306-11-305 and to create the County Coastal Resource Plan in a digital format and to re-create where possible, maps in an electronic format.

Amendment: Coastal Resources Plan at the end of the Table of Contents insert the following Acknowledgment.
