## IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR CONTRIBUTORS TO DISSOCIATION: PROGRESS IN THE DISSOCIATIVE DISORDERS

The International Society for the Study of Dissociation has decided to end its sponsorship of DISSOCIATION: Progress in the Dissociative Disorders as the official journal of the society after the completion of the 1997 volume (Volume 10). After considering the available options and reviewing the economic realities of producing a journal without a firm subscriber base, Dissociative Disorders Research Publications, Ltd. has come to the sad and unwelcome conclusion that the publication of DISSOCIATION must be suspended after Volume 10 has been produced and mailed. The authors of manuscripts already accepted for the 1998 volume have been notified of this situation, with apologies, and the authors of manuscripts under review have been informed as well. We have encouraged them to submit their work to other scientific journals.

Dissociative Disorders Research Publications, Ltd. will continue to review developments in the dissociative disorders field and will consider whether its mission, to provide a forum for advances in our understanding and treatment of dissociation and the dissociative disorders, remains relevant and timely. We will consider whether the publication of <code>DISSOCIATION</code> should be resumed at a later date, and will be giving thought to other projects as well.
