Tribute to President Emeritus Dave Frohnmayer

President Emeritus Dave Frohnmayer, a widely respected leader in Oregon politics and academia, was often referred to as a giant: a giant who championed law and leadership.

He formerly served as dean of the University of Oregon School of Law, as Oregon's attorney general, as an Oregon state representative, and as a law professor at the University of Oregon. Dave also served as president of the University of Oregon for fifteen years; before him, no native Oregonian had served as president of one of the state's large research universities.

As attorney general, Dave argued seven cases before the U.S. Supreme Court, winning six, the most cases and best record of any state attorney general.

Dave is remembered by the University of Oregon legal community as an extraordinary professor and mentor. He was generous, enthusiastic, insightful, and inspired multitudes of students to pursue careers that continue to impact their communities in meaningful ways.

Dave received his bachelor's degree in government from Harvard College and his Juris Doctor degree from the University of California, Berkeley, School of Law. He was also a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford College.

This *Oregon Law Review* issue is dedicated to him and the powerful legacy he left behind.
