Max S. Hirsch (1871-1959) was born in Germany. At the age of 15, Max and his brother Leopold emigrated to the United States. Their aunt, Jeanette Hirsch Meier, was a member of the family that founded the Meier and Frank Store, where Max worked until 1906, when he and Harry A. Weis bought the Willamette Tent and Awning Company. Ten years later, the company became the Hirsch-Weis Maufacturing Company. Later, the two men used the English translations of their names and the company became the White-Staq Maufacturing Company. The White Stag Company was innovative as leading designers and manufacturers of sports and casual clothing; particularly ski wear. Max Hirsch was a civic leader and involved in the Jewish community in Portland. The house is also significant as an excellent example of the Tudor style.







This house is significant for its association with William Holford, longtime partner of Ellis Lawrence. Together the two were responsible for hundreds of designs throughout the state of Oregon. Holford was of Scottish descent and trained at MIT, as was Lawrence. He joined Lawrence in business in 1911 and stayed together until financial problems during the second World War, 1943, caused them to split up. Holford was described by Lawrence as a quiet congenial man. It is not clear how the two worked together on projects, since this house was Holford's it is assumed he designed it, however it is very similar to many other houses designed by the firm. Holford later had a second house in Dunthorpe which has not yet been located. 1913 magazine accounts describe Lawrence designing a house for Holford in Golf Park (Garthwick). This house has not been located either. Not in Portland directories, in Clackamas Co. This house was built as part of the Laurelhurst subdivision development.

The Library/Auditorium built in 1938 was a great addition to the Medical School. It was the second building on the campus. Funds for this building came from the Rockefeller Foundation, a gift from Dr. John Weeks and monies from the PWA. The building was described as a wing to the Medical School building since the laboratory section was attached to the school bldg. and a covered walkway connected it to the library and auditorium. Though H. Abbott Lawrence drew the sketch plan which was exhibited in THE ARCHITECT AND ENGINEER, It is certain that EFL himself had full charge of this project. All original drawings bear his approved stamp and correspondence in the Lawrence Collection includes a letter in which he describes the challenge of the design. This building is significant architecturally as part of the Medical School ensemble, and as an excellent example of Lawrence's later modern designs.

She is a graduate of the U. of O. architecture program (1937) and she studied with Lawrence. She was the fourth registered woman architect in the state of OR. The house was built in two stages as the owners could not afford ot complete the entire house in 1921. The first section extended to the south edge of the present dining rm. (1921). When the 2nd half of the house was completed in 1923, the fireplace and chimney that existed at the edge of the dining rm. was removed. Remnants can be found in the basement. The original owners wife, Alice, contributed to the design of the kitchen and insisted on single mullion windows throughout the house.

He also served on the state board of horticulture and in 1891 he was elected to the state legislature. In 1900 he became a U.S. diplomat living in China, Japan, and Ireland. He served in Manchuria at the sensitive time of the Russo-Japanese War. He retired from this service in 1910 and had Ellis Lawrence build his retirement home in Portland. He served as first director for the School of Commerce for PSU until 1917. Miller died in 1927 at the age of 67.

The house serves as an excellent intact example of Lawrence's early Arts and Crafts style with finely crafted details such as leaded glass, fireplaces, etc.

The OREGON JOURNAL wrote, upn his death, "a crusading nature lover and conservationist, he has worked, led, pushed, cajoled, lobbied, inspired and contributed generously of his own funds. The results of his efforts have been monumental gains for this city and state in nature preservation and beautification." He also served on the Mult. Co.
