- Opened in 1872 with a collection of 500 books in **Deady Hall**
- UO is a research university and has a multi-branch library system
- Largest collection in the state (2.6M volumes; 17K current serials)
- Oregon's only member of the Association of Research Libraries




# LIBRARIES AND STUDENT EXPERIENCE AT UO

- Serve all programs, departments, schools, and colleges
- Advance goals of information literacy across the curriculum
- Teach students skills that are transferable to all of their courses, and to lifelong learning

#### The Libraries:

- Provide access to information that reflects diverse points of view, current and historical, popular and unpopular
- Provide a high-quality work experience for 350 part-time student workers each year.

- Quiet study and reflection
- Exploration



## LIBRARY AS PLACE

#### Hours:

- Open 8 am midnight Sun -Thurs academic term; weekend & intersession hours vary
- 24/7 schedule during dead week & finals
- Variety of spaces and furnishings for individual reading
- Group study rooms
- Daily Grind: coffee shop on ground floor of Knight Library






The guides are grouped by type:

- Course-specific: developed for UO courses




#### **GETTING STARTED**

- All enrolled students have a library account that allows borrowing of materials and access to licensed databases
- Students can also borrow directly from 30 libraries in the Orbis-Cascade Consortium (Summit catalog)
- Other items can be obtained by interlibrary loan.
- The student photo ID card serves as the library card
- The ID is also used as the "Campus Cash" debit card for photocopying & printing



#### **GETTING STARTED**

- Tours: offered several times during orientation week and during the terms.
- Self-guided tour
- Credit courses: LIB101 (one credit)
- Ask a librarian!

- Learn how to be more effective researchers




#### Reference locations:

- AAA, Law, OIMB, and Science branch libraries





## ED TECH SERVICES

Blackboard (web-based course management system).

- A very important tool for students and faculty
- Almost every UO student uses Bb in one or more courses each term
- Used to post syllabus, lecture notes, readings and exercises, grades, and host threaded group discussions
