Fellows hail from a variety of spots around the globe, including Burma, Brazil, China and Nicaragua. Participants will study language and culture, as well as academic and professional

communication skills. In addition to their coursework, the fellows will meet with students and participate in events throughout the community.

After completing the summer program, which concludes Aug. 10, fellows will start nine months of intensive study and professional work at universities throughout the United States, including the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, the University of California, Davis, and American University. Fellows specialize in a range of fields, from banking to urban planning.

The Hubert H. Humphrey Fellowship Program, founded in 1978 in honor of the senator and vice-president, brings together professionals from countries around the world based on development needs. Fellowships are granted on a competitive basis to professionals who possess a commitment to public service in the public and private sectors. Since the program's inception, nearly 3,500 fellows from more than 140 countries have taken part.

Founded in 1977, the American English Institute at the University of Oregon provides language instruction to students and educators who want to enter American universities or to learn English for personal or professional reasons.

Tickets are \$5 for everyone older than 2 years and \$4 per person for groups of 10 or more. Tickets are available at the parks on days of performances.
