Alternative 3 will:

1. Provide a new defined parking area approximately 60 feet wide and 160 feet long that will accommodate approximately 25 to 30 vehicles and will remove approximately 10 trees between 10 to 15 inches diameter for the parking area.
2. Construct a laundry, shower, and employee housing facility approximately 20 feet wide and 30 feet long; install an associated septic system and drainfield to Department of Environmental Quality or Deschutes County standards; remove up to approximately 140 trees from 3 to 15 inches diameter for the drainfield; and provide a defined parking area approximately 30 feet wide and 60 feet long that will accommodate approximately six (6) vehicles, adjacent to the facility.

This alternative is particularly responsive to the issues of the need for additional resort parking, amenities desired by visitors that are consistent with their master plan for operating the resort, and the need for additional employee housing.

The project area is located within the Deschutes National Forest on the Bend-Ft. Rock Ranger District, within the range of the northern spotted owl, within in T20S, R7E, Section 24, Willamette Meridian, and Deschutes County, Oregon.

A 30-day public notice and opportunity for comment was published in The Bulletin on July 23, 2003. One (1) letter was received in support of the project during the comment period (CFR 215.6). No other responses were received. Therefore, pursuant to CFR 215.8(a)(3) this decision is not subject to appeal.
